The Series

St. Norbert holds a 25-13-2 lead in the series that dates back to 1916. The Green Knights are currently on a 16-game winning streak against Lawrence. The Vikings haven't defeated St. Norbert since a 27-24 win back in 1997.

Last Meeting

St. Norbert used a solid defensive effort in the second half to hang on for a 17-6 victory over Lawrence on Oct. 19, 2013, at the Banta Bowl.

In a scheduling quirk, the game counted as a Midwest Conference game for the Green Knights, but it was a nonconference game for Lawrence.

St. Norbert limited Lawrence to

only 88 yards of offense in the second half, and the Green Knights got a late field goal to seal the victory.

Zach Broberg ran 19 times for 86 yards to pace the Green Knights. Quarterback James Tringali was 13 of 27 passing for 177 yards, one touchdown and one interception. Brian

Fliess caught six passes for 103 yards and a touchdown for St. Norbert.

Lawrence quarterback Luke Barthelmess completed 16 of 26 passes for 190 yards for the Vikings. Dan

Dubnicka had game highs with seven catches for 110 yards for Lawrence.

Sam Wagner was impressive on defense for the Vikings, who limited St. Norbert to 319 yards. Wagner had a game-high 14 tackles, including one sack and 4.0 tackles for loss. Dan Taylor picked up 10 tackles for Lawrence, and Trevor Spina recorded his first career interception.

Lawrence got on the board in the second quarter by taking advantage of a short punt. The 23-yard punt gave Lawrence the ball at the St. Norbert 41-yard line, and the Vikings got a key pass completion to Dubnicka at the St. Norbert 18. Sam Wagner then hauled in a pass at the St. Norbert one-yard line, and Dalton Sendelbach punched it in the end zone on the next play for a 6-0 lead.

St. Norbert answered two possessions later when Tringali hit Fliess with a 41-yard scoring pass, and the Green Knights led 7-6 at the half.

The Green Knights took the opening possession of the second half and moved 57 yards in eight plays for a touchdown. Broberg ran it in from three yards out, and St. Norbert led 14-6.

Lawrence only managed to get into St. Norbert territory twice in the second half, and the Green Knights

added a 30-yard field goal from Randy Hill with 2:22 left to seal the victory.

Last Week

Macalester scored 26 points in the first quarter and went on to a 33-0 Midwest Conference North Division win over Lawrence this past Saturday.

The Scots posted two touchdowns in their first four plays from scrimmage to take control.

Ouarterback Samson Bialostok had two runs for 58 yards and a touchdown, and he completed 4-of-6 passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns.

Lawrence quarterback Tanner Schuh was 9-for-17 for 154 yards, and Chance Byrd was 8-for-16 for 58 yards. Cole Erickson grabbed six passes for 111 yards for the Vikings.

On the second play from scrimmage, Bialostok ran 57 yards for a touchdown to give the Scots a 7-0 lead. After three plays and a punt, Macalester took over at its own 31-yard line. Two plays later, Bialostok hit Garrett Eichhorn with a 64-yard scoring pass for a 14-0 lead.

The Scots got a 31-yard field goal from Michael Abramson and a safety to go up 19-0. After the free kick, Bialostok completed a 25-yard touchdown pass to Ben Hillman three plays later to put the Scots up 26-0.

Macalester made it 33-0 on Ethan Carpenter's three-yard touchdown run late in the second quarter.

Lawrence had several good scoring chances but couldn't punch it in. The Vikings were stopped on downs at the Macalester 21 in the second guarter, and the Scots stopped Lawrence four times from their one-yard line in the third quarter.

The Coaches

Chris Harris (Cumberlands 2000) is serving as Lawrence's interim head coach. Steve Opgenorth (Winona State 2005) is in his Chris Harris first season at St. Norbert.

Vikings Update

Lawrence tees it up for its second night game of the season in the Banta Bowl. That is a



first for the Vikings, who have never played more than one night game in the Banta Bowl in a season. Lawrence's first night game of the season was a 59-0 nonconference win over

Maranatha Baptist. The first night game Lawrence played in the Banta Bowl was against St. Norbert on Sept. 23, 2000. The Green Knights posted a 29-0 victory.

