### The Series

In a series that goes back to 1940, Grinnell holds a 30-27 advantage. Grinnell has won nine of the last 10 meetings, but Lawrence has the longest win streak in series history, taking 10 straight from 1941-54. This marks the second consecutive season that the teams will play twice in the same year.

### Last Meeting

Lawrence fell short with a second-half rally at Grinnell and dropped a 28-20 non-conference decision to the Pioneers at Rosenbloom Field on Oct. 3.

Lawrence trailed 28-14 at the half but held the Pioneers scoreless after the break. The Vikings got a pair of

field goals from Pat O'Mahoney but couldn't reach the end zone in the second half.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield completed 13-of-25 passes for 117 yards and ran 12 times for 68 yards. Freshman Terrence Simon ran five times for 85 yards and scored his first collegiate touchdown for the Vikings. Sophomore Donnel Haley added 61 yards on 14 carries for the Vikings.

Grinnell quarterback Sam Poulos was 17-of-26 for 183 yards and two touchdowns.

Grinnell built a 21-7 lead with the help of touchdown passes of 67 and 19 yards by Poulos. Lawrence sliced the lead to 21-14 after Simon ripped off a 66-yard run with 3:05 left in the second quarter.

Emmi Sandoval then returned the ensuing kickoff 94 yards for a touch-

down to push Grinnell's lead to 28-14 at the half. Lawrence had not allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown since Lake Forest's Casey Urlacher did it back in 2001.

The Vikings trimmed the lead to 28-17 when O'Mahoney booted a 30-yard field goal with 6:54 left in the third quarter. The Vikings cut the advantage to 28-20 when O'Mahoney connected on a 34-yard field with 5:08 remaining in the fourth quarter, but that's as close as Lawrence would get.

Lawrence won the statistical battle as the Vikings out-gained Grinnell 351-301. Lawrence piled up 210 yards on the ground and averaged 5.0 yards per carry.

### Last Week

Ripon scored 21 points in the first quarter and went on to a 43-15 Midwest Conference North Division victory over Lawrence this past Saturday at Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Ripon retained possession of the Doehling-Hesleton Memorial Trophy in the oldest college football rivalry in Wisconsin.

In the 115th meeting between the teams, Ripon rushed 57 times for 404 yards on its way to 521 total yards of offense. Connor Greenwald ran 13 times for 136 yards and two touchdowns to pace the Red Hawks.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield connected with Terrence Simon on a pair of touchdown passes. Butterfield went 10-for-20 for 124 yards, and Simon had three catches for 41 yards. Running back Donnel Haley ran 12 times for a career-high 74 yards for the Vikings.

Three Vikings recorded double figures in tackles as Jake Gostisha and Jacob Lueck finished with 13 tackles apiece. Alic Riedel had 11 stops and intercepted a pass for the Vikings.

It was Riedel who got the game started on a great note as he returned the opening kickoff 57 yards to the Ripon 35. The drive ended with an interception, and Ripon took control.

The Red Hawks scored on an 11-play, 75-yard drive to take a 7-0 lead. After a three-and-out, Ripon went 38 yards in eight plays for a 14-0 advantage. After a second three-and-out, Ripon quarterback Griffin McNeal hit Nathan Silloway for 51 yards and a touchdown for a 21-0 edge.

Ripon was up 28-0 when Lawrence drove 73 yards in just five plays. Cole Erickson made a leaping catch for a 30-yard gain on the first play, and Butterfield hit Simon with a 31-yard scoring pass four plays later to cut the margin to 28-8.

Ripon led 36-8 at the half and were up 43-8 when the Vikings took advantage of a turnover in the fourth quarter. Lawrence's Nick Ulloa recovered a fumbled punt at the Ripon 18-yard line with 12:06 left.

Butterfield found Corey Fisher for 14 yards to the Ripon four-yard line, and Lawrence scored three plays later when Simon caught a seven-yard scoring pass with 10:34 remaining.

