#### The Series

The oldest college football rivalry in Wisconsin dates back to 1893, and Ripon holds a 61-46-7 advantage. Ripon won the first four games in the series, and Lawrence then dominated the rivalry through the mid-1920s. The Vikings went 15-5-1 from 1901-25. Lawrence also had the advantage in the series in the 1940s and 1950s, and the Vikings again dominated the series from the mid-1970s through the mid-1990s. Lawrence went 14-6-1 from 1974-94. The teams played the 100th game in 2000, and this is the 115th meeting.

#### **Last Meeting**

Ripon piled up more than 500 yards on the ground en route to a

47-7 Midwest Conference North Division win over Lawrence at Ingalls Field on Nov. 8, 2014.

Ripon ran the ball 62 times for 528 yards on the afternoon.

Connor Greenwald led the ground assault by running 13 times for 196 yards and two touchdowns for the Red Hawks. Ripon quarterback Stephen Covalt completed only 2-of-6 passes but one went 81 yards for a touchdown. He also threw a pair of interceptions.

Quarterback Chance Byrd completed 23-of-44 passes for 279 yards and three interceptions for Lawrence. Byrd also scored Lawrence's lone touchdown on a five-yard run.

Ripon broke the game open with three second-quarter touchdowns. The Red Hawks led 7-0 after the first quarter but got a 99-yard scoring drive to make it 14-0 and then hit on a pair of big plays. Greenwald had a 65-yard scoring run, and Covalt connected with Tom Sawyer on the 81-yard touchdown pass to give Ripon a 27-0 lead at the half.

Ripon added three more secondhalf touchdowns before Lawrence got on the board. The Vikings moved 73 yards in seven plays for a score late in the game. After connecting with Zack Schubert on a 27-yard pass to the Ripon five-yard line, Byrd ran it on the next play for the touchdown.

Trevor Spina caught seven passes for 72 yards for the Vikings, and Taylor Mandich grabbed six passes for 69 yards.

Safety Dan Taylor made 13 tackles, including 3.5 tackles for loss, to pace the Lawrence defense.

#### **Last Week**

St. Norbert used its strong running attack to post a 63-6 Midwest Conference North Division victory over Lawrence this past Saturday at Schneider Stadium.

The undefeated Green Knights rushed for 508 yards on the after-

noon. St. Norbert was led by Brandon Carter's 136 rushing yards, and Elijah Fort scored three touchdowns for the Green Knights.

All-purpose back Terrence Simon ran 11 times for 64 yards to pace Lawrence. Lawrence's two quarterbacks were limited to just 95 yards passing in the cold, wet conditions.

St. Norbert jumped out to a 21-0 lead after the first guarter, and Lawrence picked up a touchdown just before halftime.

The Vikings moved 75 yards in 10 plays on their scoring drive. Simon had an 11-yard run, and Dalton Sendelbach broke loose for 14 yards a few plays later to move into St. Norbert territory.

Quarterback Ryan Butterfield then hit Jacob Berman for 19 yards to the St. Norbert 18. On the next play, Butterfield connected with Sendelbach for 14 yards to the St. Norbert four. Berman ran it in for the score on the next play.

Lawrence trailed 46-6 at the half, and St. Norbert added a pair of second-half touchdowns and a field goal to round out the scoring.

#### **The Coaches**

Rob McCarthy (Concordia Moorhead 1989) is in his first season as Lawrence's head coach and has a record of 1-7. Ron Ernst (Nebraska Wesleyan Rob McCarthy



1980) is in his 25th

season at Ripon and has a record of 158-85 (.650).

#### **Vikings Update**

► The Vikings face their fourth consecutive run-heavy team this week in long-time rival Ripon. Carroll ran

County) have done an outstanding job Ryan Butterfield of taking care of the



football this season and last Saturday was no different. After Lawrence quarterbacks threw 19 interceptions in 2014, newcomers Butter-



field and Pittman Kemani Pittman have combined to

throw just four this season. That's one interception for every 44.8 attempts. The league average is one interception on every 28.6 attempts. Butterfield is 60-of-107 for 652 yards, seven touchdowns and one interception. Pittman is 40-of-72 for 360 yards and three interceptions.

