The Series

In Wisconsin's oldest college football rivalry, Ripon holds a 60-46-7 advantage. The first game in the series was played in 1893, and the teams have played every year since 1945. It is the 15th-oldest series in the country with 113 games played.

Last Meeting

Ripon jumped out to a 21-point halftime lead and went on to a 48-28 Midwest Conference win over Lawrence in the 113th game in the state's oldest college football rivalry on Nov. 16, 2013.

With the win, Ripon retained possession of the Doehling-Heselton Memorial Trophy.

Quarterback Stephen Covalt led Ripon by running 27 times for 107

yards and a touchdown. Amazingly, Covalt fumbled seven times on the afternoon, but only lost one fumble to the Lawrence defense. Eric Langman added 95 yards on seven carries and he scored twice for the Red Hawks. Covalt completed 8 of 12 passes for 108 yards and two touchdowns.

Lawrence quarterback Luke Barthelmess completed 14 of 37 passes for 285 yards and three touchdowns. Barthelmess also ran 16 times for 110 yards.

Barthelmess finished a stellar career as the most prolific passer in Lawrence history. Barthelmess' 285 passing yards on the afternoon moved him past former Monmouth College star Rob Purlee (8,017) into fourth place in Midwest Conference history with 8,190 yards. Barthelmess now has 62 career touchdown passes and that ranks seventh in conference history.

Defensive back/wide receiver Sam Wagner had a huge day for the

Vikings. On defense, he recorded a game-high 12 tackles, including 1.0 tackles for loss. On offense, Wagner caught three passes for 119 yards, and included in that total was a 64-yard touchdown catch.

Ripon led 14-0 in the first quarter when Barthelmess connected with Wagner on the 64-yard scoring pass to cut the margin in half. Ripon then got two touchdown passes from Covalt in the second quarter to stretch the margin to 28-7 at the half.

Lawrence trimmed the lead to 28-14 when Barthelmess hit Tyler Lueck with a five-yard touchdown pass on the opening drive of the third quarter. Ripon countered by scoring the game's next three touchdowns to seal the victory.

Lawrence got a one-yard touchdown run from Isaac Barthelmess and a two-yard touchdown pass from Luke Barthelmess to Dan Dubnicka to finish the scoring.

Last Week

A 24-point second quarter propelled St. Norbert to a 42-0 Midwest Conference North Division victory over Lawrence last Saturday in the Banta Bowl.

St. Norbert scored three touchdowns in a span of 3:31 to take command in the second quarter.

St. Norbert quarterback James Tringali completed 12-of-29 passes for 212 yards and two touchdowns. Brett Olson had five catches for 101 yards and a pair of scores for the Green Knights.

Lawrence quarterback Chance Byrd 20 carries for 55 yards and completed 10-of-27 passes for 80 yards.

After a scoreless first quarter, St. Norbert moved 76 yards in six plays for the game's first touchdown. Zach Broberg's six-yard run gave the Green Knights a 7-0 lead. Lawrence then fumbled the ensuing kickoff return, and Ryan Grandlic scooped up the fumble at the Lawrence 10-yard line and scored for a 14-0 lead.

After a three-and-out, the Green Knights got the ball back at Lawrence 34-yard line following Brandon Carter's 14-yard punt return. Tringali then hit Olson with a 30-yard scoring pass four plays later for a 21-0 lead. The Green Knights added a Randy Hill 30-yard field goal with 17 seconds left in the first half and led 24-0 at the break.

St. Norbert got another Tringali-to-Olson touchdown pass in the third quarter, and backup quarterback Cole Patterson tossed an 11-yard scoring pass late in the fourth quarter.

Senior linebacker Brandon Taylor paced the Lawrence defense with 10 tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss. Taylor also played offense and had six carries for 36 yards.

The Coaches

Chris Harris (Cumberlands 2000) is serving as Lawrence's interim head coach. Ron Ernst (Nebraska Wesleyan 1980) is in his 24th

Vikings Update

► Lawrence's struggles on offense continued for a second consecutive week as the Vikings were shut out by St. Norbert. The Vikings haven't scored since



the final quarter of the game at Carroll in week six.

► Lawrence is 11th in the Midwest Conference in scoring offense at 14.2 points per game. Lawrence ranks ninth in total offense at 286.6 yards per game.

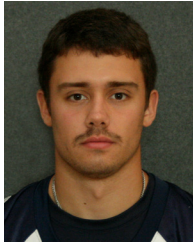
► Freshman Chance Byrd (Lincoln, Ala./Lincoln) has taken over as the

starting quarterback for the Vikings. Byrd had a tough time against the St. Norbert defense last Saturday as he completed just 10-of-27 passes for 80 yards. On the season, Byrd is 78-of-160 for 936 yards, seven touchdowns and 10 interceptions.