Rob McCarthy (Concordia Moorhead 1989) is in his first season as Lawrence's head coach and has a record of 1-8. Jeff Pedersen (Grinnell 2002) is in

### Vikings Update

►The Vikings take on Grinnell is what is the 11th-place game. All the games around



the league this weekend are played to determine final placements in the league standings. Schools receive points in the all-sport standings in each sport.

► Saturday's game marks the final contest for seven Lawrence seniors, defenders Brady Busha, Colt Duncan and Josh Mosley and offensive players Soseah Connahvichnah, Corey Fisher, Patrick Pierson and Dalton Sendelbach.

► Sophomore cornerback Alic Riedel (Appleton, Wis./East) contributed on multiple fronts in the game against Ripon. A week after recording a career-high 14

tackles, Riedel came up with 11 tackles against the Red Hawks. He also picked off his second pass of the season. Riedel got the game started with a 57-yard kickoff return to start the game. That is the second-longest kickoff return of his career and his third kickoff return this season to go for at least 45 yards.

► Lawrence ranks fourth in the Midwest Conference in pass defense at 169.9 yards per game.

► Junior linebacker Jacob Lueck (Glen Ellyn, Ill./Glenbard East) recorded his third double-digit tackle game of the season with 13 stops against Ripon. Lueck has a team-best



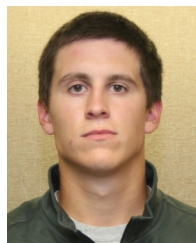

81 tackles on the season and ranks fourth in the league at 9.0 tackles per game.

► Sophomore defensive end Jake Gostisha (Appleton, Wis./East) had a career-high 13 tackles against Ripon. Gostisha eclipsed his previous career best of 10 stops, which he did earlier this season at Knox. Gostisha is sec-

ond on the team and sixth in the league with 76 tackles, an average of 8.4 per game. Gostisha is fifth in the conference with 10.5 TFLs and tied for sixth with 4.0 sacks.

► The Vikings rank 11th in the conference in scoring defense at 37.6 points per game. Lawrence is 11th in total defense at 466.8 yards per game.

► The Vikings found some success running the ball against Ripon with some nifty cutback running by sophomore Donnel Haley (Chicago, Ill./Loyola Academy). Haley posted a career-high 74 rushing yards on 12 carries for an average of 6.2 yards per carry. Haley now has 58 carries for 190 yards and a pair of touchdowns on the season.

► Sophomore receiver/back Terrence Simon (Viera, Fla./Melbourne Holy Trinity) had the first two-touchdown

game of his career against Ripon. He caught scoring passes of 31 and seven yards and finished with three catches for 41 yards. Simon has now scored four touchdowns in the last five games and become an integral part of the Lawrence offense. Over that stretch he has 30 rushes for 210 yards, an average of 7.0 yards per carry, and a touchdown. He also has 13 catches for 140 yards and three scores.

► The Lawrence offense ranks 10th in the Midwest Conference at 18.0 points per game. The Vikings are 11th in total offense at 247.1 yards per game.

### Pioneers Update

► Lake Forest scored 14 points in the final 2:08 of the first quarter to pull away and then



cruised to a 54-10 win at Grinnell last Saturday. With the score 7-3, Lake Forest scored the next 47 points. Charlie Quinn ran 13 times for 142 yards and three touchdowns for the Foresters, and Jagan Clearly completed 8-of-16

passes for 100 yards and two touchdowns.

►Senior quarterback Sam Poulos triggers the Grinnell attack. He has completed 127-of-214 passes this season for 1,152 yards, eight touchdowns and two interceptions. He ranks eighth in the league at 144.0 passing yards per game. Poulos has a team-high 118 rushing attempts for only 226 yards due to the fact the Pioneers have given up 25 sacks on the season.

►The top running back for the Pioneers is Carson Dunn, who has 74 carries for 227 yards, a 3.1-yard average, and three touchdowns.

