**The Series**

Carroll holds a 31-26-4 lead in a series that dates back to 1908. The Pioneers have won the last five meetings in the series. Lawrence's last victory in the series was a 27-14 win in 2007.

**Last Meeting**

Carroll jumped on Lawrence early and rolled to a 55-6 Midwest Conference victory at the Banta Bowl on Saturday in the Hall of Fame Game on Oct. 6, 2012.

Carroll scored two touchdowns in the first 3:39 of the game and led 24-0 after the first quarter. Running back Lamont Williams had topped the 100-yard mark early in the second quarter and finished the game with 26 carries

for 153 yards and three touchdowns.

Lawrence turned the ball over six times and was limited to 215 yards of offense.

Quarterback Luke Barthelmess was limited to 4 of 14 passing for 24 yards before leaving the game early in the third quarter with an injury. Running back Ben Hartman was a bright spot for the Vikings with 13 carries for 68 yards and a touchdown.

Williams capped a four-play, 40 yard scoring drive with a 23-yard run to put Carroll up 7-0. The Vikings fumbled on the next possession, and Carroll scored four plays later on Justin Butterfield's one-yard run. Williams fumbled on the play before the score, but Carroll recovered at the Lawrence 1-yard line.

Carroll added Butterfield's 38-yard touchdown pass to Matt Sklander with 6:23 left in the first quarter, and Tyler Raymaker kicked a 20-yard field goal on the final play of the first quarter for a 24-0 lead.

Carroll got a 15-yard scoring pass

from Butterfield to Sklander and a 26-yard field goal from Raymaker and led 34-0 at the half.

Lawrence got its only score of the game when the Vikings moved 82 yards in 16 plays in the third quarter. Backup quarterback Alex Brewer hit Tyler Mazur for 26 yards to the Carroll 9. After a roughing the passer penalty gave Lawrence a first down, Hartman scored from three yards out to cut the lead to 34-6.

Carroll added three touchdowns in the fourth quarter, all coming off interceptions, to seal the win.

**Last Week**

Cecil Brimmage ran for 273 yards, and Illinois College battled to a 26-6 Midwest Conference victory over Lawrence last Saturday at the Banta Bowl.

Brimmage carried 29 times and scored a third-quarter touchdown. Blueboys quarterback Michael Bates completed 14 of 25 passes for 195 yards and two touchdowns.

Lawrence quarterback Luke Barthelmess went 22 of 40 for 230 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions. Barthelmess also posted his third 100-yard rushing game of the season with 24 carries for 117 yards.

Illinois College jumped out to a 13-0 lead in the first quarter with a Bates touchdown pass and a Kurt Frischman interception return for a touchdown. Frischman, a defensive lineman, batted a Barthelmess pass and hauled it in. He rumbled 75 yards for the score.

Lawrence cut the lead to 13-6 on a long scoring drive early in the second quarter. The Vikings moved 88 yards in 13 plays and took more than seven minutes off the clock. Barthelmess hit Sam Wagner with a nine-yard touchdown pass with 11:54 left in the first half.

The Lawrence defense stopped the Blueboys on their next possession when Bates' fourth-down pass fell incomplete in the Lawrence end zone. The Vikings stopped the Blueboys again when Brimmage fumbled at the goal line and the ball was recovered by linebacker James Holden in the end zone.

With Brimmage doing nearly all the damage, Illinois College scored early in the second half. Brimmage's 24-yard touchdown run put the Blueboys up 19-6.

After the Blueboys stopped Lawrence on downs deep in Illinois College territory, they drove back down the field for the final score of the game. Bates hit Kevin Fuller with his second touchdown catch of the game for a 26-6 lead.

Linebacker Andy Paider had a big day for the Lawrence defense with 14 tackles, including 7.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks. Paider also forced a fumble.

2-12 (.143). Barthelmess is in his 11th season overall and has a record of 17-72-1 (.194). Mark Krzykowski (Carroll 1994) is in his third season at Carroll and has a record of 17-8 (.680).

### Vikings Update

►The Vikings moved the ball extensively against



Illinois College last Saturday. The Vikings had 13 possessions, and Lawrence moved into Illinois College territory eight times. Lawrence got one touchdown but lost the ball on either a turnover or downs (including the end of the half) on seven possessions.

