## **The Series**

In a series that dates back to 1908, Carroll holds a 33-26-4 advantage. Carroll has won the last seven meetings with the Vikings. Lawrence's last victory was a 27-14 win in the Banta Bowl in 2007. From 1999-2007, Lawrence won five of the nine meetings.

## **Last Meeting**

Carroll pounded out 436 rushing yards en route to a 76-7 Midwest Conference North Division victory over Lawrence on Oct. 18, 2014, at Schneider Stadium.

Lamont Williams ran eight times for 192 yards and three touchdowns to pace Carroll. Williams scored on runs of 50, 55 and 70 yards. Bennett Kothe added 102 yards on 11 carries

## for the Pioneers.

Carroll also picked up a special teams touchdown when Nick Curtis blocked a punt and Dan Verhagen returned it 32 yards for a score. The Pioneers also got a defensive touchdown on Ryan Klapper's 42-yard interception return.

Carroll quarterback Kyle Burlingame threw only nine passes, completing seven for 88 yards and a touchdown.

Lawrence's lone score came early in the fourth quarter when Taylor Mandich grabbed a 24-yard touchdown pass from Tanner Schuh.

Schuh completed 12-of-30 passes for 114 yards and one interception for the Vikings. Mandich caught five passes for 77 yards.

## **Last Week**

Lawrence fell short with a secondhalf rally on Oct. 3 at Grinnell and dropped a 28-20 non-conference decision to the Pioneers at Rosenbloom Field.

Lawrence trailed 28-14 at the half but held the Pioneers scoreless after the break. The Vikings got a pair of field goals from Pat O'Mahoney but couldn't reach the end zone in the second half.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield completed 13-of-25 passes for 117 yards, and ran 12 times for 68 yards.

Freshman Terrence Simon ran five times for 85 yards and scored his first collegiate touchdown for the Vikings. Sophomore Donnel Haley added 61 yards on 14 carries for the Vikings.

Grinnell quarterback Sam Poulos was 17-of-26 for 183 yards and two touchdowns.

Grinnell built a 21-7 lead with the help of touchdown passes of 67 and 19 yards by Poulos. Lawrence sliced the lead to 21-14 after Simon ripped off a 66-yard run with 3:05 left in the second quarter.

Emmi Sandoval then returned the

ensuing kickoff 94 yards for a touchdown to push Grinnell's lead to 28-14 at the half. Lawrence had not allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown since Lake Forest's Casey Urlacher did it back in 2001.

The Vikings trimmed the lead to 28-17 when O'Mahoney booted a 30-yard field goal with 6:54 left in the third quarter. The Vikings cut the advantage to 28-20 when O'Mahoney connected on a 34-yard field with 5:08 remaining in the fourth guarter, but that's as close as Lawrence would get.

Lawrence won the statistical battle as the Vikings out-gained Grinnell 351-301. Lawrence piled up 210 yards on the ground and averaged 5.0 yards per carry.

## **The Coaches**

Rob **McCarthy** (Concordia Moorhead 1989) is in his first season as Lawrence's head coach and has a record of 1-4 (.200). Mike Krzykowski (Carroll Rob McCarthy



1994) is in his fifth

season at Carroll and has a record of 31-14 (.689).

## **Vikings Update**

► The Vikings start the second half of the season on Saturday and it really is the home-



stretch of the season. Lawrence will play four of its final five games on Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl. Lawrence hasn't played four of its final five games at home since the 2005 campaign. The Vikings finished that season on a three-game winning streak.

► The Lawrence defense put on an impressive display in the second half at Grinnell. After allowing 28 points and 253 yards in the first half, Lawrence shut down the Pioneers in the second half. Grinnell was limited to just four first downs and 48 total yards

The defense continues to be spearheaded by sophomore defensive end Jake Gostisha (Appleton, Wis./East). Gostisha has a team-high 42 tackles, including 25 solo. He also leads the team with 3.0 sacks and is tied for the team lead at 6.0 TFLs.

The linebackers are right behind Gostisha in terms of tackles. Junior Jacob Lueck (Glen Ellyn, III./Glenbard East) is second on the squad

with 35 tackles and Jacob Lueck has 3.0 TFLs. Sopho-



more Dan Rothbauer (Appleton, Wis./ North) is next with 30 tackles, and he has 4.0 TFLs. Freshman linebacker Chris Edwards (Avondale, Ariz./Buckeye Union) has made an immediate impact with 24 tackles, including 1.0 sacks and 2.0 TFLs.

