### **The Series**

Macalester holds a 6-4 edge in a series that was first played in 1948. The teams split the first two games in 1948 and 1949 and then didn't play again until 1990. Macalester has won the last two meetings, and the last victory for the Vikings was a 35-7 triumph in 2004.

Macalester scored 26 points in the first quarter and went on to a 33-0 Midwest Conference North Division win over Lawrence on Oct. 25, 2014.

The Scots posted two touchdowns in their first four plays from scrimmage to take control.

Ouarterback Samson Bialostok had two runs for 58 yards and a

touchdown, and he completed 4-of-6 passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns.

Lawrence quarterback Tanner Schuh was 9-for-17 for 154 yards, and Chance Byrd was 8-for-16 for 58 yards. Cole Erickson grabbed six passes for 111 yards for the Vikings.

On the second play from scrimmage, Bialostok ran 57 yards for a touchdown to give the Scots a 7-0 lead. After three plays and a punt, Macalester took over at its own 31-yard line. Two plays later, Bialostok hit Garrett Eichhorn with a 64-yard scoring pass for a 14-0 lead.

The Scots got a 31-yard field goal from Michael Abramson and a safety to go up 19-0. After the free kick, Bialostok completed a 25-yard touchdown pass to Ben Hillman three plays later to put the Scots up 26-0.

Macalester made it 33-0 on Ethan Carpenter's three-yard touchdown run late in the second quarter.

Lawrence had several good scor-

ing chances but couldn't punch it in. The Vikings were stopped on downs at the Macalester 21 in the second quarter, and the Scots stopped Lawrence four times from their oneyard line in the third quarter.

Kyle Burlingame tossed four touchdown passes and ran for two

for 147 yards and three touchdown for the Pioneers in the Fall Festival (ie, homecoming) game.

Quarterback Ryan Butterfield completed 6-of-7 passes for 96 yards a touchdown for the Vikings before leaving the game with an injury. Sophomore receiver Terrence Simon caught five passes for 76 yards and a touchdown for the Vikings.

Lawrence was limited to just 196 yards of offense while Carroll piled up 616 yards.

Jennings caught touchdown passes of 65 and 64 yards to stake Carroll to a 14-0 lead. Simon then caught a 56-yard scoring pass from Butterfield to trim the margin to 14-6 with 5:39 left in the opening half.

Burlingame then capped an 82yard drive with a 19-yard scoring run with just 42 seconds left in the first half, and the Pioneers led 21-6 at the half

The Pioneers took the opening drive of the second half, and Jennings capped a 61-yard drive with a fouryard touchdown catch for a 28-6 lead. Ryan Fuchs later caught another Burlingame touchdown pass, and Burlingame added a four-yard touchdown run to complete the scoring.

The big blemish on the night for Burlingame was a pair of interceptions. The Vikings stopped a pair of first-half drive with interceptions in their own end zone. Sophomores Alic Riedel and Carl Olsen both picked off passes for the Vikings. Olson and Jacob Lueck both recorded a gamehigh nine tackles for Lawrence.

## **The Coaches**

Rob McCarthy (Concordia Moorhead 1989) is in his first season as Lawrence's head coach and has a record of 1-5 (.167). Tony Jennison (UW-Eau Claire Rob McCarthy 1997) is in his eighth



season at Macalester and has a record of 38-37 (.507).

## **Vikings Update**

►The Vikings face the defending conference champions, and it marks the first time Macalester has been



to the Banta Bowl since the final week of the 2004 season. Lawrence posted a 35-7 win back in 2004, but the most entertaining game played between the teams was the 2001 matchup in the Banta Bowl. In the season opener, which the Lawrence Sports Information Office has dubbed the "immaculate deflection" game, the Vikings pulled out a dramatic win. The Vikings trailed 10-7 in the final minute and faced a third-and-goal from the Macalester five-yard line. Quarterback R.J. Rosenthal attempted to complete a quick slant pass to star receiver Zach Michael. The ball was a little behind Michael and deflected off his shoulder pad. It was caught by tight end Chris McGinley in the back of the end zone with 56 seconds left to give lawrence the win.

▶The Lawrence offense was limited to just 196 yards of total offense against Carroll, but the Vikings played without quarterback Butterfield Ryan Butterfield Ryan



(McDonough, Ga./ Strong Rock Christian) for much of the game after an injury. Butterfield had completed 6-of-7 passes for 96 yards and a touchdown before sitting out. On the season, Butterfield is 46of-80 for 541 yards, six touchdowns and one interception. Butterfield also leads the team in rushing with 34 carries for 207 yards, a 6.1-yard average.

