The Series

In a series that dates back to 1934, Monmouth holds a 29-25 lead in the series. The Scots have won the last 13 games in the series, and the last Lawrence win was a 19-13 triumph back in 1999.

Last Meeting

Monmouth exploded for 28 points in the second quarter and went on to a 56-28 Midwest Conference victory over Lawrence on Oct. 20, 2012, in the Banta Bowl.

The Scots got a big day on the ground from running back Trey Yocum, who ran 29 times for 176 yards and four touchdowns. Quarterback Brik Wedekind was 12 of 14 passing for 156 yards and two touchdowns.

Wide receiver Tyler Mazur had a huge day for Lawrence with nine catches for 225 yards and three touchdowns. Quarterback Luke Barthelmess was 16 of 32 passing for 282 yards and three touchdowns. Barthelmess moved past Eric Aspenson (4,941) for second place on Lawrence's career passing list and now has 5,145 passing yards.

The game was tied 7-7 after Mazur caught a 17-yard touchdown pass from Barthelmess with 3:36 left in the first quarter.

Wedekind then hit C.J. Shields with a 37-yard scoring pass on the first play of the second quarter for a 14-7 lead. The Scots quickly made it 21-7 on Wedekind's six-yard scoring pass to Garrett Youngren with 8:50 left in the second quarter. Yocum then tacked on another score with a two-yard touchdown run with 4:14 left in the half.

An interception gave Monmouth another chance before the end of the first half, and Yocum capped a 36-yard drive with a five-yard touchdown run for a 35-7 lead at the break.

The teams then traded scores in the second half. After Monmouth opened the half with a touchdown drive, Ben Hartman returned the kickoff 46 yards to the Monmouth 44-yard line. The Vikings scored six plays later on Barthelmess' four-yard run to cut the lead to 42-14.

After another short Yocum touchdown run, Mazur caught a pair of 62-yard scoring passes. He grabbed one near the end of the third quarter and completed Lawrence's scoring with another one with 4:20 left in the game.

Linebacker Jon Hope paced the Lawrence defense with 14 tackles, and Sam Ausloos added 11.

Last Week

St. Norbert used a solid defensive effort in the second half to hang on for a 17-6 victory over Lawrence last Saturday at the Banta Bowl.

In a scheduling quirk, the game

counted as a Midwest Conference game for the Green Knights, but it was a nonconference game for Lawrence.

St. Norbert limited Lawrence to only 88 yards of offense in the second half, and the Green Knights got a late field goal to seal the victory.

Zach Broberg ran 19 times for 86 yards to pace the Green Knights. Quarterback James Tringali was 13 of 27 passing for 177 yards, one touchdown and one interception. Brian Fliess caught six passes for 103 yards and a touchdown for St. Norbert.

Lawrence quarterback Luke Barthelmess completed 16 of 26 passes for 190 yards for the Vikings. Dan Dubnicka had game highs with seven catches for 110 yards for Lawrence.

Sam Wagner was impressive on defense for the Vikings, who limited St. Norbert to 319 yards. Wagner had a game-high 14 tackles, including one sack and 4.0 tackles for loss. Dan Taylor picked up 10 tackles for Lawrence, and Trevor Spina recorded his first career interception.

Lawrence got on the board in the second quarter by taking advantage of a short punt. The 23-yard punt gave Lawrence the ball at the St. Norbert 41-yard line, and the Vikings got a key pass completion to Dubnicka at the St. Norbert 18. Sam Wagner then hauled in a pass at the St. Norbert one-yard line, and Dalton Sendelbach punched it in the end zone on the next play for a 6-0 lead.

St. Norbert answered two possessions later when Tringali hit Fliess with a 41-yard scoring pass, and the Green Knights led 7-6 at the half.

The Green Knights took the opening possession of the second half and moved 57 yards in eight plays for a touchdown. Broberg ran it in from three yards out, and St. Norbert led 14-6.

Lawrence only managed to get into St. Norbert territory twice in the second half, and the Green Knights added a 30-yard field goal from Randy Hill with 2:22 left to seal the victory.

Vikings Update

► Lawrence played a strong first half against conference leading St. Norbert



this past Saturday, but had trouble in the second half. The Green Knights limited Lawrence to only 88 yards of offense in the second half to hold off the Vikinas.

