The Series

Due to its win earlier this season, Grinnell has a 28-27-0 lead in the series that dates back to 1940. The Pioneers have won two straight in the series and seven of the last eight. Lawrence's last win was a 24-14 victory back in 2012.

Last Meeting

The Lawrence offense had trouble getting going on Oct. 4 against Grinnell, and the Pioneers went on to a 29-7 nonconference victory at the Banta Bowl.

Grinnell limited Lawrence to 181 yards of total offense, including 45 in the first half.

Sam Poulos tossed a pair of touchdown passes for the Pioneers, and Jacob Bernholtz ran 22 times for 102 yards and a touchdown. Lawrence quarterback Chance Byrd, who was forced into action after starter Tanner Schuh was hurt on the game's first drive, was 9-for-27 for 142 yards and a touchdown, but he threw four interceptions.

Grinnell got on the board late in the first quarter when the Pioneers moved 59 yards in 10 plays for the game's first touchdown. Jacob Meixler caught a 16-yard scoring pass from Poulos for a 7-0 lead. Meixler finished with six catches for 78 yards and two scores.

Linebacker David Ternes made 9-0 Grinnell when he tackled Bryd in the end zone with just 45 seconds left in the first quarter.

Graham Fisher then booted a 36-yard field goal for the Pioneers, and Bernholtz's one-yard touchdown plunge capped an 87-yard drive late in the first half to put the Pioneers up 19-0. Grinnell added a 27-yard Fisher field goal, and Meixler caught a 20-

yard scoring pass in the third quarter for a 29-0 edge.

Lawrence finally got on the board with the help of a turnover. Grinnell's other quarterback, Harrison Hoegh was intercepted by Brandon Taylor at the Grinnell 31-yard line late in the third quarter. Byrd hit Cole Erickson, who made a beautiful catch on the play, on the next play from scrimmage for the touchdown.

Erickson finished with two catches for 45 yards.

Last Week

Ripon piled up more than 500 yards on the ground en route to a 47-7 Midwest Conference North Division win over Lawrence at Ingalls Field this past Saturday.

Ripon ran the ball 62 times for 528 yards on the afternoon.

Connor Greenwald led the ground assault by running 13 times for 196 yards and two touchdowns for the Red Hawks. Ripon guarterback

Stephen Covalt completed only 2-of-6 passes but one went 81 yards for a touchdown. He also threw a pair of interceptions.

Quarterback Chance Byrd completed 23-of-44 passes for 279 yards and three interceptions for Lawrence. Byrd also scored Lawrence's lone touchdown on a five-yard run.

Ripon broke the game open with three second-quarter touchdowns. The Red Hawks led 7-0 after the first quarter but got a 99-yard scoring drive to make it 14-0 and then hit on a pair of big plays. Greenwald had a 65-yard scoring run, and Covalt connected with Tom Sawyer on the 81yard touchdown pass to give Ripon a 27-0 lead at the half.

Ripon added three more secondhalf touchdowns before Lawrence got on the board. The Vikings moved 73 yards in seven plays for a score late in the game. After connecting with Zack Schubert on a 27-yard pass to the Ripon five-yard line, Byrd ran it on the next play for the touchdown.

Trevor Spina caught seven passes for 72 yards for the Vikings, and Taylor Mandich grabbed six passes for 69 vards.

Safety Dan Taylor made 13 tackles, including 3.5 tackles for loss, to pace the Lawrence defense.

The Coaches

South Division winner Illinois College in the title game. The teams through the standings will play for their place in the conference. The second-place teams will play for third, the thirdplace teams play for fifth place and so on down the line. Lawrence and Grinnell face each other for ninth place.

This is the first time in a long time that Lawrence has played the same opponent twice in the same season. Lawrence faced Grinnell in week four when the Pioneers defeated Lawrence 29-7 in the Banta Bowl. Lawrence hasn't played the same team twice in a season since the Vikings faced Ripon twice in the 1945 season. The teams split the two games back in the fall of 1945.

Lawrence is 12th in the Midwest

Conference in scoring offense at 13.4 points per game. Lawrence ranks ninth in total offense at 292.8 yards per game.

► Freshman Chance Byrd (Lincoln, Ala./ Lincoln) hit season highs for attempts completions (44),(23) and passing yards (279) in the game at Ripon last Chance Byrd



Saturday. Byrd also completed 23 passes in Lawrence's win over Beloit earlier this season. Byrd is now 101-for-204 (49.5 percent) passing for 1,215 yards, seven touchdowns and 13 interceptions.