Lawrence did not commit a turnover at St. Norbert last Saturday, and the Vikings rank second in the Midwest Conference in turnover margin at plus-8. Only St. Norbert is better at plus-14.

Sophomore receiver/back Terrence Simon (Viera, Fla./Melbourne Holy Trinity) has proven to be valuable both running and catching the ball and on special teams. He posted a season-best 85 rushing yards at Grinnell and followed that with season highs of five catches and 76 receiving yards vs. Carroll. Simon followed that with a stirring 44-yard punt return against Macalester. He had a season-high 11 carries for a team-best 64 rushing yards last week against St. Norbert. Simon now has 380 all-purpose yards over the last four games. Simon has 24 carries for 195 yards, an average of 8.1 yards per carry, and a touchdown on the season. He also has 10 catches for 99 yards and a touchdown.

The Lawrence offense ranks 10th in the Midwest Conference at 18.4 points per game. The Vikings are 11th in total offense at 245.8 yards per contest.

Sophomore cornerback Alic Riedel (Appleton, Wis./East) piled up a career-high 14 tackles against St. Nor-

The Vikings rank 11th in the conference in scoring defense at 36.9 points per game. Lawrence is 11th in total defense at 460.0 yards per game.

#### **Red Hawks Update**

▶ Ripon held on for a dramatic 14-12 win over Beloit last Saturday at Ingalls Field. The Bucs



scored with 1:15 left in the game, and Beloit went for the two-point conversion to tie the game. The Bucs were stopped just short of the goal line to preserve the win for the Red Hawks.

► Last Saturday's win moved Ripon coach Ron Ernst to within one victory of tying Cornell's Jerry Clark for the most coaching victories in conference history. Ernst has a record of 158-85 during his 25 seasons at Ripon. Clark went 159-85-1 during his 28 years at Cornell.

▶ Ripon's run-first attack is fourth in the Midwest Conference at 213.5 rushing yards per game. Senior back Connor Greenwald leads the Red Hawks in rushing with 131 carries for 569 yards, an average of 4.3 yards per carry.

▶Quarterback Stephen Covalt is 47of-115 passing for 573 yards, two touchdowns and seven interceptions. Covalt also has 100 carries for 193 yards and a team-high five TDs. Nathan Silloway is Covalt's favorite target and has 23 catches for 342 yards and a score.

▶ Ripon ranks ninth in the league in scoring offense at 18.8 points per game. The Red Hawks are 10th in total offense at 296.4 yards per contest.

Senior linebacker Austin Schleisner is Ripon's top tackler with 65 stops. He ranks 10th in the MWC in tackles. Senior defensive lineman Brandon Bartel is second in the conference with 10.5 TFLs. He ranks seventh with 3.5 sacks as part of his 43 total tackles.

▶ Ripon's defense is fifth in the conference at 20.2 points per game. Ripon is allowing 355.9 yard per game, which ranks fifth in the league.

#### **Extra Points**

► The trophy that Lawrence and Ripon play for, the Doehling-Heselton Memorial Trophy, commemorates the rivalry between Lawrence head coach Bernie Heselton and long-time Ripon mentor Carl Doehling. Heselton was the Vikings' head coach from 1938-64 and Doehling coached the Redmen (as they were then known) from 1924-55. Heselton had the edge on Doehling, compiling a 10-6-1 record against Ripon from 1938-55.

► The trophy was donated in 1988 by Barb Doehling Doran, a 1945 Ripon graduate and the daughter of Carl Doehling. Since its inception, Ripon holds a 22-5 edge in the rivalry.

The rivalry was at its zenith in the 1950s, when raids on the other cam-

pus the night before the game were common. One favorite prank was to paint a blue "L" or red "R" on buildings on the opposing campus. That's when things got a little out of hand and the administration of both schools stepped in. The team began playing for a silver-plated trophy called "The Old Paint Bucket" at that time. No one seems to know how long that contin ued or what has become of the trophy. It remains missing to this day.

