The Series

The series with St. Norbert extends all the way back to 1916, which was before football was a varsity sport at the school some 20 miles north of Appleton. St. Norbert holds a 26-13-2 edge in the series, and the Green Knights have controlled the rivalry lately. St. Norbert has won 17 straight, and Lawrence's last win was a 27-24 victory in De Pere back in 1997.

Last Meeting

A 24-point second quarter propelled St. Norbert to a 42-0 Midwest Conference North Division victory over Lawrence on Nov. 1, 2014, in the Banta Bowl.

St. Norbert scored three touchdowns in a span of 3:31 to take command in the second quarter.

St. Norbert quarterback James Tringali completed 12-of-29 passes for 212 yards and two touchdowns. Brett Olson did a lot of damage with five catches for 101 yards and a pair of scores for the Green Knights.

Lawrence quarterback Chance Byrd had 20 carries for 55 yards and completed 10-of-27 passes for 80 yards.

After a scoreless first quarter, St. Norbert moved 76 yards in six plays for the game's first touchdown. Zach Broberg's six-yard run gave the Green Knights a 7-0 lead. Lawrence then fumbled the ensuing kickoff return, and Ryan Grandlic scooped up the fumble at the Lawrence 10-yard line and scored for a 14-0 lead.

After a three-and-out, the Green Knights got the ball back at Lawrence 34-yard line following Brandon Carter's 14-yard punt return. Tringali then hit Olson with a 30-yard scoring pass four plays later for a 21-0 lead. The Green Knights added a Randy Hill

30-yard field goal with 17 seconds left in the first half and led 24-0 at the break.

St. Norbert got another Tringali-to-Olson touchdown pass in the third quarter, and backup quarterback Cole Patterson tossed an 11-yard scoring pass late in the fourth quarter.

Senior linebacker Brandon Taylor paced the Lawrence defense with 10 tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss. Taylor also played in the offensive backfield and posted six carries for 36 yards.

Last Week

Macalester ran for 416 yards on Saturday and went on to a 35-7 Midwest Conference North Division win over Lawrence at Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Zandy Stowell had 25 carries for 193 yards and two touchdowns, and quarterback Alec Beatty ran 13 times for 179 yards for two touchdowns for the Scots.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield was 11-for-19 for 75 yards and a touchdown. Jacob Berman caught five passes for 44 yards for the Vikings. Lawrence's Terrence Simon had five carries for 29 yards, and he had three punt returns for 55 yards.

Linebacker Jacob Lueck had a career-high 17 tackles for Lawrence, and Tony Harth and Dan Rothbauer recorded 11 stops apiece. Harth also had 2.0 sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss.

Beatty changed the tone of the game with his speed when he entered at the start of the second quarter. His first run went 73 yards for a touchdown and a 7-0 Macalester lead.

Lawrence was forced to punt on the ensuing possession, but the ball touched the Scots' Trey Johnson and Alic Riedel scooped it up for the Vikings. Butterfield hit Wes Hetcher with a 19-yard scoring pass on the next play to tie the game at 7-7.

Macalester went 78 yards in 12 plays on the next possession to take back the lead. Beatty ran the final five yards for the score and a 14-7 lead.

Simon had an electric 44-yard punt return early in the third quarter to put Lawrence in business at the Macalester 19-yard line.

The Macalester defense came up with a big stop on third down, and Pat O'Mahoney's 40-yard field goal was wide left.

The Scots then had scoring drives of eight and seven plays, all runs, in the third quarter. Beatty scored from three yards out and Stowell had a one-yard plunge and Macalester led 28-7 after three quarters.

The Scots added a fourth-quarter touchdown on Stowell's 22-yard run after Macalester got a short field when a Lawrence fake punt attempt failed.

The Coaches

Rob McCarthy (Concordia Moorhead 1989) is in his first season as Lawrence's head coach and has a record of 1-6. Dan McCarty (Minnesota Duluth

2000) is in his first season at St. Norbert and has a record of 7-0.

Vikings Update

►The Vikings are in the toughest stretch of the season right now. In a four-week period,



Lawrence will have faced preseason favorite Carroll, 2014 conference champion Macalester, undefeated St. Norbert and arch-rival Ripon. Lawrence finishes the season with a game against its opposite number from the South Division.