- ► Lawrence had 349 yards of offense at Ripon and moved the ball consistently, but three interceptions stymied the Vikings as turnovers took place at the Ripon 48, 1 and 47. Lawrence also lost the ball on downs at the Ripon 19, 18 and 41.
- ► Senior Taylor Mandich (Green Bay, Wis./Southwest) is the top receiver for the Vikings. Mandich leads the team with 39 catches for 652 yards and five touch- Taylor Mandich downs after catch-



ing six balls for 69 yards at Ripon. Mandich ranks fourth in the league at 72.4 receiving yards per game and is sixth at 4.3 catches per contest.

▶Sophomore receiver Trevor Spina (Henderson, Nev./ Coronado) matched his career high when he caught seven passes at Ripon. Spina, who has 31 Trevor Spina catches for 368 yards



and two touchdowns this season, also caught seven passes vs. Lake Forest in 2013.

▶Senior linebacker Brandon Taylor (Johnsburg, 111./ Johnsburg) would need a career game at Grinnell if he wants to reach the 100-tackle plateau Brandon Taylor on the season. Taylor



enters the game leading the Vikings with 86 tackles and has averaged 10.7 tackles over the past seven games. Taylor ranks fourth in the Midwest Conference at 9.6 tackles per game. If Taylor gets 14 tackles against Grinnell, which would be one short of tying his career high, he would be the first Lawrence player to record 100 tackles in a season since 2003. Safety Jacques Hacquebord had had 112 tackles and linebacker Scott Caroen recorded 104 in 2003.

► Senior safety Dan Taylor (Bridgeport, Calif./Lee Vining) picked up 13 tackles, including 11 unassisted, at Ripon. Taylor is second on the team with 79 tackles.

- ► Sophomore defensive end Tony Harth (Madison, Wis./West) leads the team with 11.0 tackles for loss and ranks ninth in the league at 1.22 TFLs per game. Harth has a total of 49 tackles on the season.
- ▶ Ripon's quarterback completed as many passes to his teammates (2) as he did to the Vikings last Saturday. Freshman cornerback Alic (Appleton, Alic Riedel Riedel



Wis./East) and sophomore cornerback Nick Ulloa (Burling-Wis./Catholic ton. Central) both had interceptions against the Red Hawks. Riedel leads the team Nick Ulloa with three intercep-



tions and eight pass breakups for a team-best 11 passes defensed. Riedel also has 28 tackles. Ulloa has two interceptions to go with three pass breakups and 29 tackles.

▶Lawrence is 12th in the conference in scoring defense at 35.4 points per game. Lawrence is 12th in the league in total defense at 409.0 yards per game.

Pioneers Update

►Lake Forest scored 22 thirdquarter points to pull away for a 28-14 MWC South



Division victory over visiting Grinnell last Saturday. Quarterback Sam Poulos completed 22-of-38 passes for 214 yards and a score for the Pioneers. Greg Ruzich had seven catches for 52 yards to pace Grinnell. Jacob Meixler caught five passes, including a 63-yard touchdown pass. The Foresters got a long touchdown pass and a blocked punt in the decisive third quarter.

- ▶ Quarterback Sam Poulos is the primary signal-caller for the Pioneers and has completed 145-of-264 passes for 1,449 yards, five touchdowns and 10 interceptions. Poulos also has 142 carries for 296 yards and three TDs.
- ▶ Jacob Bernholtz is the top runner for the Pioneers with 151 carries for 508 yards, an average of 3.4 yards per carry, and seven TDs.
- ▶The Pioneers have spread the ball around to a number of receivers. Zach McGriff has a team-best 36 catches for 321 yards and two touchdowns. Jacob Meixler has 31 catches and leads the team with 420 yards and four touchdowns. Greg Ruzich (30 catches, 228 yards), Bernholtz (25 catches, 188 yards) and Carson Dunn (20 catches, 139 yards) all have at least 20 receptions.
- ▶ Grinnell ranks ninth in the conference in scoring offense at 17.1 points per game. The Pioneers are 10th in total offense at 273.0 yards per game.
- ▶Grinnell is first in the league in red zone offense, scoring on 23-of-26

- Senior linebacker David Ternes leads the league in tackles at 14.1 per game. Ternes has piled up 127 tackles on the season. He had 15 tackles, including 4.5 TFLs, in the first meeting against Lawrence. Ternes leads the team with 15.0 TFLs and 5.5 sacks on the season.
- ▶ Defensive back Nate George leads the team with two interceptions, and Joe Galaske has a team best four pass breakups.
- ▶The Pioneers are ninth in the league in scoring defense at 28.7 points per contest. Grinnell is 11th in the conference in total defense at 401.0 yards per contest.
