The Series

This is the oldest college football rivalry in Wisconsin with its first game played in 1893. Ripon won the first meeting 24-6 and then went on to take the first five meetings between the teams. Lawrence then won the next four and nine of the next 11. The teams met for the 100th time in 2000, and Ripon has won the last 16 games.

Last Meeting

Ripon scored 21 points in the first quarter and went on to a 43-15 Midwest Conference North Division victory over Lawrence at Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl on Nov. 7, 2015.

Ripon retained possession of the Doehling-Hesleton Memorial Trophy in the oldest college football rivalry in Wisconsin.

In the 115th meeting between the teams, Ripon rushed 57 times for 404 yards on its way to 521 total yards of offense. Connor Greenwald ran 13 times for 136 yards and two touchdowns to pace the Red Hawks.

Lawrence quarterback Ryan Butterfield connected with Terrence Simon on a pair of touchdown passes. Butterfield went 10-for-20 for 124 yards, and Simon had three catches for 41 yards. Running back Donnel Haley ran 12 times for a career-high 74 yards for the Vikings.

Three Vikings recorded double figures in tackles as Jake Gostisha and Jacob Lueck finished with 13 tackles apiece. Alic Riedel had 11 stops and intercepted a pass for the Vikings.

It was Riedel who got the game started on a great note as he returned the opening kickoff 57 yards to the Ripon 35. The drive ended with an interception, and Ripon took control.

The Red Hawks scored on an 11-play, 75-yard drive to take a 7-0

lead. After a three-and-out, Ripon went 38 yards in eight plays for a 14-0 advantage. After a second three-and-out, Ripon quarterback Griffin McNeal hit Nathan Silloway for 51 yards and a touchdown for a 21-0 edge.

Ripon was up 28-0 when Lawrence drove 73 yards in just five plays. Cole Erickson made a leaping catch for a 30-yard gain on the first play, and Butterfield hit Simon with a 31-yard scoring pass four plays later to cut the margin to 28-8.

Butterfield found Corey Fisher for 14 yard to the Ripon four-yard line, and Lawrence scored three plays later when Simon caught a seven-yard scoring pass with 10:34 remaining for Lawrence's final score.

Last Week

Lawrence's rally came up short Saturday and Knox held on for a 33-27 Midwest Conference victory in the Knosher Bowl.

Lawrence got a late touchdown to

cut Knox's lead to six, and the Vikings' defense forced a three-and-out to get the ball back. Knox intercepted a pass on the second play of the final drive to seal the victory.

Lawrence quarterback Philip Santiago went 17-for-33 passing for 170 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. Santiago also carried the ball 16 times for 97 yards and a pair of scores. Cam Boerm caught six passes for 75 yards and two touchdowns for the Vikings.

Running back Braeden Westfall and quarterback Matt McCaffrey did all the damage for Knox. Westfall had 29 carries for 176 yards, and McCaffrey ran 19 times for 52 yards. McCaffrey completed 17-of-25 passes for 180 yards and two touchdowns.

Knox took control of the game by scoring 19 unanswered points to turn a 14-7 second-quarter deficit into a 26-14 lead in the final seconds of the third quarter.

Lawrence then moved 81 yards in 13 plays for a touchdown to get back into the game. Boerm caught a 13-yard touchdown pass to trim Knox's lead to 26-21 with 11:12 left in the game.


The Prairie Fire answered with a 65-yard scoring drive of its own. Malik Hamilton caught a 15-yard pass from McCaffrey to push the lead back to 33-21 with 7:43 left.

Lawrence methodically marched down the field with another 13-play drive that went for 81 yards and a touchdown. Santiago did the honors with a one-yard plunge that trimmed the lead to 33-27.

After the Lawrence defense forced a punt, the Vikings got the ball back near midfield. A sack on the first play pushed the ball back to the 30-yard line, and Santiago was intercepted on the next play.

Lawrence jumped out to the early lead when Santiago hit Boerm with a 19-yard touchdown pass to cap an eight-play, 78-yard drive for a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter.

Quinn Sharp then intercepted

Santiago and returned it 37 yards for a touchdown to tie the game at 7-7. Lawrence quickly grabbed the lead back when Santiago scored on a one-yard run on the first play of the second quarter to cap a 48-yard drive for a 14-7 edge.

The Coaches

Rob McCarthy (Concordia Moorhead 1989) is in his second season as Lawrence's head coach and has a record of 4-15 (.211). Ron Ernst (Nebraska Wesleyan 1980) is in his 26th season at Ripon and has a record of 161-93 (.634).

Vikings Update

►Lawrence is looking to end a high note with a victory, and that would mean a three-win improvement over Rob McCarthy's first season as head coach. The Vikings haven't won four games since the 2007 season.