► Lawrence vs. Ripon is one of 51 trophy games played at the NCAA Division III level and one of two games in the Midwest Conference. Knox and Monmouth have been playing for the Bronze Turkey since 1929, and they square off on Saturday as well.

# 2015 Game Recaps

## September 5 Rockford 52, Lawrence 17

A P P L E T O N , Wis. — The Rockford University football team used a powerful running



game to roll to a 52-17 nonconference victory over Lawrence University.

It was the first football game played on the renovated Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Chance Manning ran 32 times for 211 yards and three touchdowns for Rockford (1-0), and he caught two passes for 86 yards and a score. The Regents finished with 58 carries for 438 yards and rolled up 605 yards of offense.

Quarterback Adam O'Malley completed 7-of-13 passes for 167 yards and a touchdown. He also ran 10 times for 62 yards.

Lawrence (0-1) was limited to just 83 yards of offense, including just 25 through the air.

Rockford jumped out to a 21-0 lead after one quarter with a trio of big plays. Pete Berry broke free for a 65-yard scoring run, Manning added a 40-yard TD run and Manning caught a 53-yard touchdown pass.

Manning added two more touchdown runs in the second quarter, and the Regents led 35-0 at the half.

Sophomore Alic Riedel got Lawrence on the board with an 81-yard kickoff return for a touchdown.

It was Riedel's first collegiate touchdown.

Austin Tucker's 64-yard fumble return set up Lawrence's next score as the Vikings took over at the Rockford 16-yard line.

After an end around by Trevor Spina got the ball to the one-yard line, Spina punched it in from a yard out on the next play to cut the lead to 45-14.

The Vikings later added a 24-yard field goal from Pat O'Mahoney to complete their scoring.

# September 12 Lawrence 51, Maranatha 6

WATERTOWN, Wis. — The Lawrence University football team bolted to a 24-6 lead at



the half and rolled to 51-6 nonconference win over Maranatha Baptist University.

Three Vikings (1-1) scored their first career touchdowns, and rookie Lawrence head coach Rob McCarthy picked up his first career victory.

Cam Boerm caught a pair of touchdown passes and Jacob Berman ran for a pair of scores for Lawrence. Senior running back Corey Fisher also got his first career touchdown for the Vikings.

Lawrence freshman quarterback Ryan Butterfield tossed his first two career touchdown passes and finished 6-for-11 passing for 92 yards. He also ran three times for 22 yards. Boerm finished with five catches for 61 yards, and Berman ran eight times for 88 yards and two scores.

Lawrence's other freshman quarterback, Kemani Pittman, also was 8-for-13 and finished with 54 yards passing.

The Vikings, who finished with 420 yards of offense, limited Maranatha (0-2) to just 236 yards, including just 28 on the ground.

Junior linebacker Jacob Lueck had a team-high 10 tackles for Lawrence and that included 2.0 tackles for loss. Lueck also forced two fumbles and recovered a fumbles. Maranatha fumbled five times on the afternoon and lost all five to the Vikings. Lawrence also intercepted three passes as Hunter Adams, Wes Hetcher and Nick Ulloa all recorded picks.

Lawrence's defense was in the backfield all afternoon as the Vikings picked up seven sacks, including 2.5 by Colt Duncan and 2.0 by Jake Gostisha.

The Vikings took advantage of a short field on its first two scoring

drives to jump out to a 13-0 lead. Fisher scored on a two-yard run, and Trevor Spina scored from a yard out.

After a Maranatha touchdown cut the lead to 13-6, Lawrence scored twice in the final 2:41 of the first half. Boerm caught a 25-yard touchdown pass, and Pat O'Mahoney kicked a 27-yard field goal to give Lawrence a 24-6 lead at the half.

Dalton Sendelbach had a six-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, and Berman then scored on runs of 39 and 10 yards early in the fourth quarter. The Vikings added a late touchdown by Boerm to finish the scoring.