Lawrence again dominated the time of possession in the game and held

the ball for 37:52. The Blueboys had it for 22:08. Lawrence leads the league in time of possession at 38:22. Lawrence ranks second in NCAA Division III with only Gallaudet ahead of the Vikings.

►Senior quarterback Luke Barthelmess (Appleton, Wis./Principia) passed for 230 yards against Illinois College and is now in 10th place in career passing yards in the Midwest Conference. Barthelmess has 6,879 yards and has moved past former Illinois College star Derek Leonard. Barthelmess is only 303 yards behind former St. Norbert star Cody Craig, who passed for 7,181 yards from 2004-07.

►Barthelmess threw a touchdown pass against Illinois College and now has 52 for his career. Barthelmess needs seven more TD passes to catch career leader and Lawrence Hall of Famer Jim Petran.

►Barthelmess ran the ball 24 times for 117 yards against Illinois College to post his third 100-yard rushing game in four contests this season. Barthelmess ranks sixth in the Midwest Conference at 108.5 rushing yards per game. Barthelmess is averaging 4.8 yards per carry. Barthelmess has completed 79 of 147 passes for 822 yards, four touchdowns and five interceptions. Barthelmess ranks third in the league at 205.5 passing yards per game.

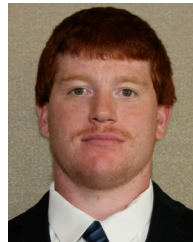
►Barthelmess ranks first in the league in total offense at 314.0 yards per game. That ranks 26th in all of NCAA Division III.

►Lawrence ranks fifth in the Midwest Conference in total offense at 380.0 yards per game. The Vikings are 11th in scoring offense at 13.5 points per contest.

►Senior linebacker Andy Paider (Denmark, Wis./Denmark) was named the Midwest Conference Defensive Player of the Week after his performance against Illinois College. Paider recorded 14 tackles, a season high, and that included 10 solo stops. Paider finished with 7.0 tackles for loss, which is the highest game total in the conference this season. Paider also picked up 2.0 sacks.

►Paider now has 30.0 TFLs for his career and that ties him with Mike Gostisha for fifth place on the Lawrence career list. Matt Frelich is the career leader at 44.5. Paider pushed his career sack total to 9.0 and needs 2.5 more to reach Lawrence's top 10.

►Paider leads the Vikings in tackles 32, TFLs 12.0 and sacks 2.0. Junior linebacker Brandon Taylor (Johnsburg, Ill./Johnsburg) and senior defensive back Sam Wagner (Salem, Wis./Burlington Catholic Central) are second on the

team with 24 tackles apiece. Sophomore defensive back Zach Eichhorst (Brillion, Wis./Brillion) is next with 23.

►Wagner leads the team with four pass breakups and Eichhorst is second with three.

►The Vikings rank seventh in the league in total defense at 378.5 yards per game. Lawrence is 10th in scoring defense at 30.8 points per game.

►After picking up just three penalties for 35 yards against Illinois College, Lawrence continues to be the least penalized team in the league. Lawrence is averaging only 23.8 penalty yards per game. Lawrence opponents have drawn the most flags are averaging a league-worst 74.8 penalty yards.

### Pioneers Update

►In a bizarre finish last Saturday, Carroll dropped a 14-13 decision at Lake Forest. Lake Forest had scored a touchdown with 3:10 left to take a one-point lead, and Car-



roll had the ball with less than 90 seconds left. The game was then delayed for more than 80 minutes because of severe weather in the area. Once play was resumed, Carroll threw an interception on the second play to seal its fate.

►Two of Carroll's three losses have come by a total of three points.

►Running back Lamont Williams, who missed two games earlier this season, leads the Pioneers ground game. He has 60 carries for 351 yards and four touchdowns. He is averaging a healthy 5.9 yards per carry.

►Quarterback Tyler Schovanec triggers the Carroll attack. He has completed 37 of 65 passes for 346 yards, two touchdowns and one interception. He is averaging only 86.5 yards passing per game.

►Andy Laurin is Schovanec's favorite target. He has 17 catches for 150 yards. No one else has more than eight catches for the Pioneers.

