The Series

Lawrence and Grinnell are in a 27-27-0 tie in a series that dates back to 1940. Lawrence won a series-best 10 consecutive games from 1941-54, but Grinnell has had the better of it in the past few years. The Pioneers have won six of the last seven meetings, and Lawrence's last victory was a 24-14 win at Grinnell in 2012.

Last Meeting

Grinnell made three goal-line stands and used that to secure a 24-21 Midwest Conference win over Lawrence on Nov. 2, 2013, at the Banta Bowl.

Grinnell won despite rushing for only 14 yards and having the ball for

less than 22 minutes. Lawrence rolled up 25 first downs and 513 yards of offense, but the Vikings were stopped three times deep in Grinnell territory.

Grinnell quarterback Sam Poulos went 20-for-40 for 363 yards and two touchdowns. Jacob Meixler caught 10 passes for 203 yards and a touchdown and Emmi Sandoval caught seven passes for 93 yards.

Lawrence quarterback Luke Barthelmess ran 17 times for 131 yards, and he completed 32 of 50 passes for 337 yards and three touchdowns. Sam Wagner caught six passes for 106 yards for the Vikings.

Lawrence grabbed a 7-0 lead when it drove 45 yards in six plays on its first possession of the game. Barthelmess hit Tyler Lueck with a 27-yard scoring pass. Grinnell tied

it on the final play of the first quarter when Poulos found Meixler, who raced 75 yards for the score.

Grinnell made its first big stand on the ensuing possession. Facing a fourth-and-one at the Grinnell five-yard line, Isaac Barthelmess was stopped short and Lawrence turned the ball over on downs. Grinnell drove down the field and Graham Fisher kicked a 21-yard field goal for a 10-7 lead.

Lawrence immediately grabbed the lead back when it drove 65 yards in six plays for a touchdown. Luke Barthelmess found Dan Dubnicka with a 27-yard scoring pass, and Lawrence led 13-10 at the half.

The Vikings appeared poised to stretch the lead when they moved deep into Grinnell territory early in the third quarter. Luke Barthelmess ripped off a 42-yard run on the drive, and the Vikings later had first-and-goal at the Grinnell two. The Vikings ran it up the middle four times, but

Grinnell held and took over at their one-yard line.

The Pioneers then took the lead late in the third quarter with a nine-play, 69-yard drive. Two key holding penalties on Lawrence kept the drive alive, and Jacob Bernholtz had a one-yard scoring run to give the Pioneers a 17-13 lead.

Lawrence took the ensuing possession and drove to the Grinnell five-yard line. Facing fourth-and-one at the Grinnell two, Luke Barthelmess was sacked, and the Pioneers got the ball back.

Grinnell tacked on its final score midway through the fourth quarter when Poulos hit Jake O'Polka with a 62-yard scoring pass for a 24-13 edge. Lawrence fumbled on its next possession, but the Vikings got the ball back and moved down the field. Luke Barthelmess hit Isaac Barthelmess with a 10-yard scoring pass to cut the lead to 24-21 with 1:26 left.

Grinnell recovered the ensuing on-sides kick to seal the win.

Last Week

Knox pulled out to a 35-0 lead at the half and went on to a 45-14 non-conference win over Lawrence this past Saturday at the Knosher Bowl.

Knox got two first-half touchdowns from Terry White and two more first-half scores from Matt McCaffrey to pull away. The Prairie Fire posted 502 yards of offense, including 345 on the ground.

Quarterback Chance Byrd ran for one touchdown and threw for another to pace Lawrence, which was limited to 226 yards of offense. Byrd had 11 carries for 50 yards and completed 8-of-16 passes for 127 yards, one touchdown and one interception.

Trevor Spina had the biggest receiving day of his career with six catches for 109 yards and a touchdown for Lawrence.

The Vikings, who committed four

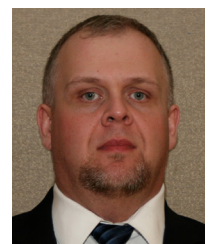
turnovers, got on the board when Byrd connected with Spina on an 80-yard touchdown pass midway through the third quarter. Lawrence got its other score when Bryd ran 15 yards for a touchdown to complete a seven-play, 72-yard drive early in the fourth quarter.

Dan Taylor made 14 tackles and Zach Eichhorst had 11 to lead the Lawrence defense. Freshman Alic Rie-

del picked off his second pass of the season for Lawrence.

