The Series

In a series that dates back to 1940, Grinnell holds a 29-27 lead over Lawrence. The Pioneers have won three straight in the series, and Lawrence's last victory was a 24-14 win at Grinnell in 2012.

Last Meeting

Grinnell scored the game's first 35 points and went on to a 52-14 victory on Nov. 15, 2014, over Lawrence in the ninth-place game on Midwest Conference championship weekend.

Grinnell quarterback Sam Poulos completed 12-of-16 passes for 214 yards and five touchdowns to pace the Pioneers. Grinnell's Jacob Meixler caught four passes, all for touchdowns, for 107 yards.

Lawrence quarterback Chance

Byrd completed 21-of-42 passes for 244 yards and a touchdown. Starting linebacker Brandon Taylor did double duty as he played running back and carried the ball 15 times for 68 yards and a touchdown for the Vikings.

Taylor also paced the Lawrence defense by making 12 tackles and recording a sack. Nick Ulloa and Jacob Lueck both recorded interceptions for the Vikings.

Grinnell scored five touchdowns on its first seven possessions of the game en route to building a 35-7 lead at the half. Meixler caught touchdown passes of 32, seven and 33 yards in the first half. He added a 35-yard scoring pass in the third quarter.

Lawrence got on the board when the Vikings moved 67 yards in 11 plays in the second quarter. Byrd capped the drive with a 10-yard touchdown pass to Trevor Spina, who caught six passes for 57 yards on the day.

The Vikings also scored the game's final touchdown when Taylor record-

ed his first career score. Byrd's 31-yard completion to Taylor Mandich gave Lawrence a first down at the Grinnell four-yard line, and Taylor ran it on the next play for the touchdown.

Last Week

A big play jump-started Knox's offense and a long scoring drive sealed the Prairie Fire's 20-6 nonconference win over Lawrence last Saturday at Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Knox got a 79-yard run on the second play of third quarter to set up its first touchdown, and the Prairie Fire went on a drive that ate up 7:10 of the fourth quarter to grab a two-touchdown lead.

Nick Edlund ran 20 times for 156 yards, and Jared Zanger scored all three touchdowns for Knox.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield was 7-for-14 for 80 yards and ran seven times for 35 yards. Quarterback Kemani Pittman, who splits time with Butterfield, was 7-of-12 passing

for 55 yards.

The game was scoreless at the half after Knox dodged a bullet early in the game. Lawrence took the opening kickoff and drove right down the field. Butterfield had nine-yard touchdown run called back on a penalty, and Lawrence later faced fourth-and-2 at the Knox three-yard line. Butterfield's pass just missed Trevor Spina at the goal line and Knox took over on downs.

Knox took the opening kickoff of the second half, and Edlund broke free for a 79-yard run on the second play. He was pushed out of bounds at the Lawrence one-yard line, and Zanger scored on the next play for a 7-0 lead.

The Prairie Fire took over after a punt later in the third quarter at the Lawrence 42. Aided by a personal foul penalty, Knox moved to the Lawrence 12, and Zanger ran it in from there for a 13-0 edge.

Lawrence got on the board with a nice scoring drive early in the fourth quarter. Lawrence looked like it had been stopped when it faced fourthand-6 at the Knox 34, but Butterfield faked a punt and raced 22 yards to the Knox 12. The Vikings then benefited from a pass interference penalty to get a first down at the two-yard line. Dalton Sendelbach barreled into the end zone on the next play to cut the lead to 13-6.

Knox took the next possession and moved 79 yards in 12 plays, eating up more than seven minutes in the process, to grab a 20-6 lead. Zander scored a two-yard run with 3:27 left to seal the victory.

The Coaches

Rob McCarthy (Concordia Moorhead 1989) is in his first season as Lawrence's head coach and has a record of 1-3 (.250). Jeff Peder- Rob McCarthy sen (Grinnell 2002) is



in his sixth season at Grinnell and has a record of 18-35 (.340).

► This is the final game before Lawrence's bye week. Following the game against Grinnell, the Vikings get

Bowl. Lawrence plays four of its final five games at home.

Lawrence's two freshmen quarterbacks continued their strong play against Knox. Ryan



Butterfield Kemani Pittman

(McDonough, Ga./ Strong Rock Christian) and Kemani Pittman (Covington, Ga./Rockdale County) were a combined 14-of-26 passing



for 135 yards. These Ryan Butterfield two rookies have

combined for a 56.8 completion percentage and have thrown just two interceptions. Butterfield is 27-of-48 for 328 yards and five touchdowns. Pittman is 23-of-40 for 199 yards and is still looking for his first collegiate touchdown pass.

The top target for the quarterbacks this season is junior Trevor Spina (Henderson, Nev./Coronado), who has 17 catches for 163 yards and a touchdown. Spina was injured in the second half of Lawrence's game against Knox and did not return.