►The Lawrence defense turned in a number of great individual performances against Macalester. Junior linebacker Jacob Lueck (Glen Ellyn, Ill./Glenbard East) picked up a career-high 17 tackles against the Scots. That topped his previous career high of 10, which Lueck had against Maranatha Baptist earlier this season. Lueck has averaged 9.8 tackles per game over his last six contests. Lueck now has a team-best 61 tackles this season.

►Junior defensive end Tony Harth (Madison, Wis./West) had a huge game as well against Macalester. Harth recorded a career-high 11 tackles, which included career highs with 3.5

TFLs and 2.0 sacks. Harth had 10 tackles in the first game against Grinnell in 2014. Harth matched his previous career high of 3.5 TFLs, which was at Carroll in 2014, and he had never recorded more than 1.0 sacks in a game. Harth, who has played in just four games this season, has 21 tackles, is second on the team with 3.0 sacks and third with 5.5 TFLs.

►Sophomore linebacker Dan Rothbauer (Appleton, Wis./North) continues to make great progress in his switch to defense. Rothbauer, who played offense in 2014, made a career-high 11 tackles against Macalester and intercepted a pass. Rothbauer is third on the team with 47 tackles and has 5.0 TFLs.

►Lawrence was a plus-2 in turnovers against Macalester with an interception and a fumble recovery. The Vikings are second in the Midwest Conference in turnover margin at plus-8.

►The Lawrence defense is ninth in the conference at 33.1 points per contest. The Vikings are 10th in total defense at 430.9 yards per contest.

►The Vikings rank third in the Midwest Conference with 13 sacks. Sophomore defensive end Jake Gostisha leads the team with 4.0 sacks as part of his team-high 8.5 TFLs. Gostisha ranks in the top five in the league in both TFLs and sacks.

►The Vikings limited Macalester to 6-of-15 passing for 30 yards. That is the lowest passing total for an opponent since the Vikings held Knox to 17 yards and Beloit to 28 yards in back-to-back weeks in October 2006.

►Sophomore receiver Terrence Simon (Viera, Fla./Melbourne Holy Trinity) seems to display a new talent each

week. Simon ripped off a long touchdown run at Grinnell and then made a long touchdown catch against Carroll the following week. He turned in an electric 44-yard punt return that he nearly broke for a touchdown in the third quarter against Macalester. Simon broke one tackle right after catching the punt and broke free from another tackler near the sideline. He cut back across the field but was tripped up by a Macalester defender at the Scots' 34-yard line. Simon now has five punt returns on the season and is averaging 12.2 yards per return.

►Special teams helped set up Lawrence's touchdown against Macalester. Defensive back Alic Riedel (Appleton, Wis./East) was covering the punt and alertly jumped on the ball after it touched a Macalester player near the

20-yard line. Lawrence cashed in on the next play when quarterback Ryan Butterfield

(McDonough, Ga./Strong Rock Christian) hit Wes Hetcher (Wautoma, Wis./Wautoma) with a 19-yard scoring pass. It was the first touchdown of Hetcher's career and his first catch of the season.

►Lawrence's offense ranks ninth in the conference at 20.1 points per game. The Vikings are 11th in total offense at 254.0 yards per contest.

Green Knights Update

►St. Norbert picked up its first shutout of the season with a 33-0 win at Beloit last Saturday. The Green Knights scored touchdowns on four of their first five possessions and led 26-0 at the half.



►First-year head coach Dan McCarty is off to a perfect start in his career as the Green Knights sport a 7-0 record. It is St. Norbert's best start since going 10-0 during the 2007 season.

►The Green Knights, who surprisingly are not receiving any votes in the D3football Top 25, control their own destiny in terms of winning the North Division. Two more victories and St. Norbert will host the MWC Championship Game on Nov. 14.

►St. Norbert ranks third in the Midwest Conference in scoring offense at 32.9 points per game. The Green Knights are fourth in total offense at 403.4 yards per game.

►Brad Boockmeier and Elijah Fort present a two-headed monster at running back. Boockmeier is fourth in the conference at 73.4 rushing yards per game, and Fort is fifth at 70.3. Fort leads the league in scoring with 12 touchdowns and an average of 10.3 points per game.

►Triggering the St. Norbert attack is quarterback Jack Becker, who is 101-of-150 passing for 1,211 yards, nine

touchdowns and three interceptions.

