The Series

This is the second meeting with Rockford, which won the initial game in the series 34-6 in 2014. This is the Regents' first trip to Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Last Meeting

Lawrence dug itself a big hole early on Sept. 6, 2014, and Rockford pulled away late for a 34-6 nonconference victory at Sam Greeley Field.

The Regents surged to a 19-0 lead just 11 minutes into the game, and Rockford then put up a pair of touchdowns in a 16-second span in the fourth quarter to seal the win.

Quarterback Andrew Stochl and receiver Milton Phillips did most of the damage for the Regents. Stochl

completed 17-of-27 passes for 291 yards and three touchdowns. Phillips caught five passes for 127 yards and a score.

Lawrence struggled on offense and had just 234 total yards. Rockford rolled up 448 yards of offense.

After two touchdown passes from Stochl and a scoring run from Pete Berry put the Regents up early, Lawrence cut the deficit to 19-6. Freshman Alic Alic Riedel Riedel blocked Cody



Casazza's punt to give Lawrence the ball at the Rockford 21-yard line. Lawrence scored eight plays later on Tanner Schuh's two-yard run.

Lawrence was driving again in the final minutes of the first half, but Schuh was intercepted in the Rockford end zone to end the threat.

The score remained the same until Rockford drove 73 yards in eight plays

midway through the fourth quarter. Stochl hit Dane Kirk with a 22-yard scoring pass for a 27-6 lead with 8:59

On the next play from scrimmage, Pascal Sylla intercepted Lawrence backup quarterback Chance Byrd and returned it 31 yards for a touchdown and a 34-6 lead.

Schuh finished 10-of-29 passing for 103 yards. Byrd was 6-for-16 passing for 68 yards and two interceptions. Byrd led the team with seven carries for 34 yards, and Dan Rothbauer, Taylor Mandich and Tyler Lueck all had four catches apiece for the Vikings.

Last Week

Grinnell scored the game's first 35 points and went on to a 52-14 victory over Lawrence in the ninth-place game on Midwest Conference championship weekend on Nov. 15, 2014.

Grinnell quarterback Sam Poulos completed 12-of-16 passes for 214

yards and five touchdowns to pace the Pioneers. Grinnell's Jacob Meixler caught four passes, all for touchdowns, for 107 yards.

Lawrence quarterback Chance Byrd completed 21-of-42 passes for 244 yards and a touchdown. Starting linebacker Brandon Taylor did double duty as he played running back and carried the ball 15 times for 68 yards and a touchdown for the Vikings.

Taylor also paced the Lawrence defense by making 12 tackles and recording a sack. Nick Ulloa and Jacob Lueck both recorded interceptions for the Vikings.

Grinnell scored five touchdowns on its first seven possessions of the game en route to building a 35-7 lead at the half. Meixler caught touchdown passes of 32, seven and 33 yards in the first half. He added a 35-yard scoring pass in the third quarter.

Lawrence got on the board when the Vikings moved 67 yards in 11 plays in the second quarter. Byrd capped the drive with a 10-yard touchdown pass to Trevor Spina, who caught six passes for 57 yards on the day.

The Vikings also scored the game's final touchdown when Taylor recorded his first career score. Byrd's 31-yard completion to Taylor Mandich gave Lawrence a first down at the Grinnell four-yard line, and Taylor ran it on the next play for the touchdown.

Grinnell finishes in ninth place in the standings, and Lawrence is 10th in the 12-team league. Macalester College won the title with a 30-27 victory over Illinois College.

The Coaches

Rob McCarthy (Concordia Moorhead 1989) is in his first season as Lawrence's head coach. Jim Schroeder (Valparaiso 2001) is in his first season as the Rob McCarthy head coach at Rockford.

Vikings Update

Lawrence embarks on a new era with the debut of head coach Rob McCarthy. McCar-



thy was hired in January to replace interim head coach Chris Harris, who guided the Vikings through the final nine games of the 2014 season. McCarthy was hired in January after serving for more than a decade coaching in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. He spent the bulk of that time, 12 seasons, on the staff that oversaw the resurgence of the St. Olaf football program. While at St. Olaf, McCarthy was part of a coaching staff that put together the best 12-year record in school history with a 73-47

mark. McCarthy was responsible for bringing a number of stellar players to St. Olaf, including one (Horace Gant Jr.) that went on to play in the NFL, a number of All-Americans and many All-West Region and first-team All-Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference picks.