Junior defensive back Wes Hetcher (Wautoma, Wis./Wautoma) leads the team with two of Lawrence's four interceptions on the season. This is Hetcher's first season of playing only on defense.

► The Lawrence defense ranks eighth in the Midwest Conference in scoring defense at 31.0 points per game. The Vikings are also eighth in total defense at 284.4 yards per contest.

The Vikings are second in the league in pass defense, allowing only 180.2 yards per game.

► Lawrence has done a great job when it comes to turnovers. The Vikings have forced 13 turnovers and are a plus-7 in turnover margin for the season. That ranks third in the league.

► Rookie quarterback Ryan Butterfield (McDonough, Ga./Strong Rock Christian) is now leading the Vikings in both passing and rushing. Butterfield Ryan Butterfield

has completed 40-



of-73 passes (54.8 percent) for 445 yards and five touchdowns against just one interception. Butterfield also leads the team with 31 carries for 197 yards, an average of 6.4 yards.

Sophomore Terrence Simon (Viera, Fla./Melbourne Holy Trinity) had an impressive debut on offense against Grinnell. Simon ran five times for 85 yards for a gaudy 17-yard average. Simon scored his first touchdown for the Vikings on a 66-yard run in the second quarter.

► Sophomore Jacob Berman (Bethesda, Md./Wallace) is now the leading receiver on the team after catching a careerhigh seven passes



for 57 yards at Grin- Jacob Berman nell. Berman now

has 21 catches for 222 yards and a touchdown this season.

Lawrence ranks fifth in the Midwest Conference in scoring offense at 25.6 points per game. The Vikings are 10th in total offense at 284.4 yards per contest. Lawrence had its second-highest offensive output of the season with 351 yards against Grinnell.

Placekicker Pat O'Mahoney (Evan-III./Evanston ston, Township) is tied for the top spot in the Midwest Conference with four field goals



and an 80 percent Pat O'Mahoney conversion rate.

O'Mahoney has made 4-of-5 field goal tries on the season.

## **Pioneers Update**

►St. Norbert jumped out to a 21-0 lead and then hung on for a 21-14 victory over Carroll



last Saturday. The Pioneers got a pair of Kyle Burlingame to Kevin Jennings touchdown passes in the second half. Carroll was driving for the tying touchdown in the final minutes, but a Burlingame fourth-down pass fell incomplete to stop the drive at the St. Norbert 39-yard line.

► Quarterback Kyle Burlingame has put together a great season for the Pioneers. He has completed 95-of-162 passes (58.6 percent) for 1,051 yards and 10 touchdowns against five interceptions. Burlingame also has run 53 times for 115 yards and a touchdown.

Star running back Lamont Williams has graduated, but Daniel Arden has been pretty good for the Pioneers. He

leads the team with 82 carries for 447 yards and four touchdowns. He's averaging a hefty 5.5 yards per carry.

► The top receiver for Carroll is Kevin Jennings, who has more than twice as many catches as anyone else on the team. Jennings has 47 catches for 551 yards and six touchdowns. He is first in the Midwest Conference at 9.4 catches per game and second at 110.2 receiving yards per contest.

► Carroll has a 2-3 record, but the Pioneers could be unbeaten on the season. Carroll has lost three games by a total of 14 points. The Pioneers lost by one point in overtime to Lakeland, lost by six at Monmouth and by seven at St. Norbert.

Carroll ranks eighth in the Midwest Conference in scoring offense at 23.8 points per game. The Pioneers are seventh in total offense at 351.2 yards per game.

► Defensive back Ty Zimmerman leads the Pioneers in tackles with 41. He's averaging 8.2 tackles per game, and that ranks 11th in the Midwest Conference.

Senior linebacker Tyler Aerts is tops on the squad at 4.5 TFLs per game, and junior defensive end Peter Menges has a team-best 2.0 sacks.

► The Pioneers are fourth in the conference in scoring defense, allowing just 20.6 points per game. Carroll is third in the league in total defense at 333.2 yards per contest.