►St. Norbert is allowing only 10.0 points per game, which is tops in the Midwest Conference. The Green Knights are second in total defense at 279.6 yards per contest.

►Linebacker R.J. Callow leads the Green Knights with 49 tackles, and linebacker Tommy Gonzales is tops on the squad with 7.0 TFLs and 4.0 sacks.

►The Green Knights have picked off a league-best 17 passes this season, and Frank Laterza leads the team with five interceptions. St. Norbert also is tops in the league at plus-14 in turnover margin. Lawrence quarterbacks have thrown only four INTs in 2015.

APPLETON, Wis. — The Rockford University football team used a powerful running



game to roll to a 52-17 nonconference victory over Lawrence University.

It was the first football game played on the renovated Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Chance Manning ran 32 times for 211 yards and three touchdowns for Rockford (1-0), and he caught two passes for 86 yards and a score. The Regents finished with 58 carries for 438 yards and rolled up 605 yards of offense.

Quarterback Adam O'Malley completed 7-of-13 passes for 167 yards and a touchdown. He also ran 10 times for 62 yards.

Lawrence (0-1) was limited to just 83 yards of offense, including just 25 through the air.

Rockford jumped out to a 21-0 lead after one quarter with a trio of big plays. Pete Berry broke free for a 65-yard scoring run, Manning added a 40-yard TD run and Manning caught a 53-yard touchdown pass.

Manning added two more touchdown runs in the second quarter, and the Regents led 35-0 at the half.

Sophomore Alic Riedel got Lawrence on the board with an 81-yard kickoff return for a touchdown.

It was Riedel's first collegiate touchdown.

Austin Tucker's 64-yard fumble return set up Lawrence's next score as the Vikings took over at the Rockford 16-yard line.

After an end around by Trevor Spina got the ball to the one-yard line, Spina punched it in from a yard out on the next play to cut the lead to 45-14.

The Vikings later added a 24-yard field goal from Pat O'Mahoney to complete their scoring.

September 12

Lawrence 51, Maranatha 6

WATERTOWN, Wis. — The Lawrence University football team bolted to a 24-6 lead at



the half and rolled to 51-6 nonconference win over Maranatha Baptist University.

Three Vikings (1-1) scored their first career touchdowns, and rookie Lawrence head coach Rob McCarthy picked up his first career victory.

Cam Boerm caught a pair of touchdown passes and Jacob Berman ran for a pair of scores for Lawrence. Senior running back Corey Fisher also got his first career touchdown for the Vikings.

Lawrence freshman quarterback Ryan Butterfield tossed his first two career touchdown passes and finished 6-for-11 passing for 92 yards. He also ran three times for 22 yards. Boerm finished with five catches for 61 yards, and Berman ran eight times for 88 yards and two scores.

Nick Edlund ran 20 times for 156 yards, and Jared Zanger scored all three touchdowns for Knox.

Lawrence (1-4) trailed 28-14 at the half but held the Pioneers scoreless after the break. The Vikings got a pair of field goals from Pat O'Mahoney but couldn't reach the end zone in the second half.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield completed 13-of-25 passes for 117 yards, and ran 12 times for 68 yards. Freshman Terrence Simon ran five times for 85 yards and scored his first collegiate touchdown for the Vikings. Sophomore Donnel Haley added 61 yards on 14 carries for the Vikings.

Grinnell quarterback Sam Poulos was 17-of-26 for 183 yards and two touchdowns.

Grinnell (1-3) built a 21-7 lead with the help of touchdown passes of 67 and 19 yards by Poulos. Lawrence sliced the lead to 21-14 after Simon ripped off a 66-yard run with 3:05 left

in the second quarter.

Zandy Stowell had 25 carries for 193 yards and two touchdowns, and quarterback Alec Beatty ran 13 times for 179 yards for two touchdowns for the Scots (4-3, 2-1 MWC).

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield was 11-for-19 for 75 yards and a touchdown. Jacob Berman caught five passes for 44 yards for the Vikings (1-6, 0-3). Lawrence's Terrence Simon had five carries for 29 yards, and he had three punt returns for 55 yards.

Linebacker Jacob Lueck had a career-high 17 tackles for Lawrence, and Tony Harth and Dan Rothbauer recorded 11 stops apiece. Harth also had 2.0 sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss.
