### The Series

Lawrence holds a 36-22-2 lead in the series that dates back to 1935. Lawrence won a series-record nine consecutive games over the Old Siwash, as Knox was then known, from 1961-69. Knox has won two of the last three meetings, and the Vikings took seven of nine games prior to that. Lawrence's last victory over Knox was a 23-20 victory in 2013 when Luke Barthelmess tossed a touchdown pass to his brother, Isaac, on the final play of the game.

### Last Meeting

Knox pulled out to a 35-0 lead at the half and went on to a 45-14 nonconference win over Lawrence on Sept. 27, 2014, at the Knosher Bowl.

Knox got two first-half touchdowns from Terry White and two more first-half scores from Matt McCaffrey to pull away. The Prairie Fire posted 502 yards of offense, including 345 on the ground.

Quarterback Chance Byrd ran for one touchdown and threw for another to pace Lawrence, which was limited to 226 yards of offense. Byrd had 11 carries for 50 yards and completed 8-of-16 passes for 127 yards, one touchdown and one interception.

Trevor Spina had the biggest receiving day of his career with six catches for 109 yards and a touchdown for Lawrence.

The Vikings, who committed four turnovers, got on the board when Byrd connected with Spina on an 80-yard touchdown pass midway through the third quarter. Lawrence got its other score when Bryd ran 15 yards for a touchdown to complete a seven-play, 72-yard drive early in the

fourth quarter.

Dan Taylor made 14 tackles and Zach Eichhorst had 11 to lead the Lawrence defense. Freshman Alic Riedel picked off his second pass of the season for Lawrence.

### Last Week

Beloit ran out to a big early lead and went on to a 49-34 Midwest Conference North Division victory over Lawrence last Saturday at Strong Stadium.

Mason Dixon ran 19 times for 218 yards and three touchdowns, including a 77-yard scamper, to lead Beloit. Beloit quarterback Danny May was 13-of-19 passing for 233 yards and four touchdowns.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield was 12-of-17 for 140 yards and three touchdowns. He also ran five times for 54 yards.

Trevor Spina caught seven passes for 94 yards, and Jacob Berman had six catches for 88 yards. Spina,

Berman and Cam Boerm all caught touchdown passes for the Vikings.

The Bucs scored three times in the first 8:43 to rush out to a 21-0 lead. Lawrence got on the board on Donnel Haley's two-yard touchdown run in the second quarter but trailed 42-7 at the half.

The Vikings trailed 49-7 before putting up 27 points in the final quarter.

Corey Fisher had a nine-yard scoring run, and Butterfield then threw touchdown passes of 25, 16 and 34 yards to complete the scoring.

### The Coaches

Rob McCarthy (Concordia Moorhead 1989) is in his first season as Lawrence's head coach and has a record of 1-2 (.333). Damon

Tomeo (Pomona-Pitzer 1999) is in his third season at Knox and has a record of 4-18 (.182). He is in his sixth season overall as a head coach and has a record of 18-43 (.295).

### Vikings Update

► This is the first of two "crossover" games the Vikings will play. Lawrence takes on South Division opponent



Knox this week and then travels to Grinnell next Saturday. While these are conference opponents, these are considered nonconference contests. These games will essentially go away after this season when the teams return to more of a round-robin schedule with the departure of Carroll to the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin.

► Freshman quarterback Ryan Butterfield (McDonough, Ga./Strong Rock Christian) had a big game for the Vikings against Beloit as he again split time with fellow first-year player Ke-

He also ran five times for a team-best 54 yards. On the season, Butterfield has completed 20-of-34 passes for 248 yards, five touchdowns

and one interception. He ranks fourth in the Midwest Conference with a 162.7 pass efficiency rating. He is averaging 7.8 yards per carry on just 12 rushing attempts this season.

► A trio of receivers has emerged as the top pass-catchers on the team. Junior Trevor Spina (Henderson, Nev./Coronado) has 12 catches for 122 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore Jacob

Berman (Bethesda, Md./Wallace) has 10 catches for 131 yards and a score, and freshman Cam Boerm (Port Lavaca, Texas/Calhoun) has eight catches for 101 yards. Boerm also has a team-high three touchdown catches.