## 2015 Game Recaps

## September 5 Rockford 52, Lawrence 17

A P P L E T O N , Wis. — The Rockford University football team used a powerful running



game to roll to a 52-17 nonconference victory over Lawrence University.

It was the first football game played on the renovated Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Chance Manning ran 32 times for 211 yards and three touchdowns for Rockford (1-0), and he caught two passes for 86 yards and a score. The Regents finished with 58 carries for 438 yards and rolled up 605 yards of offense.

Quarterback Adam O'Malley completed 7-of-13 passes for 167 yards and a touchdown. He also ran 10 times for 62 yards.

Lawrence (0-1) was limited to just 83 yards of offense, including just 25 through the air.

Rockford jumped out to a 21-0 lead after one quarter with a trio of big plays. Pete Berry broke free for a 65-yard scoring run, Manning added a 40-yard TD run and Manning caught a 53-yard touchdown pass.

Manning added two more touchdown runs in the second quarter, and the Regents led 35-0 at the half.

Sophomore Alic Riedel got Lawrence on the board with an 81-yard kickoff return for a touchdown.

It was Riedel's first collegiate touchdown.

Austin Tucker's 64-yard fumble return set up Lawrence's next score as the Vikings took over at the Rockford 16-yard line.

After an end around by Trevor Spina got the ball to the one-yard line, Spina punched it in from a yard out on the next play to cut the lead to 45-14.

The Vikings later added a 24-yard field goal from Pat O'Mahoney to complete their scoring.

## September 12 Lawrence 51, Maranatha 6

WATERTOWN, Wis. — The Lawrence University football team bolted to a 24-6 lead at



the half and rolled to 51-6 nonconference win over Maranatha Baptist University.

Three Vikings (1-1) scored their first career touchdowns, and rookie Lawrence head coach Rob McCarthy picked up his first career victory.

Cam Boerm caught a pair of touchdown passes and Jacob Berman ran for a pair of scores for Lawrence. Senior running back Corey Fisher also got his first career touchdown for the Vikings.

Lawrence freshman quarterback Ryan Butterfield tossed his first two career touchdown passes and finished 6-for-11 passing for 92 yards. He also ran three times for 22 yards. Boerm finished with five catches for 61 yards, and Berman ran eight times for 88 yards and two scores.

Lawrence's other freshman quarterback, Kemani Pittman, also was 8-for-13 and finished with 54 yards passing.

The Vikings, who finished with 420 yards of offense, limited Maranatha (0-2) to just 236 yards, including just 28 on the ground.

Junior linebacker Jacob Lueck had a team-high 10 tackles for Lawrence and that included 2.0 tackles for loss. Lueck also forced two fumbles and recovered a fumbles. Maranatha fumbled five times on the afternoon and lost all five to the Vikings. Lawrence also intercepted three passes as Hunter Adams, Wes Hetcher and Nick Ulloa all recorded picks.

Lawrence's defense was in the backfield all afternoon as the Vikings picked up seven sacks, including 2.5 by Colt Duncan and 2.0 by Jake Gostisha.

The Vikings took advantage of a short field on its first two scoring

drives to jump out to a 13-0 lead. Fisher scored on a two-yard run, and Trevor Spina scored from a yard out.

After a Maranatha touchdown cut the lead to 13-6, Lawrence scored twice in the final 2:41 of the first half. Boerm caught a 25-yard touchdown pass, and Pat O'Mahoney kicked a 27-yard field goal to give Lawrence a 24-6 lead at the half.

Dalton Sendelbach had a six-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, and Berman then scored on runs of 39 and 10 yards early in the fourth quarter. The Vikings added a late touchdown by Boerm to finish the scoring.

## September 19 Beloit 49, Lawrence 34

BELOIT, Wis. — The Beloit College football team ran out to a big early lead and went on



to a 49-34 Midwest Conference North Division victory over Lawrence University.

Mason Dixon ran 19 times for 218 yards and three touchdowns, including a 77-yard scamper, to lead Beloit (2-1, 1-0 MWC). Beloit quarterback Danny May was 13-of-19 passing for 233 yards and four touchdowns.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield was 12-of-17 for 140 yards and three touchdowns. He also ran five times for 54 yards.