- ▶One of the reasons Lawrence was able to hang tough against St. Norbert was the job the Lawrence defense did on third down. Lawrence limited St. Norbert to only 4 of 13 on third-down conversions. The Vikings rank fourth in the Midwest Conference in opponent third-down conversions at 34.8 percent. Lawrence first in the league in stopping teams on fourth down at just 14.3 percent (1-for-7).
- ▶ For the sixth consecutive game this season, Lawrence held the advantage in time of possession. The Vikings had the ball for 32:00 against St. Norbert. Lawrence leads the Midwest Conference in time of possession at 36:36.
- ► Senior defensive back Sam Wagner (Salem, Wis./Burlington Catholic Central) had a career game against the Green Knights. Wagner recorded a career- Sam Wagner high 14 tackles and



a career-high 4.0 tackles for loss. Wagner, who had never had more than 1.0 TFLs in a game, ecliped his previous career high of 13 tackles, which he set vs. Carroll in 2010. Wagner leads the team with 44 tackles on the season.

- ► Senior linebacker Andy Paider (Denmark, Wis./Denmark) picked up 1.5 TFLs against St. Norbert and now has 32.5 for his career. That puts him alone in fourth place on Lawrence's career list and he is just 1.0 TFLs from tying Jack Peters for third place. Paider leads the team and is second in the conference with 14.5 TFLs this season.
- ▶ Junior defensive back Dan Taylor (Bridgeport, Calif./Lee Vining) posted double digits in tackles for the second consecutive week. Taylor, who

had career-high 12 tackles against Carroll two weeks ago, picked up 10 tackles, including seven solo, against St. Norbert. He ranks fifth on the team with 35 tackles. Dan Taylor



- ▶Two of Lawrence's offensive standouts did double duty last Saturday against St. Norbert. Right tackle Luke Zablocki (Pulaski, Wis./Pulaski) also saw action at defensive tackle and wide receiver Trevor Spina (Henderon, Nev./Coronado) played multiple series at defensive back. Spina recorded his first career interception in the fourth quarter.
- The Vikings rank ninth in the league in both total defense and scoring defense. The Vikings are allowing 374.0 yards per game and 31.1 points per contest.
- ►Senior quarterback Luke Barthelmess (Appleton, Wis./Principia) could shoot past a number of players on the Midwest Conference ca-

reer passing list this week. After completing 16 of 26 passes for 190 yards against Norbert, Barthelmess now has 7,150 career passing vards and ranks 10th Luke Barthelmess in conference his-



tory. Barthelmess is just 32 yards away from passing for St. Norbert star Cody Craig (7,181). He also is closing in on former St. Norbert quarterback Ryan Hartman (7,218) and former Ripon star Paul Brandenburg (7,320).

- ▶ Barthelmess is the only player in the league who ranks in the top 10 in both rushing and passing. Barthelmess is fifth in the conference at 182.2 passing yards per game and seventh in the league at 79.2 rushing yards per contest.
- ►Senior wide receiver Dan Dubnicka (Slinger, Wis./ Slinger) had a careerhigh seven catches against St. Norbert Dan Dubnicka

and picked up his first 100-yard receiving game of the season with 110 yards. Dubnicka leads the team with 22 catches for 321 yards this season.

Lawrence ranks fifth in the Midwest Conference in total offense at 350.4 yards per game. The Vikings are 11th in scoring offense at 13.6 points.

Fighting Scots Update

► Monmouth is looking to bounce back from a tough 17-14 loss at Lake Forest last Satur-



day. The Scots played from behind for the entire game and trimmed the lead to just three points with a touchdown in the final minute. Lake Forest recovered the ensuing on-sides kick to seal the victory.

- ▶The Monmouth offense is powered by running back Trey Yocum, who was held to just 42 yards on 18 carries against Lake Forest. Yocum ranks third in the Midwest Conference at 129.3 rushing yards per game. He has 146 carries for 776 yards and eight touchdowns this season. Yocum is averaging a healthy 5.3 yards per carry.
- ▶ Quarterback Brik Wedekind is third in the league in passing at 202.7 yards per game. Wedekind is 93 of 164 passing for 1,216 yards, 12 touchdowns and seven interceptions.
- ▶The top receiver for the Scots is senior Austin Peterson. He has 33 catches for 452 yards and six touchdowns. He ranks first in the league at 75.3 receiving yards per game and is third at 5.5 catches per contest.
- ► The Scots rank third in the league in both scoring offense and total offense. Monmouth is scoring 32.3

- Linebacker Bryan Mesik far and away leads the team with 47 tackles this season. He also has 1.5 TFLs. Defensive lineman Jack Porter is second on the team with 31 tackles, but he leads the team in both TFLs with 7.0 and sacks with 2.0.
- ► Monmouth is fourth in the league in scoring defense, allowing only 17.0 points per game. The Scots are seventh in total defense at 360.0 yards per game.