► Sophomore receiver Jacob Berman (Bethesda, Md./ Wallace) has made a very successful transition from quarterback. Berman is second on the team Jacob Berman with 14 catches and



has a team-best 165 receiving yards and one touchdown. Berman also has 21 carries for 89 yards, a 4.2-yard average, and a pair of touchdowns.

► Lawrence ranks fourth in the Midwest Conference in scoring offense at 27 points per game. The Vikings are 10th in total offense at 267.8 yards per contest after being held to just 220 yards against the Prairie Fire.

Sophomore defensive end Jake Gostisha (Appleton, Wis./ East) posted a career high vs. Knox. Playing in just his fourth career game since moving to defense, Jake Gostisha

the converted quarterback picked up 10 tackles, including 2.0 TFLs, against the Prairie Fire. Gostisha leads the team with 36 tackles and also leads with 6.0 TFLs and 3.0 sacks.

Sophomore safety Wes Hetcher (Wau-Wis./Wautoma, toma) had a great interception along the Knox sideline in the first quarter. Hetcher,

a converted wide Wes Hetcher receiver, now has a

team-high two interceptions on the season.

The Vikings did not turn the ball over against Knox and are now plus-8 in turnover margin. That ranks second in the Midwest Conference.

The Vikings rank ninth in the Midwest Conference in total defense at 413.2 yards per game. Lawrence is ninth in scoring defense at 31.8 points per contest.



► Lawrence had just one sack against Knox, but the Vikings are tied for the top spot in the league with nine sacks.

Pioneers Update

Macalester put up 14 points in the third guarter to pull away and went on to post a



41-13 nonconference win over Grinnell last Saturday. The Scots led 20-6 at the half, but stretched that lead all the way to 41-6 in the fourth quarter to seal the victory. The Scots piled up 542 yards of offense, including 306 on the ground, in rolling to the victory.

► The Grinnell offense is triggered by senior quarterback Sam Poulos, who has had some big games against Lawrence during his career. Poulos is 44-of-77 passing for 490 yards and five touchdowns this season. He has thrown just one interception.

The top targets for the Pioneers are Emmi Sandoval and Henry Cummings. Sandoval leads the team with 14

catches for 163 yards and two touchdowns. Cummings has 10 catches and a team-high 172 receiving yards. He also has a pair of touchdown catches.

► Jacob Bernholtz leads the team in rushing with just 71 yards in three games. Grinnell is averaging a meager 1.7 yards per carry.

The Pioneers have allowed a leagueworst 15 sacks this season.

► Grinnell is last in the conference in scoring offense at 14.7 points per game. The Pioneers are last in total offense at 225 yards per game.

► Freshman linebacker Ryan Slager is tops on the team with 34 tackles. He ranks second in the Midwest Conference at 11.3 tackles per game.

▶ Barrett Morrissette and Joe Galaske are tied for the team lead with 3.5 tackles for loss. The Pioneers have not recorded a sack yet this season.

► Grinnell ranks last in the conference in scoring defense at 46 points per game, and the Pionees are last in total defense at 521 yards per contest.

► Grinnell head coach Jeff Pedersen is a college football teammate of Lawrence baseball coach Jason Anderson.

September 5 Rockford 52, Lawrence 17

A P P L E T O N , Wis. — The Rockford University football team used a powerful running



game to roll to a 52-17 nonconference victory over Lawrence University.

It was the first football game played on the renovated Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Chance Manning ran 32 times for 211 yards and three touchdowns for Rockford (1-0), and he caught two passes for 86 yards and a score. The Regents finished with 58 carries for 438 yards and rolled up 605 yards of offense.

Quarterback Adam O'Malley completed 7-of-13 passes for 167 yards and a touchdown. He also ran 10 times for 62 yards.

Lawrence (0-1) was limited to just 83 yards of offense, including just 25 through the air.

Rockford jumped out to a 21-0 lead after one quarter with a trio of big plays. Pete Berry broke free for a 65-yard scoring run, Manning added a 40-yard TD run and Manning caught a 53-yard touchdown pass.

Manning added two more touchdown runs in the second quarter, and the Regents led 35-0 at the half.

Sophomore Alic Riedel got Lawrence on the board with an 81-yard kickoff return for a touchdown.

It was Riedel's first collegiate touchdown.

Austin Tucker's 64-yard fumble return set up Lawrence's next score as the Vikings took over at the Rockford 16-yard line.

After an end around by Trevor Spina got the ball to the one-yard line, Spina punched it in from a yard out on the next play to cut the lead to 45-14.

The Vikings later added a 24-yard field goal from Pat O'Mahoney to complete their scoring.

September 12 Lawrence 51, Maranatha 6

WATERTOWN, Wis. — The Lawrence University football team bolted to a 24-6 lead at



the half and rolled to 51-6 nonconference win over Maranatha Baptist University.

Three Vikings (1-1) scored their first career touchdowns, and rookie Lawrence head coach Rob McCarthy picked up his first career victory.