►Although he was limited to only two catches for 37 yards against St. Norbert, senior Taylor Mandich (Green Bay, Wis./Southwest) is the top receiver for the Vikings. Mandich leads the team with 33 catches for 583 yards and five touchdowns. Mandich ranks sixth in the league at 72.9 receiving yards per game and is 10th at 4.1 catches per contest.

►Defensive players got into the act on offense during the seniors' final game in the Banta Bowl last Saturday. Senior linebacker Brandon Taylor (Johnsburg, Ill./Johnsburg) lined up in the backfield and ran six times for 36 yards. Senior safety Dan Taylor (Bridgeport, Calif./Lee Vining) played wide receiver and caught one pass for six yards.

►Brandon Taylor picked up a game-high 10 tackles against St. Norbert and leads the team with 78 tackles. Taylor ranks third in the Midwest Conference at 9.8 tackles per game.

►Sophomore defensive end Tony Harth (Madison, Wis./West) leads the team with 11.0 tackles for loss and

ranks sixth in the league at 1.38 TFLs per game. Harth has a total of 46 tackles on the season.

►Freshman cornerback Alic Riedel (Appleton, Wis./East) picked up a pass breakup against St. Norbert and leads the team with 10 passes defended. He ranks fourth in the conference at 1.25 passes defended per game. Riedel also has a team-best two interceptions.

►Lawrence is 12th in the conference in scoring defense at 34.0 points per game. Lawrence is eighth in the league in total defense at 375.0 yards per game.

Red Hawks Update

►Ripon picked up its first North Division victory with a 35-28 win at Beloit last Saturday. Despite turning the ball over five times, Ripon was able to post 337 rushing yards and 27 first downs. The Red Hawks led 21-7 at the half, but Beloit scored a pair of third-quarter touchdowns to trim the lead to 27-



21. Stephen Covalt's touchdown pass midway through the fourth quarter helped seal the victory. Beloit scored with 3:50 left, but Ripon recovered the on-sides kick and ran out the clock.

►Ripon ranks only fourth in the Midwest Conference in rushing offense at 222.2 yards per game. Ripon's run-first offense has been prolific on the ground in years past. The Red Hawks are last in the conference in pass offense at 118.1 yards per game.

►Quarterback Stephen Covalt triggers the offense for Ripon. He leads the team in rushing with 154 carries for 481 yards and seven touchdowns. Covalt is 49-of-109 passing for 628 yards, four touchdowns and seven interceptions.

►Running back Eric Hussin has 60 carries for 389 rushing yards and a team-best 6.1-yard average. Connor Greenwald has 60 carries for 324 yards.

►The top receiver for the Red Hawks is Nathan Silloway, who has 24 catches for 403 yards and one touchdown.

Hussin has a team-best three receiving touchdowns.

► Ripon is seventh in the conference in scoring offense at 20.0 points per contest. The Red Hawks are sixth in total offense at 340.4 yards per contest.

► The top tackler for Ripon is Austin Schliesner, who has 67 stops. Brandon Bartel leads the team with 8.0 TFLs and 4.0 sacks.

► Ripon ranks seventh in scoring defense at 27.9 points per game. The Red Hawks are ninth in total defense at 384.4 yard per contest.

Extra Points

► The trophy that Lawrence and Ripon play for, the Doehling-Heselton Memorial Trophy, commemorates the rivalry between Lawrence head coach Bernie Heselton and long-time Ripon mentor Carl Doehling. Heselton was the Vikings' head coach from 1938-64 and Doehling coached the Redmen (as they were then known) from 1924-55. Heselton had the edge on Doehling, compiling a 10-6-1 record against Ripon from 1938-55.

► The trophy was donated in 1988 by Barb Doehling Doran, a 1945 Ripon graduate and the daughter of Carl Doehling. Since its inception, Ripon holds a 21-5 edge in the rivalry.

► The rivalry was at its zenith in the 1950s, when raids on the other campus the night before the game were common. One favorite prank was to paint a blue "L" or red "R" on buildings on the opposing campus. That's when things got a little out of hand and the administration of both schools stepped in. The team began playing for a silver-plated trophy called "The Old Paint Bucket" at that time. No one seems to know how long that continued or what has become of the trophy. It remains missing to this day.

— The Lawrence University football team dug itself a big hole early, and Rockford University pulled away late for a 34-6 nonconference victory at Sam Greeley Field.



The Regents (1-0) surged to a 19-0 lead just 11 minutes into the game, and Rockford then put up a pair of touchdowns in a 16-second span in the fourth quarter to seal the win.

Lawrence quarterback Tanner Schuh played only the first half but ran for 99 yards and a touchdown and threw for 244 and two touchdowns as the Vikings (1-1) bolted a 28-0 lead at the half. Backup quarterback Chance Byrd completed 11 of 15 passes for 152 yards and two touchdowns and ran 11 times for 46 yards and a score.

Taylor Mandich grabbed seven passes for 181 yards and three touchdowns, including a 70-yard scoring pass in the first half. Dalton Sendelbach added 14 carries for 89 yards and a touchdown for the Vikings.