►Emmi Sandoval and Henry Cummings are the top receivers for the Pioneers. Sandoval has 33 catches for 399 yards and three touchdowns, and Cummings has 31 catches for 389 yards and four touchdowns.

►Grinnell ranks last in the league in scoring offense at 12.2 points per game. The Pioneers are also last in total offense at 224.4 yards per contest.

►Freshman linebacker Ryan Slager has piled up an astounding 119 tackles this season. His average of 13.2 tackles per game easily leads the Midwest Conference. Barrett Morrisette is second in the league with 87 tackles, an average of 9.7 per contest. Morrisette also paces the team with 6.5 TFLs.

►Grinnell has recorded only 3.0 sacks this season, and the Pioneers have yet to intercept a pass.

►Grinnell is allowing 48.1 points per game, which ranks last in the Midwest Conference. The Pioneers are allowing 539.3 yards per game, which ranks last in the conference.

►This weekend marks the end of a short two-year run with a Midwest Conference Championship Game. St.

## 2015 Game Recaps

**September 5**

**Rockford 52, Lawrence 17**

APPLETON, Wis. — The Rockford University football team used a powerful running



game to roll to a 52-17 nonconference victory over Lawrence University.

It was the first football game played on the renovated Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Chance Manning ran 32 times for 211 yards and three touchdowns for Rockford (1-0), and he caught two passes for 86 yards and a score. The Regents finished with 58 carries for 438 yards and rolled up 605 yards of offense.

Quarterback Adam O'Malley completed 7-of-13 passes for 167 yards and a touchdown. He also ran 10 times for 62 yards.

Lawrence (0-1) was limited to just 83 yards of offense, including just 25 through the air.

Rockford jumped out to a 21-0 lead after one quarter with a trio of big plays. Pete Berry broke free for a 65-yard scoring run, Manning added a 40-yard TD run and Manning caught a 53-yard touchdown pass.

Manning added two more touchdown runs in the second quarter, and the Regents led 35-0 at the half.

Sophomore Alic Riedel got Lawrence on the board with an 81-yard kickoff return for a touchdown.

It was Riedel's first collegiate touchdown.

Austin Tucker's 64-yard fumble return set up Lawrence's next score as the Vikings took over at the Rockford 16-yard line.

After an end around by Trevor Spina got the ball to the one-yard line, Spina punched it in from a yard out on the next play to cut the lead to 45-14.

The Vikings later added a 24-yard field goal from Pat O'Mahoney to complete their scoring.

**September 12**

**Lawrence 51, Maranatha 6**

WATERTOWN, Wis. — The Lawrence University football team bolted to a 24-6 lead at



the half and rolled to 51-6 nonconference win over Maranatha Baptist University.

Three Vikings (1-1) scored their first career touchdowns, and rookie Lawrence head coach Rob McCarthy picked up his first career victory.

Cam Boerm caught a pair of touchdown passes and Jacob Berman ran for a pair of scores for Lawrence. Senior running back Corey Fisher also got his first career touchdown for the Vikings.

Lawrence freshman quarterback Ryan Butterfield tossed his first two career touchdown passes and finished 6-for-11 passing for 92 yards. He also ran three times for 22 yards. Boerm finished with five catches for 61 yards, and Berman ran eight times for 88 yards and two scores.

Lawrence's other freshman quarterback, Kemani Pittman, also was 8-for-13 and finished with 54 yards passing.

The Vikings, who finished with 420 yards of offense, limited Maranatha (0-2) to just 236 yards, including just 28 on the ground.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield was 12-of-17 for 140 yards and three touchdowns. He also ran five times for 54 yards.

Trevor Spina caught seven passes for 94 yards, and Jacob Berman had six catches for 88 yards. Spina, Berman and Cam Boerm all caught touchdown passes for the Vikings.

The Bucs scored three times in the first 8:43 to rush out to a 21-0 lead. Lawrence (1-2, 0-1) got on the board on Donnel Haley's two-yard touchdown run in the second quarter but trailed 42-7 at the half.