Cam Boerm caught a pair of touchdown passes and Jacob Berman ran for a pair of scores for Lawrence. Senior running back Corey Fisher also got his first career touchdown for the Vikings.

Lawrence freshman quarterback Ryan Butterfield tossed his first two career touchdown passes and finished 6-for-11 passing for 92 yards. He also ran three times for 22 yards. Boerm finished with five catches for 61 yards, and Berman ran eight times for 88 yards and two scores.

Lawrence's other freshman quarterback, Kemani Pittman, also was 8-for-13 and finished with 54 yards passing.

The Vikings, who finished with 420 yards of offense, limited Maranatha (0-2) to just 236 yards, including just 28 on the ground.

Junior linebacker Jacob Lueck had a team-high 10 tackles for Lawrence and that included 2.0 tackles for loss. Lueck also forced two fumbles and recovered a fumbles. Maranatha fumbled five times on the afternoon and lost all five to the Vikings. Lawrence also intercepted three passes as Hunter Adams, Wes Hetcher and Nick Ulloa all recorded picks.

Lawrence's defense was in the backfield all afternoon as the Vikings picked up seven sacks, including 2.5 by Colt Duncan and 2.0 by Jake Gostisha.

The Vikings took advantage of a short field on its first two scoring

drives to jump out to a 13-0 lead. Fisher scored on a two-yard run, and Trevor Spina scored from a yard out.

After a Maranatha touchdown cut the lead to 13-6, Lawrence scored twice in the final 2:41 of the first half. Boerm caught a 25-yard touchdown pass, and Pat O'Mahoney kicked a 27-yard field goal to give Lawrence a 24-6 lead at the half.

Dalton Sendelbach had a six-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, and Berman then scored on runs of 39 and 10 yards early in the fourth quarter. The Vikings added a late touchdown by Boerm to finish the scoring.

September 19 Beloit 49, Lawrence 34

BELOIT, Wis. — The Beloit College football team ran out to a big early lead and went on



to a 49-34 Midwest Conference North Division victory over Lawrence University.

Mason Dixon ran 19 times for 218 yards and three touchdowns, including a 77-yard scamper, to lead Beloit (2-1, 1-0 MWC). Beloit quarterback Danny May was 13-of-19 passing for 233 yards and four touchdowns.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield was 12-of-17 for 140 yards and three touchdowns. He also ran five times for 54 yards.

Trevor Spina caught seven passes for 94 yards, and Jacob Berman had six catches for 88 yards. Spina, Berman and Cam Boerm all caught touchdown passes for the Vikings.

The Bucs scored three times in the first 8:43 to rush out to a 21-0 lead. Lawrence (1-2, 0-1) got on the board on Donnel Haley's two-yard touchdown run in the second quarter but trailed 42-7 at the half.

The Vikings trailed 49-7 before putting up 27 points in the final quarter.

Corey Fisher had a nine-yard scoring run, and Butterfield then threw

September 26 Knox 20, Lawrence 6

APPLETON, Wis. -- A big play jump-started the Knox College offense and a long



scoring drive sealed the Prairie Fire's 20-6 non-conference win over Lawrence University at Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Knox (2-1) got a 79-yard run on the second play of third quarter to set up its first touchdown, and the Prairie Fire went on a drive that ate up 7:10 of the fourth quarter to grab a twotouchdown lead.

Nick Edlund ran 20 times for 156 yards, and Jared Zanger scored all three touchdowns for Knox.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield was 7-for-14 for 80 yards and ran seven times for 35 yards. Quarterback Kemani Pittman, who splits time with Butterfield, was 7-of-12 passing for 55 yards.

The game was scoreless at the half after Knox dodged a bullet early in the game. Lawrence (1-3) took the opening kickoff and drove right down the field. Butterfield had nine-yard touchdown run called back on a penalty, and Lawrence later faced fourthand-2 at the Knox three-yard line. Butterfield's pass just missed Trevor Spina at the goal line and Knox took over on downs.

Knox took the opening kickoff of the second half, and Edlund broke free for a 79-yard run on the second play. He was pushed out of bounds at the Lawrence one-yard line, and Zanger scored on the next play for a 7-0 lead.

The Prairie Fire took over after a punt later in the third quarter at the Lawrence 42. Aided by a personal foul penalty, Knox moved to the Lawrence 12, and Zanger ran it in from there for a 13-0 edge.

Lawrence got on the board with a nice scoring drive early in the fourth quarter. Lawrence looked like it had been stopped when it faced fourthand-6 at the Knox 34, but Butterfield faked a punt and raced 22 yards to the Knox 12. The Vikings then benefited from a pass interference penalty to get a first down at the two-yard line. Dalton Sendelbach barreled into the end zone on the next play to cut the lead to 13-6.

Knox took the next possession and moved 79 yards in 12 plays, eating up more than seven minutes in the process, to grab a 20-6 lead. Zander scored a two-yard run with 3:27 left to seal the victory.