## September 19 Beloit 49, Lawrence 34

BELOIT, Wis. — The Beloit College football team ran out to a big early lead and went on



to a 49-34 Midwest Conference North Division victory over Lawrence University.

Mason Dixon ran 19 times for 218 yards and three touchdowns, including a 77-yard scamper, to lead Beloit (2-1, 1-0 MWC). Beloit quarterback Danny May was 13-of-19 passing for 233 yards and four touchdowns.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield was 12-of-17 for 140 yards and three touchdowns. He also ran five times for 54 yards.

Trevor Spina caught seven passes for 94 yards, and Jacob Berman had six catches for 88 yards. Spina, Berman and Cam Boerm all caught touchdown passes for the Vikings.

The Bucs scored three times in the first 8:43 to rush out to a 21-0 lead. Lawrence (1-2, 0-1) got on the board on Donnel Haley's two-yard touchdown run in the second quarter but trailed 42-7 at the half.

The Vikings trailed 49-7 before putting up 27 points in the final quarter.

Corey Fisher had a nine-yard scoring run, and Butterfield then threw

## September 26 Knox 20, Lawrence 6

APPLETON, Wis. -- A big play jump-started the Knox College offense and a long



scoring drive sealed the Prairie Fire's 20-6 non-conference win over Lawrence University at Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Knox (2-1) got a 79-yard run on the second play of third quarter to set up its first touchdown, and the Prairie Fire went on a drive that ate up 7:10 of the fourth quarter to grab a twotouchdown lead.

Nick Edlund ran 20 times for 156 yards, and Jared Zanger scored all three touchdowns for Knox.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield was 7-for-14 for 80 yards and ran seven times for 35 yards. Quarterback Kemani Pittman, who splits time with Butterfield, was 7-of-12 passing for 55 yards.

The game was scoreless at the half after Knox dodged a bullet early in the game. Lawrence (1-3) took the opening kickoff and drove right down the field. Butterfield had nine-yard touchdown run called back on a penalty, and Lawrence later faced fourthand-2 at the Knox three-yard line. Butterfield's pass just missed Trevor Spina at the goal line and Knox took over on downs.

Knox took the opening kickoff of the second half, and Edlund broke free for a 79-yard run on the second play. He was pushed out of bounds at the Lawrence one-yard line, and Zanger scored on the next play for a 7-0 lead.

The Prairie Fire took over after a punt later in the third quarter at the Lawrence 42. Aided by a personal foul penalty, Knox moved to the Lawrence 12, and Zanger ran it in from there for a 13-0 edge.

Lawrence got on the board with a nice scoring drive early in the fourth quarter. Lawrence looked like it had been stopped when it faced fourthand-6 at the Knox 34, but Butterfield faked a punt and raced 22 yards to the Knox 12. The Vikings then benefited from a pass interference penalty to get a first down at the two-yard line. Dalton Sendelbach barreled into the end zone on the next play to cut the lead to 13-6.

Knox took the next possession and moved 79 yards in 12 plays, eating up more than seven minutes in the process, to grab a 20-6 lead. Zander scored a two-yard run with 3:27 left to seal the victory.

## October 3 Grinnell 28, Lawrence 20

G R I N N E L L , lowa — The Lawrence University football team fell short with a sec-



ond-half rally at Grinnell College and dropped a 28-20 non-conference decision to the Pioneers at Rosenbloom Field.

Lawrence (1-4) trailed 28-14 at the half but held the Pioneers scoreless after the break. The Vikings got a pair of field goals from Pat O'Mahoney but couldn't reach the end zone in the second half.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield completed 13-of-25 passes for 117 yards, and ran 12 times for 68 yards. Freshman Terrence Simon ran five times for 85 yards and scored his first collegiate touchdown for the Vikings. Sophomore Donnel Haley added 61 yards on 14 carries for the Vikings.

Grinnell quarterback Sam Poulos was 17-of-26 for 183 yards and two touchdowns.