Knox (2-1) got a 79-yard run on the second play of third quarter to set up its first touchdown, and the Prairie Fire went on a drive that ate up 7:10 of the fourth quarter to grab a two-touchdown lead.

Nick Edlund ran 20 times for 156 yards, and Jared Zanger scored all three touchdowns for Knox.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield was 7-for-14 for 80 yards and ran seven times for 35 yards. Quarterback Kemani Pittman, who splits time with Butterfield, was 7-of-12 passing for 55 yards.

The game was scoreless at the half after Knox dodged a bullet early in the game. Lawrence (1-3) took the opening kickoff and drove right down the field. Lawrence (1-4) trailed 28-14 at the half but held the Pioneers scoreless after the break. The Vikings got a pair of field goals from Pat O'Mahoney but couldn't reach the end zone in the second half.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield completed 13-of-25 passes for 117 yards, and ran 12 times for 68 yards. Freshman Terrence Simon ran five times for 85 yards and scored his first collegiate touchdown for the Vikings. Sophomore Donnel Haley added 61 yards on 14 carries for the Vikings.

Grinnell quarterback Sam Poulos was 17-of-26 for 183 yards and two touchdowns.

Grinnell (1-3) built a 21-7 lead with the help of touchdown passes of 67 and 19 yards by Poulos. Lawrence sliced the lead to 21-14 after Simon ripped off a 66-yard run with 3:05 left



in the second quarter.

Emmi Sandoval then returned the ensuing kickoff 94 yards for a touchdown to push Grinnell's lead to 28-14 at the half. Lawrence had not allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown since Lake Forest's Casey Urlacher did it back in 2001.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield was 11-for-19 for 75 yards and a touchdown. Jacob Berman caught five passes for 44 yards for the Vikings (1-6, 0-3). Lawrence's Terrence Simon had five carries for 29 yards, and he had three punt returns for 55 yards.

#### Ripon 43, Lawrence 15

scored 21 points in the first quarter and went on to a 43-15 Midwest Conference North Division victory over Lawrence University at Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Ripon (6-3, 3-2 MWC North) retained possession of the Doehling-Hesleton Memorial Trophy in the oldest college football rivalry in Wisconsin.

In the 115th meeting between the teams, Ripon rushed 57 times for 404 yards on its way to 521 total yards of offense. Connor Greenwald ran 13 times for 136 yards and two touchdowns to pace the Red Hawks.

## 2015 Game Recaps

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield connected with Terrence Simon on a pair of touchdown passes. Butterfield went 10-for-20 for 124 yards, and Simon had three catches for 41 yards. Running back Donnel Haley ran 12 times for a career-high 74 yards for the Vikings (1-8, 0-5).

Three Vikings recorded double figures in tackles as Jake Gostisha and Jacob Lueck finished with 13 tackles apiece. Alic Riedel had 11 stops and intercepted a pass for the Vikings.

It was Riedel who got the game started on a great note as he returned the opening kickoff 57 yards to the Ripon 35. The drive ended with an interception, and Ripon took control.

The Red Hawks scored on an 11-play, 75-yard drive to take a 7-0 lead. After a three-and-out, Ripon went 38 yards in eight plays for a 14-0 advantage. After a second three-and-out, Ripon quarterback Griffin McNeal hit Nathan Silloway for 51 yards and a touchdown for a 21-0 edge.

Ripon was up 28-0 when Lawrence drove 73 yards in just five plays. Cole Erickson made a leaping catch for a 30-yard gain on the first play, and Butterfield hit Simon with a 31-yard scoring pass four plays later to cut the margin to 28-8.

Ripon led 36-8 at the half and were up 43-8 when the Vikings took advantage of a turnover in the fourth quarter. Lawrence's Nick Ulloa recovered a fumbled punt at the Ripon 18-yard line with 12:06 left.

Butterfield found Corey Fisher for 14 yard to the Ripon four-yard line, and Lawrence scored three plays later when Simon caught a seven-yard scoring pass with 10:34 remaining.