- ► Sophomore receiver Terrence Simon (Viera, Fla./Melbourne Holy Trinity) followed up his first long touchdown run against Grinnell with his first long touchdown reception against Carroll. Simon caught a 56yard touchdown pass against the Pioneers and finished the game with a career-high five catches for a careerbest 76 receiving yards against the Pioneers.
- ►Lawrence's offense ranks eighth in the conference at 22.3 points per game. The Vikings are 10th in total offense at 269.7 yards per contest.
- ▶The Lawrence defense is ninth in the conference at 32.8 points per contest. The Vikings are 11th in total defense at 428.3 yards per contest.
- ►Turnovers helped keep the Vikings in the game early against Carroll.

Sophomore defensive backs Carl Olsen (Bishop, Calif./Bishop Union) and Alic Riedel (Appleton, Wis./East) both intercepted Carroll quarterback Kyle Burlingame in the Lawrence end zone in the first quarter. It was the first career interception for Olsen and the first of the season for Riedel. Olsen also recorded a career-high nine tackles.

► Sophomore defensive end Jake Gostisha (Appleton, Wis./ East) ranks seventh in the Midwest Conference with 49 tackles. He is averaging 8.2 tackles per game. Jake Gostisha Gostisha leads the



team and is tied for sixth in the league at 3.0 sacks. He leads the team and is tied for third in the conference at 7.5 TFLs per game.

► Junior linebacker Jacob Lueck (Glen Ellyn, Ill./Glenbard East) tied with Olsen with a team-best nine tackles against Carroll and now has 44 stops

on the season. Lueck has averaged 8.4 tackles per game over his last five games. He also has 1.0 sacks and 4.0 TFLs over that stretch.

### **Scots Update**

**►**Zandy Stowell scored four touchdowns and Macalester rolled up 300 rushing yards in a



28-14 victory over visiting Beloit last Saturday. Stowell scored on runs of 28, one, three and five yards. The Scots led 21-0 at the half and then scored a pair of fourth-quarter touchdowns to seal the victory.

► Senior running back Zandy Stowell ran 31 times for 196 yards in Macalester's win over Beloit. Stowell ranks third in the Midwest Conference at 79.8 rushing yards per game. He has 72 carries for 479 yards and is averaging an impressive 6.7 yards per carry.

- ► Macalester ranks fourth in the Midwest Conference at 201.5 rushing yards per game. On the flip side, the Scots ranks 11th in the league in passing offense at 117.8 yards per contest.
- ► Macalester is seventh in the conference in scoring offense at 22.8 points per game. The Scots are ninth in total offense at 319.3 yards per game.
- ▶ Benny Goldman and Christian Adams have split time at quarterback for Macalester this season. Goldman played last week against Beloit and is 32-of-48 passing for 221 yards this season. Adams is 28-of-75 for 465 yards and five touchdowns on the season.
- ▶The Scots have three receivers in double digits in catches this season. Tre Nowaczynski has 13 catches for 125 yards. Victor Bordo has 12 catches for a team-high 226 yards and two touchdowns. Sam Bordo has 11 catches for 162 yards and a pair of scores.
- ► Macalester is allowing only 20.5 points per game, and that ranks fourth in the Midwest Conference. The Scots are fourth in the league in total defense at 341.7 yards per contest.
- ▶Senior defensive lineman Zach Hauser leads the Scots with 47 tackles. He ranks 10th in the league at 7.8 tackles per game. Hauser also leads the team at 6.5 tackles for loss.
- Sophomore linebacker Elliot Tanin is tops on the team at 2.5 sacks. Tanin also leads the team with a pair of interceptions.
- ► Macalester ranks second in the league in pass defense, allowing only 184.5 yards per game.

## September 5 Rockford 52, Lawrence 17

APPLETON, Wis. — The Rockford University football team used a powerful running



game to roll to a 52-17 nonconference victory over Lawrence University.

It was the first football game played on the renovated Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Chance Manning ran 32 times for 211 yards and three touchdowns for Rockford (1-0), and he caught two passes for 86 yards and a score. The Regents finished with 58 carries for 438 yards and rolled up 605 yards of offense.

Quarterback Adam O'Malley completed 7-of-13 passes for 167 yards and a touchdown. He also ran 10 times for 62 yards.

Lawrence (0-1) was limited to just 83 yards of offense, including just 25 through the air.

Rockford jumped out to a 21-0 lead after one quarter with a trio of big plays. Pete Berry broke free for a 65-yard scoring run, Manning added a 40-yard TD run and Manning caught a 53-yard touchdown pass.

