The Series

Macalester holds a 5-4-0 edge in a series that dates back to 1948. The Scots won the last meeting in 2007, but the teams have split the last four games in the series. One of the more interesting wins in the series for Lawrence was the 2001 "immaculate deflection" game. Trailing 10-6, Lawrence had a third-and-goal play at the Macalester 5-yard line with less than a minute left. Quarterback R.J. Rosenthal's third-down pass was slightly behind receiver Zach Michael. The ball deflected off Michael's shoulder pads and was caught in the back of the end zone by tight end Chris McGinley for a touchdown. Jason Holinbeck then intercepted a pass to stop Macalester's final drive and preserve Lawrence's

13-10 victory.

Last Meeting

Macalester pulled out a wild 37-30 nonconference win over Lawrence on Nov. 10, 2007, at Macalester Stadium.

Macalester got the game-winning touchdown with 10 seconds left in a game that featured three lead changes in the final 4:52.

Lawrence had built a 20-9 lead early in the third quarter on quarterback Eric Aspenson's 3-yard touchdown run. The Scots came back with two Jacob McDonnell touchdowns, one receiving and one rushing in the next five minutes to take a 23-20 lead.

The score remained that way until Craig Ebert's 5-yard touchdown run capped a seven-play drive and gave Lawrence a 27-23 edge.

McDonnell then caught a 44-yard touchdown pass on the ensuing possession to give Macalester a 30-27 lead with 3:19 remaining. The Vikings returned the kickoff to the 50 and

marched right down the field.

Ebert ran the ball five consecutive times to give Lawrence a second-and-3 at the Macalester 7. The Scots defense then stiffened, and the Vikings settled for a 24-yard Bryan Althouse field goal that tied the game at 30-30 with 1:20 left.

McDonnell did more damage, as he returned the kickoff to the Lawrence 20-yard line. Matt Mitchell then caught a 9-yard scoring pass from Trevor Mieke five plays later to give Macalester the win.

Ebert had a big day for the Vikings, as he ran 26 times for 150 yards and a touchdown. Derek Micke caught eight passes for 119 yards and two scores.

Last Week

Carroll pounded out 436 rushing yards en route to a 76-7 Midwest Conference North Division victory over Lawrence last Saturday at Schneider Stadium.

Lamont Williams ran eight times for 192 yards and three touchdowns to pace Carroll. Williams scored on runs of 50, 55 and 70 yards. Bennett Kothe added 102 yards on 11 carries for the Pioneers.

Carroll also picked up a special teams touchdown when Nick Curtis blocked a punt and Dan Verhagen returned it 32 yards for a score. The Pioneers also got a defensive touchdown on Ryan Klapper's 42-yard interception return.

Carroll quarterback Kyle Burlingame threw only nine passes, completing seven for 88 yards and a touchdown.

Lawrence's lone score came early in the fourth quarter when Taylor Mandich grabbed a 24-yard touchdown pass from Tanner Schuh.

Schuh completed 12-of-30 passes for 114 yards and one interception for the Vikings. Mandich caught five passes for 77 yards.

The Coaches

Chris Harris (Cumberlands 2000) is serving as Lawrence's interim head coach. Tony Jennison (UW-Eau Claire 1997) is in his seventh season at Macalester and has a record of 31-33 (.484).

Vikings Update

►The Vikings will be looking for a turnaround after a rough game at undefeated Carroll



last Saturday. Lawrence has struggled on the road this season and needs a great effort to beat a Macalester team that has just one defeat on its record this season.

►One of the strangest stats to come out of the loss to Carroll was the time of possession. Lawrence held the ball for 40:31, compared to just 19:29 for Carroll. The Vikings managed only

seven points despite running 84 plays from scrimmage.

►Lawrence ranks eighth in the Midwest Conference in time of possession at 29:13.

►The game against Carroll was the greatest time of possession for the Vikings since Lawrence had the ball for 41:58 in the 2013 game at Beloit.

►Lawrence has dipped to ninth in the Midwest Conference in scoring offense at 19.0 points per game. Lawrence ranks eighth in total offense at 310.8 yards per game.

►Starting quarterback Tanner Schuh (Appleton, Wis./North) returned to the lineup against Carroll after missing last week's win over Beloit. Schuh was injured on the second play from

scrimmage against Grinnell and then missed the following week. Schuh played the majority of the snaps against Carroll and was 12-for-30 for 114 yards with one touchdown and one interception. On the season, Schuh is 42-for-94 for 477 yards.

►Senior receiver Taylor Mandich (Green Bay, Wis./Southwest) continues to put together an impressive season. Mandich had five catches for 77 yards and a touchdown against Carroll. On the season, Mandich has 28 catches for 500 yards and five touchdowns. He ranks fourth in the league at 83.3 receiving yards per game and is sixth at 4.7 catches per game. Mandich is averaging an impressive 17.9 yards per catch.

►The Vikings were limited to only 107 yards rushing against Carroll and most came from freshman Donnel Haley (Chicago, Ill./Loyola). Haley hit season highs with 18 carries for 65 yards. On the season, Haley has 28 carries for 84 yards, an average of 3.0 yards per carry.

►Senior linebacker Brandon Taylor (Johnsburg, Ill./Johnsburg) had a game-high nine tackles against Carroll and leads the Vikings with 55 tackles. Taylor ranks seventh in the Midwest Conference at 9.2 tackles per game.

►Sophomore defensive end Tony Harth (Madison, Wis./West) keeps coming up with plays on the other side of the line of scrimmage. Harth had 3.5 tackles for loss among his four

tackles against Carroll. Harth leads the team at 11.0 TFLs and is third in the league at 1.83 TFLs per game. Harth's 11.0 TFLs is the seventh-highest season total in school history. He has a long way to go to match the school record of 18.5 set by Andy Paider in 2013.