Trevor Spina caught seven passes for 94 yards, and Jacob Berman had six catches for 88 yards. Spina, Berman and Cam Boerm all caught touchdown passes for the Vikings.

The Bucs scored three times in the first 8:43 to rush out to a 21-0 lead. Lawrence (1-2, 0-1) got on the board on Donnel Haley's two-yard touchdown run in the second quarter but trailed 42-7 at the half.

The Vikings trailed 49-7 before putting up 27 points in the final quarter.

Corey Fisher had a nine-yard scoring run, and Butterfield then threw

## September 26 Knox 20, Lawrence 6

APPLETON, Wis. -- A big play jump-started the Knox College offense and a long



scoring drive sealed the Prairie Fire's 20-6 non-conference win over Lawrence University at Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Knox (2-1) got a 79-yard run on the second play of third quarter to set up its first touchdown, and the Prairie Fire went on a drive that ate up 7:10 of the fourth quarter to grab a twotouchdown lead.

Nick Edlund ran 20 times for 156 yards, and Jared Zanger scored all three touchdowns for Knox.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield was 7-for-14 for 80 yards and ran seven times for 35 yards. Quarterback Kemani Pittman, who splits time with Butterfield, was 7-of-12 passing for 55 yards.

The game was scoreless at the half after Knox dodged a bullet early in the game. Lawrence (1-3) took the opening kickoff and drove right down the field. Butterfield had nine-yard touchdown run called back on a penalty, and Lawrence later faced fourthand-2 at the Knox three-yard line. Butterfield's pass just missed Trevor Spina at the goal line and Knox took over on downs.

Knox took the opening kickoff of the second half, and Edlund broke free for a 79-yard run on the second play. He was pushed out of bounds at the Lawrence one-yard line, and Zanger scored on the next play for a 7-0 lead.

The Prairie Fire took over after a punt later in the third quarter at the Lawrence 42. Aided by a personal foul penalty, Knox moved to the Lawrence 12, and Zanger ran it in from there for a 13-0 edge.

Lawrence got on the board with a nice scoring drive early in the fourth quarter. Lawrence looked like it had been stopped when it faced fourthand-6 at the Knox 34, but Butterfield faked a punt and raced 22 yards to the Knox 12. The Vikings then benefited from a pass interference penalty to get a first down at the two-yard line. Dalton Sendelbach barreled into the end zone on the next play to cut the lead to 13-6.

Knox took the next possession and moved 79 yards in 12 plays, eating up more than seven minutes in the process, to grab a 20-6 lead. Zander scored a two-yard run with 3:27 left to seal the victory.

## October 3 Grinnell 28, Lawrence 20

G R I N N E L L, lowa — The Lawrence University football team fell short with a sec-



ond-half rally at Grinnell College and dropped a 28-20 non-conference decision to the Pioneers at Rosenbloom Field.

Lawrence (1-4) trailed 28-14 at the half but held the Pioneers scoreless after the break. The Vikings got a pair of field goals from Pat O'Mahoney but couldn't reach the end zone in the second half.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield completed 13-of-25 passes for 117 yards, and ran 12 times for 68 yards. Freshman Terrence Simon ran five times for 85 yards and scored his first collegiate touchdown for the Vikings. Sophomore Donnel Haley added 61 yards on 14 carries for the Vikings.

Grinnell quarterback Sam Poulos was 17-of-26 for 183 yards and two touchdowns.

Grinnell (1-3) built a 21-7 lead with the help of touchdown passes of 67 and 19 yards by Poulos. Lawrence sliced the lead to 21-14 after Simon ripped off a 66-yard run with 3:05 left in the second quarter.

Emmi Sandoval then returned the ensuing kickoff 94 yards for a touchdown to push Grinnell's lead to 28-14 at the half. Lawrence had not allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown since Lake Forest's Casey Urlacher did it back in 2001.

The Vikings trimmed the lead to 28-17 when O'Mahoney booted a 30-yard field goal with 6:54 left in the third quarter. The Vikings cut the ad-vantage to 28-20 when O'Mahoney connected on a 34-yard field with 5:08 remaining in the fourth quarter, but that's as close as Lawrence would get.

Lawrence won the statistical battle as the Vikings out-gained Grinnell 351-301. Lawrence piled up 210 yards on the ground and averaged 5.0 yards per carry.