Manning added two more touchdown runs in the second quarter, and the Regents led 35-0 at the half.

Sophomore Alic Riedel got Lawrence on the board with an 81-yard kickoff return for a touchdown.

It was Riedel's first collegiate touchdown.

Austin Tucker's 64-yard fumble return set up Lawrence's next score as the Vikings took over at the Rockford 16-yard line.

After an end around by Trevor Spina got the ball to the one-yard line, Spina punched it in from a yard out on the next play to cut the lead to 45-14.

The Vikings later added a 24-yard field goal from Pat O'Mahoney to complete their scoring.

## September 12 Lawrence 51, Maranatha 6

WATERTOWN, Wis. — The Lawrence University football team bolted to a 24-6 lead at



the half and rolled to 51-6 nonconference win over Maranatha Baptist University.

Three Vikings (1-1) scored their first career touchdowns, and rookie Lawrence head coach Rob McCarthy picked up his first career victory.

Cam Boerm caught a pair of touchdown passes and Jacob Berman ran for a pair of scores for Lawrence. Senior running back Corey Fisher also got his first career touchdown for the Vikings.

Lawrence freshman quarterback Ryan Butterfield tossed his first two career touchdown passes and finished 6-for-11 passing for 92 yards. He also ran three times for 22 yards. Boerm finished with five catches for 61 yards, and Berman ran eight times for 88 yards and two scores.

Lawrence's other freshman quarterback, Kemani Pittman, also was 8-for-13 and finished with 54 yards passing.

The Vikings, who finished with 420 yards of offense, limited Maranatha (0-2) to just 236 yards, including just 28 on the ground.

Junior linebacker Jacob Lueck had a team-high 10 tackles for Lawrence and that included 2.0 tackles for loss. Lueck also forced two fumbles and recovered a fumbles. Maranatha fumbled five times on the afternoon and lost all five to the Vikings. Lawrence also intercepted three passes as Hunter Adams, Wes Hetcher and Nick Ulloa all recorded picks.

Lawrence's defense was in the backfield all afternoon as the Vikings picked up seven sacks, including 2.5 by Colt Duncan and 2.0 by Jake Gostisha.

The Vikings took advantage of a short field on its first two scoring

drives to jump out to a 13-0 lead. Fisher scored on a two-yard run, and Trevor Spina scored from a yard out.

After a Maranatha touchdown cut the lead to 13-6, Lawrence scored twice in the final 2:41 of the first half. Boerm caught a 25-yard touchdown pass, and Pat O'Mahoney kicked a 27-yard field goal to give Lawrence a 24-6 lead at the half.

Dalton Sendelbach had a six-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, and Berman then scored on runs of 39 and 10 yards early in the fourth quarter. The Vikings added a late touchdown by Boerm to finish the scoring.

## September 19 Beloit 49, Lawrence 34

BELOIT, Wis. — The Beloit College football team ran out to a big early lead and went on



to a 49-34 Midwest Conference North Division victory over Lawrence University.

Mason Dixon ran 19 times for 218 yards and three touchdowns, including a 77-yard scamper, to lead Beloit (2-1, 1-0 MWC). Beloit quarterback Danny May was 13-of-19 passing for 233 yards and four touchdowns.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield was 12-of-17 for 140 yards and three touchdowns. He also ran five times for 54 yards.

Trevor Spina caught seven passes for 94 yards, and Jacob Berman had six catches for 88 yards. Spina, Berman and Cam Boerm all caught touchdown passes for the Vikings.

The Bucs scored three times in the first 8:43 to rush out to a 21-0 lead. Lawrence (1-2, 0-1) got on the board on Donnel Haley's two-yard touchdown run in the second quarter but trailed 42-7 at the half.

The Vikings trailed 49-7 before putting up 27 points in the final quarter.

Corey Fisher had a nine-yard scoring run, and Butterfield then threw

## September 26 Knox 20, Lawrence 6

APPLETON, Wis. -- A big play jump-started the Knox College offense and a long



scoring drive sealed the Prairie Fire's 20-6 non-conference win over Lawrence University at Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Knox (2-1) got a 79-yard run on the second play of third quarter to set up its first touchdown, and the Prairie Fire went on a drive that ate up 7:10 of the fourth quarter to grab a twotouchdown lead.

Nick Edlund ran 20 times for 156 yards, and Jared Zanger scored all three touchdowns for Knox.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield was 7-for-14 for 80 yards and ran seven times for 35 yards. Quarterback Kemani Pittman, who splits time with Butterfield, was 7-of-12 passing for 55 yards.