Vikings Update

►Defensive back Dan Taylor (Bridgeport, Calif./Lee Vining) posted a career-high 14 tackles in the game at Knox last Saturday. Taylor, who had eight solo tackles and six assisted tackles, surpassed his previous career high of 12, which was set at Carroll in 2013.



►Taylor now has 24 tackles on the season and is tied for the team lead with junior defensive back Zach Eichhorst (Brillion, Wis./Brillion). Eichhorst had a career-high 11 tackles against Knox, and that topped his previous best of 10, which took place against Monmouth in 2012. Linebacker Brandon Taylor (Johnsburg, Ill./Johnsburg) is next on the squad with 20 stops.

►Junior linebacker Colt Duncan (Columbia, Tenn./Zion Christian) made 2.0 tackles for loss and leads the team at 4.5 TFLs. Duncan is having his best season with the Vikings and already has 18 tackles in 2014.

►Freshman defensive back Alic Riedel (Appleton, Wis./East) got his second interception of the season with a pick at Knox. Riedel is third in the Midwest Conference at 0.67 interceptions per game and is seventh at 1.33 passes defended per contest.

defense at 26.3 points per game. The Vikings are seventh in total defense at 342.0 yards per contest.

►Sophomore quarterback Tanner Schuh (Appleton, Wis./North) struggled in the first half against Knox, but freshman signal-caller Chance Byrd (Lincoln, Ala./Lincoln) fared better after the break. Byrd was 8-for-16 for 127 yards, one touchdown and one interception in the second half. He led the Vikings on a pair of scoring drives. Byrd has now completed 25-of-47 passes (53.2 percent) for 347 yards, three touchdowns and three interceptions. Byrd also leads the team in rushing with 29 carries for 130 yards and two touchdowns.

►Senior Taylor Mandich (Green Bay, Wis./Southwest) had just one catch against Knox but continues to lead the team in receiving. Mandich has 12 catches for 244 yards for a hefty 20.4-yard average per catch. Mandich also

has a team-best three touchdown catches.

►Lawrence ranks sixth in the conference in scoring offense at 26.3 points per contest. The Vikings are fourth in total offense at 372.0 yards per game.

Pioneers Update

►Grinnell rallied to take the lead in the second half against Macalester, but the Scots scored the game's final eight points to pull out a 21-16 win last Saturday at Rosenbloom Field. Grinnell scored 13 points in the third quarter to grab a 16-13 edge, but Macalester tackled Grinnell quarterback Sam Poulos in the end zone for a safety to trim the margin to 16-15. The Scots then put together a seven-play, 49-yard touchdown drive, and Samson Bialostok went the final 18 yards for the score. Grinnell had two possessions after the Macalester touchdown but couldn't advance past midfield.



►The Grinnell offense is triggered by

quarterback Sam Poulos, who threw for 130 yards and ran for 94 against Macalester. Poulos is 37-of-85 passing for 493 yards, two touchdowns and four interceptions. Poulos has 45 carries for 107 yards, but his rushing total has been slashed by 12 sacks for a loss of 59 yards.

►Receiver Jacob Meixler has hurt Lawrence in the past, and he leads the Pioneers in receiving. Meixler had nine catches for 164 yards and one touchdown. Zach McGriff also has nine catches for 122 yards and a score.

►Running back Jacob Bernholtz is tops on the team in rushing with 58 carries for 192 yards, a 3.3-yard average, and four touchdowns.

►The Pioneers rank ninth in the league in scoring offense at 20.0 points per game. Grinnell is 10th in total offense at 288.3 yards per contest.

►Linebacker David Ternes is having a big season with 45 tackles through three games. He ranks first in the conference at 15.0 tackles per game.

►Daniel Munger, who has 18 tackles, is first on the squad at 3.5 tackles for loss.

►The Pioneers have recorded only 2.0 sacks through three games.

►Grinnell has yet to intercept a pass

Rockford 34, Lawrence 6

ROCKFORD, Ill.

— The Lawrence University football team dug itself a big hole early, and Rockford University pulled away late for a 34-6 nonconference victory at Sam Greeley Field.



The Regents (1-0) surged to a 19-0 lead just 11 minutes into the game, and Rockford then put up a pair of touchdowns in a 16-second span in the fourth quarter to seal the win.

Quarterback Andrew Stochl and receiver Milton Phillips did most of the damage for the Regents. Stochl completed 17-of-27 passes for 291 yards and three touchdowns. Phillips caught five passes for 127 yards and a score.