September 7 Cornell 45, Lawrence 14

MOUNT VER-NON, Iowa — The Cornell College football team scored on its first



five possessions and went on to a 45-14 Midwest Conference win over Lawrence University at Ash Park.

Cornell quarterback Juan Flores had a big day as he completed 21 of 27 passes for 275 yards and three touchdowns.

Lawrence quarterback Luke Barthelmess was only 18 of 41 passing for 155 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions. Barthelmess also ran 20 times for 117 yards and a touchdown.

Cornell (1-0, 1-0 MWC) forced a punt on Lawrence's opening possession of the game and moved 56 yards in only three plays for the first touchdown of the game. Flores hit Justin Cox with a 23-yard scoring pass for a 7-0 lead. After another Lawrence punt, Cornell moved 53 yards in six plays, with Flores connecting with Brit Connor from 18 yards out, for a 14-0 lead.

Myron Seabrook then intercepted Barthelmess on the next possession and ran it back 22 yards for a touchdown and a 21-0 lead. After a Lawrence drive stalled at the Cornell 38-yard line, the Vikings punted. Cornell drove 75 yards in seven plays for another touchdown and a 28-0 lead.

Lawrence (0-1, 0-1) got its first score of the game when Barthelmess hit Taylor Mandich from six yards out for a touchdown. The drive covered 88 yards and took 12 plays and trimmed the lead to 31-7 with 3:59 left in the first half. Mandich finished the day with four catches for 34 yards.

The Vikings picked up their other touchdown early in the fourth quarter after a 12-play, 61-yard drive. Barthelmess ran it from four yards out to cut Cornell's lead to 45-14.

Linebacker Brandon Taylor led Lawrence's defense with 10 tackles.

Jeremy Demlow had 14 tackles, including 3.5 tackles for loss, to pace the Rams.

The Vikings acutally had one more first down (22-21) and ran 33 more offensive plays than the Rams. Lawrence enjoyed a huge edge in time of possession (37:04-22:56).

September 14 Lake Forest 14, Lawrence 13

APPLETON, Wis. — The Lake Forest College football team blocked two fields in the



final three minutes, including one on the last play of the game, to hang on for a 14-13 Midwest Conference win over Lawrence University in the Banta Bowl.

The Foresters (2-0, 1-0 MWC) also blocked an extra point that proved to be the winning margin.

Lawrence trailed by a point when it took over at its own 36-yard line with 9:51 left. The Vikings took 13 plays to move all the way to the Lake Forest two-yard line before being stopped. Freshman Patrick O'Mahoney lined up for a 19-yard field goal, and the kick was blocked. The ball went out of the end zone and Lake Forest took over at its own 20 with 2:41 left.

Lawrence (0-2, 0-2) was out of timeouts, but the Foresters failed to pick up a first down. Lake Forest did the Vikings a favor by throwing an incomplete pass on third down to stop the clock. Lake Forest punted, and Lawrence got the ball back at its own 23 with 47 seconds left.

Lawrence quarterback Luke Barthelmess hit Sam Wagner with a 32-yard completion on the first play to move the ball to the Lake Forest 45. Barthelmess then ripped off runs of 11 and 24 yards to move to to the Lake Forest 10-yard line.

After a pair of incompletions, the Vikings were called for offensive pass interference with six seconds left. O'Mahoney lined up for a 42-yard

field goal, but the kick was blocked again as time expired.

The teams went to halftime tied 21-21.

Running back Mason Dixon ran 12 times for 200 yards and three touchdowns to lead Beloit (1-2, 1-1 MWC), which snapped a 13-game losing streak. It was all or next-to-nothing for Dixon, who had runs of 56, 48, 42, 18 and 16 yards but had a combined 21 yards on his other seven carries.

Lawrence quarterback Luke Barthelmess went 22 of 40 for 230 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions. Barthelmess also posted his third 100-yard rushing game of the season with 24 carries for 117 yards.