►Rookie quarterback Philip Santiago (Boynton Beach, Fla./Boca Raton)

took over the team rushing lead last Saturday after running for 97 yards against Knox. He has 66 carries for 490 yards for a hefty 7.4-yard average. Santiago also has completed 70-of-143 passes for 863 yards, seven TDs and four INTs.

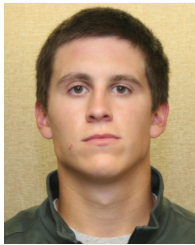

► Trevor Spina (Henderson, Nev./Coronado) and Cam Boerm (Port Lavaca, Texas/Calhoun) are the leading receivers for the Vikings. Spina has 26 catches for 297 yards and two TDs. Boerm has 20 catches for 297 yards and a team-best five TDs.

► The Vikings pushed their scoring average on the season to 21 points per game, which is ninth in the league. Lawrence is ninth in total offense at 349.4 yards per contest.

► Linebacker Jake Gostisha (Appleton, Wis./East) ranks third in the Midwest Conference at 10.9 tackles per game. Gostisha has 98 tackles on the season and is pressing to become the first Lawrence player since Jacques Hacquebord and Scott Caroen both did it during the 2003 season. Hacquebord had 112 tackles that season, and Caroen had 104.

► Gostisha, who has 6.5 TFLs, also is tied for the conference lead with five INTs.

► Junior linebacker Dan Rothbauber (Appleton, Wis./North) is second on the team with 78 tackles and is tied with defensive end Cullen Ellis (New York, N.Y./Beacon) for the team lead with 10.5 TFLs. Ellis also leads the team with 4.0 sacks.

► Rookie Terrell Myers Jr. (Marietta,

Ga./Marietta) leads the Midwest Conference in kick returns with a 32.6-yard average, and that ranks fifth in all of NCAA Division III. Myers also has been outstanding at cornerback with a team-best seven pass breakups to go with 35 tackles.

► Lawrence ranks fifth in the Midwest Conference in scoring defense at 26.3 points per game. The Vikings are third in total defense at 362 yards per game.

Scouting Ripon

► Ripon also saw its rally fall short last Saturday as the Red Hawks fell 31-28 at Cornell. The Rams built a 31-14 lead early in the third quarter, but Ripon countered with a TD in the third quarter and another in the fourth to trim the margin to three. Ripon got the ball back one last time, but an interception ended its final drive.



► This game features two of the top ground games in the league. Ripon is second in the Midwest Conference in rushing at 234.7 yards per game. Ripon is averaging 51 rushing attempts per game. Lawrence is third in the league at 215.2 yards per game and runs the ball 40 times per game.

► Austin Bunders and Cody Chase are the top runners for the Red Hawks, who operate a run-heavy offense. Bunders has 34 carries for 479 yards for a hefty 14.1-yard average. Cashe has 97 carries for 430 yards.

► Ripon has used three quarterbacks this season. Samuel Shroyer started at Cornell, but Cameron Gruenwald also saw extensive action against the Rams. On the season, Shroyer is 16-of-44 for 133 yards and five INTs. Gruenwald is 13-of-32 for 147 yards and four INTs. Griffin McNeal is 33-of-77 for 585 yards, three TDs and six INTs.

► Ripon ranks 10th in the league in scoring at 18.1 points per game. The Red Hawks are 10th in total offense at 330.8 yards per contest.

►Linebacker Ethan Hoffman is tops on the team with 65 tackles. Defensive lineman Brandon Bartel has a team-best 5.5 TFLs, and defensive back Vince Stensrud has a team-high 4.0 sacks.

►Ripon ranks ninth in the league in scoring defense at 35.8 points per game. The Red Hawks are eighth in total defense at 394.7 yards per game.

Extra Points

►The trophy that Lawrence and Ripon play for, the Doehling-Heselton Memorial Trophy, commemorates the rivalry between Lawrence head coach Bernie Heselton and long-time Ripon mentor Carl Doehling. Heselton was the Vikings' head coach from 1938-64 and Doehling coached the Redmen (as they were then known) from 1924-55. Heselton had the edge on Doehling, compiling a 10-6-1 record against Ripon from 1938-55.

►The trophy was donated in 1988 by Barb Doehling Doran, a 1945 Ripon graduate and the daughter of Carl Doehling. Since its inception, Ripon holds a 23-5 edge in the rivalry.

►The rivalry was at its zenith in the 1950s, when raids on the other campus the night before the game were common. One favorite prank was to paint a blue "L" or red "R" on buildings on the opposing campus. That's when things got a little out of hand and the administration of both schools stepped in. The team began playing for a silver-plated trophy called "The Old Paint Bucket" at that time. No one seems to know how long that continued or what has become of the trophy. It remains missing to this day.

►Lawrence vs. Ripon is one of 51 trophy games played at the NCAA Division III level and one of two games in the Midwest Conference. Knox and Monmouth have been playing for the Bronze Turkey since 1929, and they square off on Saturday as well.