Grinnell (1-3) built a 21-7 lead with the help of touchdown passes of 67 and 19 yards by Poulos. Lawrence sliced the lead to 21-14 after Simon ripped off a 66-yard run with 3:05 left

in the second quarter.

Emmi Sandoval then returned the ensuing kickoff 94 yards for a touchdown to push Grinnell's lead to 28-14 at the half. Lawrence had not allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown since Lake Forest's Casey Urlacher did it back in 2001.

The Vikings trimmed the lead to 28-17 when O'Mahoney booted a 30-yard field goal with 6:54 left in the third quarter. The Vikings cut the ad-vantage to 28-20 when O'Mahoney connected on a 34-yard field with 5:08 remaining in the fourth quarter, but that's as close as Lawrence would get.

Lawrence won the statistical battle as the Vikings out-gained Grinnell 351-301. Lawrence piled up 210 yards on the ground and averaged 5.0 yards per carry.

# October 17 Carroll 42, Lawrence 6

A P P L E T O N , Wis. — Kyle Burlingame tossed four touchdown passes and ran for two



more scores to lead the Carroll University football team to a 42-6 Midwest Conference North Division win over Lawrence University.

Burlingame's big game spoiled the rededication of Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl. The Carroll quarterback was 15-of-26 passing for 273 yards and four touchdowns. He also ran 11 times for 79 yards and scored on runs of 19 and four yards.

Kevin Jennings caught six passes for 147 yards and three touchdown for the Pioneers (3-3, 1-1 MWC North).

Lawrence's Terrence Simon had five carries for 29 yards, and he had three punt returns for 55 yards. Linebacker Jacob Lueck had a career-high 17 tackles for Lawrence, and Tony Harth and Dan Rothbauer recorded 11 stops apiece. Harth also had 2.0 sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss.

Beatty changed the tone of the game with his speed when he entered at the start of the second quarter. His first run went 73 yards for a touch-down and a 7-0 Macalester lead.

Lawrence was forced to punt on the ensuing possession, but the ball touched the Scots' Trey Johnson and Alic Riedel scooped it up for the Vikings. Butterfield hit Wes Hetcher with a 19-yard scoring pass on the next play to tie the game at 7-7.

Macalester went 78 yards in 12 plays on the next possession to take back the lead. Beatty ran the final five yards for the score and a 14-7 lead.

Simon had an electric 44-yard punt return early in the third quarter to put Lawrence in business at the Macalester 19-yard line. Macalester came up with a big stop on third down, and Pat O'Mahoney's 40-yard field goal was wide left.

The Scots then had scoring drives of eight and seven plays, all runs, in the third quarter. Beatty scored from three yards out and Stowell had a one-yard plunge and Macalester led 28-7 after three quarters.

The Scots added a fourth-quarter touchdown on Stowell's 22-yard run after Macalester got a short field when a Lawrence fake punt attempt failed.

#### St. Norbert 63, Lawrence 6

DE PERE, Wis. — The St. Norbert College football team used its strong running



attack to post a 63-6 Midwest Conference North Division victory over Lawrence University at Schneider Stadium.

The undefeated Green Knights (8-0, 4-0 MWC North) rushed for 508

yards on the afternoon. St. Norbert was led by Brandon Carter's 136 rushing yards, and Elijah Fort scored three touchdowns for the Green Knights.

All-purpose back Terrence Simon ran 11 times for 64 yards to pace Lawrence (1-7, 0-4). Lawrence's two quarterbacks were limited to just 95 yards passing in the cold, wet conditions.

St. Norbert jumped out to a 21-0 lead after the first quarter, and Lawrence picked up a touchdown just before halftime.

Quarterback Ryan Butterfield then hit Jacob Berman for 19 yards to the St. Norbert 18. On the next play, Butterfield connected with Sendelbach for 14 yards to the St. Norbert four. Berman ran it in for the score on the next play.

Lawrence trailed 46-6 at the half, and St. Norbert added a pair of second-half touchdowns and a field goal to round out the scoring.