The game was scoreless at the half after Knox dodged a bullet early in the game. Lawrence (1-3) took the opening kickoff and drove right down the field. Butterfield had nine-yard touchdown run called back on a penalty, and Lawrence later faced fourthand-2 at the Knox three-yard line. Butterfield's pass just missed Trevor Spina at the goal line and Knox took over on downs.

Knox took the opening kickoff of the second half, and Edlund broke free for a 79-yard run on the second play. He was pushed out of bounds at the Lawrence one-yard line, and Zanger scored on the next play for a 7-0 lead.

The Prairie Fire took over after a punt later in the third quarter at the Lawrence 42. Aided by a personal foul penalty, Knox moved to the Lawrence 12, and Zanger ran it in from there for a 13-0 edge.

Lawrence got on the board with a nice scoring drive early in the fourth quarter. Lawrence looked like it had been stopped when it faced fourth-and-6 at the Knox 34, but Butterfield faked a punt and raced 22 yards to the Knox 12. The Vikings then benefited from a pass interference penalty to get a first down at the two-yard line. Dalton Sendelbach barreled into the end zone on the next play to cut the lead to 13-6.

Knox took the next possession and moved 79 yards in 12 plays, eating up more than seven minutes in the process, to grab a 20-6 lead. Zander scored a two-yard run with 3:27 left to seal the victory.

## October 3 Grinnell 28, Lawrence 20

GRINNELL, lowa — The Lawrence University football team fell short with a sec-



ond-half rally at Grinnell College and dropped a 28-20 non-conference decision to the Pioneers at Rosenbloom Field.

Lawrence (1-4) trailed 28-14 at the half but held the Pioneers scoreless after the break. The Vikings got a pair of field goals from Pat O'Mahoney but couldn't reach the end zone in the second half.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield completed 13-of-25 passes for 117 yards, and ran 12 times for 68 yards. Freshman Terrence Simon ran five times for 85 yards and scored his first collegiate touchdown for the Vikings. Sophomore Donnel Haley added 61 yards on 14 carries for the Vikings.

Grinnell quarterback Sam Poulos was 17-of-26 for 183 yards and two touchdowns.

Grinnell (1-3) built a 21-7 lead with the help of touchdown passes of 67 and 19 yards by Poulos. Lawrence sliced the lead to 21-14 after Simon ripped off a 66-yard run with 3:05 left

in the second quarter.

Emmi Sandoval then returned the ensuing kickoff 94 yards for a touchdown to push Grinnell's lead to 28-14 at the half. Lawrence had not allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown since Lake Forest's Casey Urlacher did it back in 2001.

The Vikings trimmed the lead to 28-17 when O'Mahoney booted a 30-yard field goal with 6:54 left in the third quarter. The Vikings cut the advantage to 28-20 when O'Mahoney connected on a 34-yard field with 5:08 remaining in the fourth quarter, but that's as close as Lawrence would get.

Lawrence won the statistical battle as the Vikings out-gained Grinnell 351-301. Lawrence piled up 210 yards on the ground and averaged 5.0 yards per carry.

## October 17 Carroll 42, Lawrence 6

APPLETON, Wis. — Kyle Burlingame tossed four touchdown passes and ran for two



more scores to lead the Carroll University football team to a 42-6 Midwest Conference North Division win over Lawrence University.

Burlingame's big game spoiled the rededication of Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl. The Carroll quarterback was 15-of-26 passing for 273 yards and four touchdowns. He also ran 11 times for 79 yards and scored on runs of 19 and four yards.

Kevin Jennings caught six passes for 147 yards and three touchdown for the Pioneers (3-3, 1-1 MWC North).

Quarterback Ryan Butterfield completed 6-of-7 passes for 96 yards a touchdown for the Vikings (1-5, 0-2) before leaving the game with an injury. Sophomore receiver Terrence Simon caught five passes for 76 yards and a touchdown for the Vikings.

Lawrence was limited to just 196 yards of offense while Carroll piled up

616 yards.

Jennings caught touchdown passes of 65 and 64 yards to stake Carroll to a 14-0 lead. Simon then caught a 56-yard scoring pass from Butterfield to trim the margin to 14-6 with 5:39 left in the opening half.

Burlingame then capped an 82-yard drive with a 19-yard scoring run with just 42 seconds left in the first half, and the Pioneers led 21-6 at the half.

The Pioneers took the opening drive of the second half, and Jennings capped a 61-yard drive with a four-yard touchdown catch for a 28-6 lead. Ryan Fuchs later caught another Burlingame touchdown pass, and Burlingame added a four-yard touchdown run to complete the scoring.