▶One of the brights spots on offense in the loss at Macalester was freshman receiver Cole Erickson (Appleton, Wis./North). Erickson, who has impressed in prior games this season, hit season highs with six catches and 111 receiving yards. Erickson's highs this season had been three catches and 45 receiving yards. On



the season, Erickson Cole Erickson has 17 catches for 256 yards and three touchdowns.

- ►The top receiver for the Vikings continues to be senior Taylor Mandich (Green Bay, Wis./Southwest). He has 31 catches for 546 yards and five touchdowns. Mandich, who is averaging 17.6 yards per catch, ranks fifth at 78.0 receiving yards per game and seventh at 4.4 catches per game.
- ▶Tanner Schuh (Appleton, Wis./ North) saw the majority of the snaps at quarterback against Macalester and was 9-for-17 for 154 yards. On the season, Schuh is 51-for-111 for 631 yards, three touchdowns and four interceptions.
- Lawrence is now 11th in the Midwest Conference in scoring offense at 16.3 points per game. Lawrence ranks eighth in total offense at 300.4 yards per game.
- ► Senior safety Dan Taylor (Bridgeport, Calif./Lee Vining) hit a career high with 15 tackles against Macalester. Taylor broke his previous career high of 14, which he Dan Taylor set at Knox earlier



this season. On the campaign, Taylor is second on the team with 58 tackles, which ranks 11th in the conference. He also has 2.5 tackles for loss, 0.5 sacks, one interception and five passes defensed.

► Senior linebacker Brandon Taylor (Johnsburg, Ill./Johnsburg) picked up 13 tackles against Macalester and leads the team with 68 tackles. He ranks fifth in the league at 9.7 tackles

- ► Sophomore defensive end Tony Harth (Madison, Wis./West) leads the team with 11.0 TFLs and 3.0 sacks. Harth has 43 tackles on the season.
- ► Freshman cornerback Alic Riedel (Appleton, Wis./East) has a team-best two interceptions and nine passes defensed this season.
- ►Lawrence has fallen to 12th in the conference in scoring defense at 32.9 points per game. Lawrence is seventh

▶St. Norbert used a strong third guarter to take control and pull away from Beloit in a 29-14



Midwest Conference North Division win at Schneider Stadium this past Saturday. The Green Knights led 7-0 at halftime but then piled up 136 yards of total offense with nine first downs in the third quarter to take a 20-0 lead. The Green Knights got two field goals of 40 and 25 yards from Randy Hill early in the fourth quarter to take a 26-0 lead.

- ▶The Green Knights have a new head coach in Steve Opgenorth, a Green Bay native. Opgenorth came to St. Norbert from Colby College, where he served as the offensive coordinator. Opgenorth took over for Jim Purtill, who posted a record of 130-30 in 15 seasons with the Green Knights.
- ▶ Balance has been the norm for the

- St. Norbert offense this season. The Green Knights have three backs with more than 200 yards rushing. Zach Broberg is tops on the squad with 74 carries for 341 yards, an average of 4.6 yards per carry, and four touchdowns. Elijah Fort has 63 carries for 222 yards and two scores, and J.T. Crosby has 43 carries for 213 yards and a team-best five touchdowns.
- ▶ James Tringali has been the bulk of the time at quarterback, but Crosby has been quite a bit of action as well. Tringali is 85-for-141 passing for 845 yards, five touchdowns and three interceptions. Crosby is 13-for-36 for 200 yards, no touchdowns and four interceptions.
- ► Zach Reeves is the top receiver for the Green Knights and has 29 catches for 410 yards and three touchdowns, which is half of St. Norbert's receiving touchdowns for the season.
- St. Norbert controlled the ball for 36:21 against Beloit, and the Green Knights rank eighth in in the league in time of possession at 30:03.
- St. Norbert ranks sixth in the conference in scoring offense at 21.3 points per game. The Green Knights are ninth in total offense at 290.6 yards per game.
- ► Senior linebacker Zach Klarkowski is the top tackler for the Green Knights. He has 72 tackles on the season and ranks third in the conference at 10.3 tackles per game.
- ► Senior defensive lineman Austin Prusha is tops on the squad at 4.5