►The Pioneers rank eighth in the conference in scoring offense at 18.2 points per game. Carroll is seventh in total offense at 320.6 yards per game.

►Junior linebacker Michael Sahli is tops on the team with 43 tackles. He also leads the squad with 7.5 TFLs and is tied for the team lead with 2.0 sacks.

## 2013 Game Recaps

**September 7**

**Cornell 45, Lawrence 14**

MOUNT VERNON, Iowa — The Cornell College football team scored on its first



five possessions and went on to a 45-14 Midwest Conference win over Lawrence University at Ash Park.

Cornell quarterback Juan Flores had a big day as he completed 21 of 27 passes for 275 yards and three touchdowns.

Lawrence quarterback Luke Barthelmess was only 18 of 41 passing for 155 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions. Barthelmess also ran 20 times for 117 yards and a touchdown.

Cornell (1-0, 1-0 MWC) forced a punt on Lawrence's opening possession of the game and moved 56 yards in only three plays for the first touchdown of the game. Flores hit Justin Cox with a 23-yard scoring pass for a 7-0 lead. After another Lawrence punt, Cornell moved 53 yards in six plays, with Flores connecting with Brit Connor from 18 yards out, for a 14-0 lead.

Myron Seabrook then intercepted Barthelmess on the next possession and ran it back 22 yards for a touchdown and a 21-0 lead. After a Lawrence drive stalled at the Cornell 38-yard line, the Vikings punted. Cornell drove 75 yards in seven plays for another touchdown and a 28-0 lead.

Lawrence (0-1, 0-1) got its first score of the game when Barthelmess hit Taylor Mandich from six yards out for a touchdown. The drive covered 88 yards and took 12 plays and trimmed the lead to 31-7 with 3:59 left in the first half. Mandich finished the day with four catches for 34 yards.

The Vikings picked up their other touchdown early in the fourth quarter after a 12-play, 61-yard drive. Barthelmess ran it from four yards out to cut Cornell's lead to 45-14.

Linebacker Brandon Taylor led Lawrence's defense with 10 tackles.

Jeremy Demlow had 14 tackles, including 3.5 tackles for loss, to pace the Rams.

The Vikings actually had one more first down (22-21) and ran 33 more offensive plays than the Rams. Lawrence enjoyed a huge edge in time of possession (37:04-22:56).

**September 14**

**Lake Forest 14, Lawrence 13**

APPLETON, Wis. — The Lake Forest College football team blocked two fields in the



final three minutes, including one on the last play of the game, to hang on for a 14-13 Midwest Conference win over Lawrence University in the Banta Bowl.

The Foresters (2-0, 1-0 MWC) also blocked an extra point that proved to be the winning margin.

Lawrence trailed by a point when it took over at its own 36-yard line with 9:51 left. The Vikings took 13 plays to move all the way to the Lake Forest two-yard line before being stopped. Freshman Patrick O'Mahoney lined up for a 19-yard field goal, and the kick was blocked. The ball went out of the end zone and Lake Forest took over at its own 20 with 2:41 left.

Lawrence (0-2, 0-2) was out of timeouts, but the Foresters failed to pick up a first down. Lake Forest did the Vikings a favor by throwing an incomplete pass on third down to stop the clock. Lake Forest punted, and Lawrence got the ball back at its own 23 with 47 seconds left.

Lawrence quarterback Luke Barthelmess hit Sam Wagner with a 32-yard completion on the first play to move the ball to the Lake Forest 45. Barthelmess then ripped off runs of 11 and 24 yards to move to the Lake Forest 10-yard line.

After a pair of incompletions, the Vikings were called for offensive pass interference with six seconds left. O'Mahoney lined up for a 42-yard

field goal, but the kick was blocked again as time expired.

Barthelmess ran 21 times for 124 yards, and he completed 24 of 36 passes for 284 yards and a touchdown. Taylor Mandich grabbed seven passes for 95 yards for the Vikings.

The Lawrence offense piled up 450 yards of offense, including 166 on the ground. The Lawrence defense limited Lake Forest to just 239 yards, and the Foresters were just 3-for-11 on third down.

Alec Howe paced the Lake Forest offense by running 20 times for 121 yards. Quarterback Mike Lewis was 8-for-17 for 75 yards and a touchdown.