Lawrence also begins a new era with the debut of Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl. The original Lawrence Bowl opened in 1965 and was renamed the Banta Bowl after the death of George Banta Jr., '10 in 1978. The stadium was updated with lights for the 2000 season, but is now in the midst of a \$4.5 million renovation project. The facility has undergone a huge facelift with new FieldTurf, bleachers, scoreboard and a building. The building is nearing completion but the rest of the facility is finished.

►The Vikings take on a new look offensively for 2015 with the installation of the "Fly" offense. The person triggering that attack will be new as rookie Kemani Pittman Kemani Pittman



(Covington, Ga./Rockdale County) has won the starting job.

►The Vikings do return a number of skill players on offense and get a boost from an influx of newcomers. The top two returning receivers are junior Trevor Spina Trevor Spina (Henderson, Nev./



Coronado) and sophomore Cole Erickson (Appleton, Wis./North). Spina caught 37 passes for 425 yards and three touchdowns in 2014, and Erickson grabbed 28 passes for 372 yards and three scores.

Senior Dalton Sendelbach (Evansville, Wis./Evansville) was the top

ground gainer last season with 102 carries for 305 yards and one TD. Sophomore Donnel Haley (Chicago, III./Loyola) also returns to start in the backfield.

Lawrence finished 12th in the Midwest Conference in scoring offense at 13.5 points per game in 2014. Lawrence ranked 10th in total offense at 294.1 yards per game.

Lawrence has been playing a 4-2-5 defense since 2005, but that will change this season as the Vikings move to multiple defensive looks.

►The Vikings return some key players on defense at all levels with Brady Busha (Weston, Wis./Schofield D.C. Everest) at nose guard, Jacob Lueck (Glen Ellyn, III./ Nick Ulloa Glenbard East) and



Colt Duncan (Columbia, Tenn./Zion Christian) at linebacker and Nick Ulloa (Burlington, Wis./Catholic Central),

Alic Riedel (Appleton, Wis./East) and Carl Olsen (Bishop, Calif./Union) in the secondary.

▶Duncan is the leading returning tackler with 56, including 7.5 TFLs. Lueck had 43 stops and an interception a season ago. Ulloa and Riedel led the team with Colt Duncan three interceptions apiece in 2014.



- ► The Vikings will be looking for big things from a pair of former offensive players. A pair of wide receivers, Dan Rothbauer (Appleton, Wis./North) and Wes Hetcher (Wautoma, Wis./Wautoma) are now starters on the other side of the ball. Rothbauer is starting at linebacker and Hetcher is at safety.
- Lawrence was 12th in the conference in scoring defense at 37.1 points per game in 2014. Lawrence was 12th in the league in total defense at 421.7 yards per game.

Regents Update

▶ Rockford is in the same situation as the Vikings with a new head coach entering the 2015



campaign. Jim Schroeder is in his first season at Rockford and replaced Vic Wallace, who led the Regents for four seasons. Schroeder is a defensive-minded coach who came to Rockford from Benedictine (III.). He was the defensive coordinator during his 10 seasons at Benedictine.

- ▶The Regents have a pair of stars returning on defense. Defensive lineman Tremaine Berry was a first-team All-Northern Athletics Collegiate Conference selection a season ago after piling up 11.5 TFLs and 3.5 sacks. He was named a preseason first-team All-American by USA College Football. In the secondary, cornerback Reggie Haynes was a second-team All-NACC selection in 2014 after picking off four passes and picking up nine pass breakups. He also was named a preseason All-American by USA College Football.
- ▶The Regents also bring back line-backer Michael Krieter, who made 49 tackles and picked off a pair of passes a season ago.
- ▶On the offensive side of the ball, Rockford also has a new signal-caller in freshman Adam O'Malley. Some of the weapons available for O'Malley are running back Pete Berry and wide receiver Joe Breeden. Berry ran 89 times for 391 yard and seven touchdowns a season and caught five passes for 43 yards. Breeden made 20 catches for 325 yards a score a season ago.
- ▶ Rockford was picked for sixth in the seven-team NACC preseason poll. Benedictine was chosen as the favorite to win the league.