Lawrence (0-1) struggled on offense and had just 234 total yards. Rockford rolled up 448 yards of offense.

After two touchdown passes from Stochl and a scoring run from Pete Berry put the Regents up early, Lawrence cut the deficit to 19-6. Freshman Alic Riedel blocked Cody Casazza's punt to give Lawrence the ball at the Rockford 21-yard line. Lawrence scored eight plays later on Tanner Schuh's two-yard run.

Lawrence was driving again in the final minutes of the first half, but Schuh was intercepted in the Rockford end zone to end the threat.

The score remained the same until Rockford drove 73 yards in eight plays midway through the fourth quarter. Stochl hit Dane Kirk with a 22-yard scoring pass for a 27-6 lead with 8:59 left.

On the next play from scrimmage, Pascal Sylla intercepted Lawrence backup quarterback Chance Byrd and returned it 31 yards for a touchdown and a 34-6 lead.

Schuh finished 10-of-29 passing for 103 yards. Byrd was 6-for-16 passing for 68 yards and two interceptions.

Byrd led the team with seven carries for 34 yards, and Dan Rothbauer, Taylor Mandich and Tyler Lueck all had four catches apiece for the Vikings.

Lawrence 59, Maranatha Baptist 0

APPLETON, Wis.

— The Lawrence University football team routed Maranatha Baptist University 59-0 in a nonconference game at the Banta Bowl.



Lawrence quarterback Tanner Schuh played only the first half but ran for 99 yards and a touchdown and threw for 244 and two touchdowns as the Vikings (1-1) bolted a 28-0 lead at the half. Backup quarterback Chance Byrd completed 11 of 15 passes for 152 yards and two touchdowns and ran 11 times for 46 yards and a score.

Taylor Mandich grabbed seven passes for 181 yards and three touchdowns, including a 70-yard scoring pass in the first half. Dalton Sendelbach added 14 carries for 89 yards and a touchdown for the Vikings. Lawrence kicker Patrick O'Mahoney also tied the school record of Cody Robel and Kraig Krueger with eight extra points.

The Lawrence defense, which held Maranatha to just 76 yards, recorded its first shutout since beating Ripon College 26-0 in 1991. It was a team effort on defense with Tony Harth leading the way with six tackles, including a sack and 2.5 tackles for loss. Lawrence limited Maranatha (0-2) to 20 carries for a minus-32 yards on the ground.

The Vikings also intercepted five passes, one each by Alic Riedel, Dan Taylor, Nick Ulloa, Jake Walker and defensive end Gabor Bukszar.

Lawrence scored touchdowns on its first three possessions and four of its first five. Trevor Spina had a four-yard run for the first touchdown, and Schuh scored from three yards out on the next drive for a 14-0 lead.

After Mandich had his 55-yard touchdown catch called back due to a penalty, he hooked up with Schuh on a 70-yard scoring pass on the next play for a 21-0 lead. Mandich then caught a 23-yard scoring pass with 4:51 left in the second quarter to put the Vikings up 28-0.

Lawrence got a 21-yard field goal from O'Mahoney to make it 31-0 midway through the third quarter. The Vikings then picked up touchdowns on four of their next five possessions to complete the scoring. Byrd connected with Cole Erickson on an 11-yard touchdown pass and then hit Mandich from 21 yards out to push the lead to 45-0 after three quarters. Byrd had a 19-yard scoring run in the fourth quarter, and Sendelbach finished the scoring with a 20-yard touchdown scamper.

The big bright spot for the Sabercats was linebacker Ethan Kennon, who recorded 21 tackles, including 15 solo.

Knox 45, Lawrence 14

— The Knox College football team pulled out to a 35-0 lead at the half and went on to a 45-14 nonconference win over Lawrence University at the Knosher Bowl.



Knox (2-1) got two first-half touchdowns from Terry White and two more first-half scores from Matt McCaffrey to pull away. The Prairie Fire posted 502 yards of offense, including 345 on the ground.

Quarterback Chance Byrd ran for one touchdown and threw for another to pace Lawrence (1-2), which was limited to 226 yards of offense. Byrd had 11 carries for 50 yards and completed 8-of-16 passes for 127 yards, one touchdown and one interception.

Trevor Spina had the biggest receiving day of his career with six catches for 109 yards and a touch-

down for Lawrence.