►Freshman cornerback Alic Riedel (Appleton, Wis./East) picked up another pass breakup and leads the team seven pass breakups and nine passes defensed. Riedel ranks second in the league at 1.50 passes defensed per game. Riedel also is sixth on the team with 25 tackles.

►Lawrence's defensive numbers took a hit against Carroll. The Vikings are now 12th in the league in scoring defense at 32.8 points per game. Law-

rence is seventh in the league in total defense at 363.5 yards per game.

Scots Update

►The Scots rallied from an 11-point halftime deficit to post a 28-21 Midwest Conference North Division victory at Beloit last Saturday. Zandy Stowell powered the Macalester attack by running 28 times for 208 yards and a touchdown. Quarterback Samson Bialostok was 14-for-26 passing for 249 yards and two touchdowns. Bialostok also added 43 yards rushing. The Scots trailed 21-10 at the half, but Macalester scored 18 third-quarter points and held Beloit without a point in the second half.



►Macalester already has five wins on the season with four games to play. The Scots have not won more than six games in a season since 1986. Both of the six-win seasons have come under current head coach Tony Jennison.

►This is Macalester's first season as a member of the Midwest Conference

for football only. The Scots compete in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference in all other sports. The addition of Macalester allowed for the conference to be split into North and South divisions. That split could be short since Carroll is leaving the conference following the end of the 2015-16 academic year and the league will go back to having 11 football teams.

►Running back Zandy Stowell is leading the Midwest Conference in rushing. Stowell has 138 carries for 722 yards and five touchdowns. Stowell is averaging 120.3 yards per game and 5.2 yards per carry.

►Quarterback Samson Bialostok is a dual-threat and is the only player in the top 10 in the conference in both rushing and passing yards per game. Bialostok is fifth in the league at 163.2 passing yards per game. He has completed 76-of-155 passes for 979 yards, five touchdowns and four interceptions. He has 70 carries for 446 yards and seven touchdowns. Bialostok has seven rushing touchdowns and is averaging 6.4 yards per carry.

►The top receiver for the Scots is senior Ben Hillmann, who has 24 catches for 296 yards and one touchdown.

►The Scots are third in the Midwest Conference in total offense at 396.3 yards per game. Macalester is fifth in scoring offense at 23.5 points per contest.

►Macalester leads the league in rushing offense at 230.7 yards per game. Macalester has 280 rushing attempts on the season. Only run-happy Ripon has more (296).

►Macalester has been rock solid on defense and is second in the league in scoring defense at 15.7 points per game. The Scots are second in total defense at 277.0 yards per game.

►Macalester is tops in the conference in pass defense and allows only 139.8

►Senior Reid Callahan is tops on the team at 6.5 TFLs. Callahan also has a team-best 1.5 sacks.

►Jole Miller leads the team with six pass breakups, and eight different players have one interception apiece.

Rockford 34, Lawrence 6

— The Lawrence University football team dug itself a big hole early, and Rockford University pulled away late for a 34-6 nonconference victory at Sam Greeley Field.



The Regents (1-0) surged to a 19-0 lead just 11 minutes into the game, and Rockford then put up a pair of touchdowns in a 16-second span in the fourth quarter to seal the win.

Quarterback Andrew Stochl and receiver Milton Phillips did most of the damage for the Regents. Stochl completed 17-of-27 passes for 291 yards and three touchdowns. Phillips caught five passes for 127 yards and a score.

Lawrence (0-1) struggled on offense and had just 234 total yards. Rockford rolled up 448 yards of offense.

After two touchdown passes from Stochl and a scoring run from Pete Berry put the Regents up early, Lawrence cut the deficit to 19-6. Freshman Alic Riedel blocked Cody Casazza's punt to give Lawrence the ball at the Rockford 21-yard line. Lawrence scored eight plays later on Tanner Schuh's two-yard run.

On the next play from scrimmage, Pascal Sylla intercepted Lawrence backup quarterback Chance Byrd and returned it 31 yards for a touchdown and a 34-6 lead.

Schuh finished 10-of-29 passing for 103 yards. Byrd was 6-for-16 passing for 68 yards and two interceptions.

Byrd led the team with seven carries for 34 yards, and Dan Rothbauer, Taylor Mandich and Tyler Lueck all had four catches apiece for the Vikings.

September 13

Lawrence 59, Maranatha Baptist 0

— The Lawrence University football team routed Maranatha Baptist University 59-0 in a nonconference game at the Banta Bowl.



Lawrence quarterback Tanner Schuh played only the first half but ran for 99 yards and a touchdown and threw for 244 and two touchdowns as the Vikings (1-1) bolted a 28-0 lead at the half. Backup quarterback Chance Byrd completed 11 of 15 passes for 152 yards and two touchdowns and ran 11 times for 46 yards and a score.

Taylor Mandich grabbed seven passes for 181 yards and three touchdowns, including a 70-yard scoring pass in the first half. Dalton Sendelbach added 14 carries for 89 yards and a touchdown for the Vikings. Lawrence kicker Patrick O'Mahoney also tied the school record of Cody Robel and Kraig Krueger with eight extra points.

Sam Poulos tossed a pair of touchdown passes for the Pioneers, and Jacob Bernholtz ran 22 times for 102 yards and a touchdown. Lawrence quarterback Chance Byrd, who was forced into action after starter Tanner Schuh was hurt on the game's first drive, was 9-for-27 for 142 yards and a touchdown, but he threw four interceptions.

Byrd, a freshman quarterback making his first start, was 23-for-36 for 274 yards and three touchdowns. Mandich, a senior receiver from Green Bay, had a career-high eight catches for 130 yards and a touchdown for the Vikings (2-3, 1-0 MWC North).