Lake Forest took a 7-0 lead when it moved 76 yards in six plays with Lewis connecting with Mike Rantis on a 14-yard touchdown pass. Lawrence answered on its next possession as the Vikings went 77 yards in 11 plays for the score. Barthelmess hit Mandich with a seven-yard scoring pass with 1:34 left in the first quarter to tie the game at 7-7.

Lawrence then scored on its next possession to take a 13-7 lead. The Vikings went 49 yards in nine plays, with Isaac Barthelmess scoring his first collegiate touchdown on a three-yard run. Jake Rotkvich blocked the extra point, and the Vikings led by six.

Lake Forest then took the lead for good late in the second quarter. The Foresters went 50 yards in seven plays as Charlie Quinn ripped off a 20-yard touchdown run. Lake Forest converted on the extra point and led 14-13 with 4:48 left in the first half.

**September 21**

**Beloit 38, Lawrence 21**

BELOIT, Wis. — The Lawrence University football team didn't score in the second half,



and Beloit College pulled away for a 38-21 Midwest Conference victory over the Vikings at Strong Stadium.

The teams went to halftime tied 21-21.

Running back Mason Dixon ran 12 times for 200 yards and three touchdowns to lead Beloit (1-2, 1-1 MWC), which snapped a 13-game losing streak. It was all or next-to-nothing for Dixon, who had runs of 56, 48, 42, 18 and 16 yards but had a combined 21 yards on his other seven carries.

Lawrence quarterback Luke Barthelmess had 26 carries for 76 yards and completed 15 of 30 passes for 153 yards and a touchdown. Running back Isaac Barthelmess ran 15 times for 63 yards for the Vikings (0-3, 0-3).

Beloit led 7-0 on the first play from scrimmage when Kameron Sallee hit Michael Nolden with a 50-yard touchdown pass. Lawrence answered back after a short punt by the Bucs gave the Vikings the ball at the Beloit 36-yard line.

Luke Barthelmess connected with Dan Dubnicka on a 30-yard completion to the Beloit six, and Isaac Barthelmess scored on the next play to tie it at 7-7.

Beloit took a 14-7 lead on Dixon's 16-yard scoring run, but Lawrence scored the next 14 points. The Vikings moved 58 yards in seven plays for a touchdown to tie the game 14-14 in the second quarter. Isaac Barthelmess' two-yard touchdown run finished the drive.

After an on-sides kick was recovered by the Vikings, Lawrence drove in for another touchdown. ### October 5

APPLETON, Wis. — Cecil Brimmage ran for 273 yards, and the Illinois College foot-



ball team battled to a 26-6 Midwest Conference victory over Lawrence University at the Banta Bowl.

Brimmage carried 29 times and scored a third-quarter touchdown. Blueboys quarterback Michael Bates completed 14 of 25 passes for 195 yards and two touchdowns.

Lawrence quarterback Luke Barthelmess went 22 of 40 for 230 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions. Barthelmess also posted his third 100-yard rushing game of the season with 24 carries for 117 yards.

Illinois College (4-0, 3-0 MWC) jumped out to a 13-0 lead in the first quarter with a Bates touchdown pass and a Kurt Frischman interception return for a touchdown. Frischman, a defensive lineman, batted a Barthelmess pass and hauled it in. He rumbled 75 yards for the score.

Lawrence (0-4, 0-4) cut the lead to 13-6 on a long scoring drive early in the second quarter. The Vikings moved 88 yards in 13 plays and took more than seven minutes off the clock. Barthelmess hit Sam Wagner with a nine-yard touchdown pass with 11:54 left in the first half.

The Lawrence defense stopped the Blueboys on their next possession when Bates' fourth-down pass fell incomplete in the Lawrence end zone. The Vikings stopped the Blueboys again when Brimmage fumbled at the goal line and the ball was recovered by linebacker James Holden in the end zone.

With Brimmage doing nearly all the damage, Illinois College scored

early in the second half. Brimmage's 24-yard touchdown run put the Blueboys up 19-6.

After the Blueboys stopped Lawrence on downs deep in Illinois College territory, they drove back down the field for the final score of the game. Bates hit Kevin Fuller with his second touchdown catch of the game for a 26-6 lead.