►Lawrence ranks fourth in the Midwest Conference in scoring offense at 34.0 points per game. The Vikings are ninth in total offense at 283.7 yards per contest.

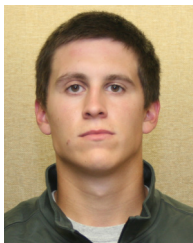
►The Vikings had a scary moment in the first quarter against Beloit when cornerback Alic Riedel (Appleton, Wis./East) had to be carried off the field with a leg injury. The injury wasn't as bad as initially feared and Riedel was able to return to the game. He has seven tackles on the season and leads the team with two pass breakups.

►Sophomore Dan Rothbauer (Appleton, Wis./North) is a starter on defense but has seen action on offense and special teams. Rothbauer had his biggest game at linebacker against Beloit as he recorded a game-high 10 tackles, including a TFL. Rothbauer is second on the team with 20 tackles and has 2.0 TFLs.

►Sophomore defensive end Jake Gostisha (Appleton, Wis./East) is tops on the team in tackles with 26 and has a team-best 3.0 sacks, and that leads the Midwest Conference. He is second on the team with 4.0 TFLs, and Colt Duncan (Columbia, Tenn./

Zion Christian) leads the team at 6.0.

►The Vikings rank seventh in the Midwest Conference in total defense at 455 yards per game. Lawrence is ninth in scoring defense at 35.7 points per contest.

►Lawrence is first in the conference with eight sacks.

►The Vikings also are a league-best plus-7 in turnover margin. Lawrence has recovered nine fumbles through the first three games.

**Prairie Fire Update**

►A late touchdown by quarterback Matt McCaffrey lifted Knox to a 23-20 victory over Carleton last Saturday. Carleton took a 20-10 with a pair of fourth-quarter touchdowns, but Knox struck back with two scores in the final five minutes. McCaffrey capped a six-play, 69-yard drive with a six-yard run to cut the lead to 20-16. Knox then re-



covered the onsides kick, and McCaffrey later ran 25 yards for the winning touchdown. Brock Gabel intercepted a Carleton pass to seal the win.

►McCaffrey completed 25-of-42 passes for 282 yards and a touchdown in the win over Carleton. McCaffrey is 42-of-74 for 503 yards with three touchdowns and two interceptions on the season. He ranks third in the league at 251.5 passing yards per game.

►The top receivers for Knox are Ilir Emini and Matthew Hemingsen. Emini has 14 catches for 220 yards and one touchdown. He ranks second in the league at 110 receiving yards per game. Hemingsen has 13 catches for 136 yards and a score.

►Running back Nick Edlund and McCaffrey pace the squad in rushing. Edlund has 34 carries for 137 yards and is averaging 4.0 yards per carry. McCaffrey has 19 carries for 132 yards and three scores and is averaging 6.9 yards per carry.

►Knox ranks seventh in the league in scoring offense at 22.0 points per game. The Prairie Fire is fifth in total offense at 390.5 yard per game.

►Linebacker Brock Gabel is tops on the team in tackles with 17 and ranks eighth in the conference at 8.5 tackles per game.

►Knox has just one TFL on the season, and the Prairie Fire hasn't recorded a sack in the first two games.

►Cornerback Evan Economos has a team-high two pass breakups, and Donnye Sommerville has the lone interception for Knox.

►Knox is fifth in the league in scoring defense at 26.0 points per game. The Prairie Fire is allowing 366.5 yards per game, which ranks fifth in total defense.

## 2015 Game Recaps

**September 5**

**Rockford 52, Lawrence 17**

APPLETON, Wis. — The Rockford University football team used a powerful running



game to roll to a 52-17 nonconference victory over Lawrence University.

It was the first football game played on the renovated Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Chance Manning ran 32 times for 211 yards and three touchdowns for Rockford (1-0), and he caught two passes for 86 yards and a score. The Regents finished with 58 carries for 438 yards and rolled up 605 yards of offense.

Quarterback Adam O'Malley completed 7-of-13 passes for 167 yards and a touchdown. He also ran 10 times for 62 yards.

Lawrence (0-1) was limited to just 83 yards of offense, including just 25 through the air.

Rockford jumped out to a 21-0 lead after one quarter with a trio of big plays. Pete Berry broke free for a 65-yard scoring run, Manning added a 40-yard TD run and Manning caught a 53-yard touchdown pass.

Manning added two more touchdown runs in the second quarter, and the Regents led 35-0 at the half.

Sophomore Alic Riedel got Lawrence on the board with an 81-yard kickoff return for a touchdown.

It was Riedel's first collegiate touchdown.

Austin Tucker's 64-yard fumble return set up Lawrence's next score as the Vikings took over at the Rockford 16-yard line.

After an end around by Trevor Spina got the ball to the one-yard line, Spina punched it in from a yard out on the next play to cut the lead to 45-14.

The Vikings later added a 24-yard field goal from Pat O'Mahoney to complete their scoring.

**September 12**

**Lawrence 51, Maranatha 6**

WATERTOWN, Wis. — The Lawrence University football team bolted to a 24-6 lead at



the half and rolled to 51-6 nonconference win over Maranatha Baptist University.

Three Vikings (1-1) scored their first career touchdowns, and rookie Lawrence head coach Rob McCarthy picked up his first career victory.

Cam Boerm caught a pair of touchdown passes and Jacob Berman ran for a pair of scores for Lawrence. Senior running back Corey Fisher also got his first career touchdown for the Vikings.

Lawrence freshman quarterback Ryan Butterfield tossed his first two career touchdown passes and finished 6-for-11 passing for 92 yards. He also ran three times for 22 yards. Boerm finished with five catches for 61 yards, and Berman ran eight times for 88 yards and two scores.

Lawrence's other freshman quarterback, Kemani Pittman, also was 8-for-13 and finished with 54 yards passing.

The Vikings, who finished with 420 yards of offense, limited Maranatha (0-2) to just 236 yards, including just 28 on the ground.

Junior linebacker Jacob Lueck had a team-high 10 tackles for Lawrence and that included 2.0 tackles for loss. Lueck also forced two fumbles and recovered a fumbles. Maranatha fumbled five times on the afternoon and lost all five to the Vikings. Lawrence also intercepted three passes as Hunter Adams, Wes Hetcher and Nick Ulloa all recorded picks.

Lawrence's defense was in the backfield all afternoon as the Vikings picked up seven sacks, including 2.5 by Colt Duncan and 2.0 by Jake Gostisha.

The Vikings took advantage of a short field on its first two scoring

drives to jump out to a 13-0 lead. Fisher scored on a two-yard run, and Trevor Spina scored from a yard out.

After a Maranatha touchdown cut the lead to 13-6, Lawrence scored twice in the final 2:41 of the first half. Boerm caught a 25-yard touchdown pass, and Pat O'Mahoney kicked a 27-yard field goal to give Lawrence a 24-6 lead at the half.

Dalton Sendelbach had a six-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, and Berman then scored on runs of 39 and 10 yards early in the fourth quarter. The Vikings added a late touchdown by Boerm to finish the scoring.

**September 19**

**Beloit 49, Lawrence 34**

The Beloit College football team ran out to a big early lead and went on



to a 49-34 Midwest Conference North Division victory over Lawrence University.

Mason Dixon ran 19 times for 218 yards and three touchdowns, including a 77-yard scamper, to lead Beloit (2-1, 1-0 MWC). Beloit quarterback Danny May was 13-of-19 passing for 233 yards and four touchdowns.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield was 12-of-17 for 140 yards and three touchdowns. He also ran five times for 54 yards.

Trevor Spina caught seven passes for 94 yards, and Jacob Berman had six catches for 88 yards. Spina, Berman and Cam Boerm all caught touchdown passes for the Vikings.

The Bucs scored three times in the first 8:43 to rush out to a 21-0 lead. Lawrence (1-2, 0-1) got on the board on Donnel Haley's two-yard touchdown run in the second quarter but trailed 42-7 at the half.

The Vikings trailed 49-7 before putting up 27 points in the final quarter.

Corey Fisher had a nine-yard scoring run, and Butterfield then threw
