### The Series

Lawrence holds a 57-35-5 edge in the series with Beloit. The teams played for the first time back in the 19th century, an 11-0 Beloit win back in 1899. Lawrence holds the longest winning streak in the series, an 11-game stretch from 1973-83 that saw the Vikings post six shutouts and outscore the Bucs by an average of 29.6 points. Lawrence has won two of the last three meetings.

### Last Meeting

Lawrence jumped out to a 24-0 lead and cruised to a 38-14 Midwest Conference victory over Beloit on Sept. 15, 2012, in the Banta Bowl.

It was the first victory at Lawrence

for first-year head coach Mike Barthelmess.

Junior quarterback Luke Barthelmess was 19 of 30 passing for 277 yards and three touchdowns. Barthelmess also ran 12 times for 74 yards. Running back Ben Hartman had seven carries for a team-high 90 yards, and included in that total was a 54-yard touchdown run.

Running back Zach Draus paced Beloit with 19 carries for 139 yards and a touchdown. Quarterback Will Coyne was 14 of 29 passing for 164 yards and two interceptions.

Lawrence led 3-0 early when the Vikings moved 76 yards in nine plays for the first touchdown of the afternoon. Barthelmess hit Tyler Mazur on a 16-yard scoring strike for a 10-0 lead. Mazur caught four passes for 98 yards.

The Vikings made it 17-0 with 3:33 left in the first half when Scott Vandeloo took advantage of the perfect play call. Beloit called an all-out blitz, and Lawrence countered

with a screen pass. Vandeloo went untouched 36 yards for the touchdown.

Lawrence got the ball back with 2:14 left in the opening half and moved 70 yards in just three plays for the touchdown. Barthelmess hit Dominique Dirden, who caught eight passes for 71 yards, for 21 yards and a Beloit penalty moved the ball to the Bucs' 29-yard line. Barthelmess found Dan Dubnicka on the next play for a 29-yard touchdown catch and Lawrence led 24-0.

The Bucs took advantage of an interception to cut the lead to 24-6 at the half, but Lawrence got a two-yard touchdown run from Vandeloo and a 54-yard scoring scamper from Hartman in the second half to seal the win.

Lawrence, which piled up 492 yards of offense, also forced three turnovers. Sam Wagner forced and recovered the same fumble, and Brandon Taylor and Colt Duncan had interceptions for the Vikings. Marcus

Moore piled up a game-high 12 tackles for Lawrence.

### Last Week

Lake Forest blocked two fields in the final three minutes, including one on the last play of the game, to hang on for a 14-13 Midwest Conference win over Lawrence University on Saturday night in the Banta Bowl.

The Foresters also blocked an extra point that proved to be the winning margin.

Lawrence trailed by a point when it took over at its own 36-yard line with 9:51 left. The Vikings took 13 plays to move all the way to the Lake Forest two-yard line before being stopped. Freshman Patrick O'Mahoney lined up for a 19-yard field goal, and the kick was blocked. The ball went out of the end zone and Lake Forest took over at its own 20 with 2:41 left.

Lawrence was out of timeouts, but the Foresters failed to pick up a first down. Lake Forest did the Vikings a favor by throwing an incomplete pass on third down to stop the clock. Lake Forest punted, and Lawrence got the ball back at its own 23 with 47 seconds left.

Lawrence quarterback Luke Barthelmess hit Sam Wagner with a 32-yard completion on the first play to move the ball to the Lake Forest 45. Barthelmess then ripped off runs of 11 and 24 yards to move to the Lake Forest 10-yard line.

After a pair of incompletions, the Vikings were called for offensive pass interference with six seconds left. O'Mahoney lined up for a 42-yard field goal, but the kick was blocked again as time expired.

Barthelmess ran 21 times for 124 yards, and he completed 24 of 36 passes for 284 yards and a touchdown. Taylor Mandich grabbed seven passes for 95 yards for the Vikings.

The Lawrence offense piled up 450 yards of offense, including 166 on the ground. The Lawrence defense limited Lake Forest to just 239 yards, and the Foresters were just 3-for-11 on third down.

Alec Howe paced the Lake Forest offense by running 20 times for 121 yards. Quarterback Mike Lewis was 8-for-17 for 75 yards and a touchdown.

Lake Forest took a 7-0 lead when it moved 76 yards in six plays with Lewis connecting with Mike Rantis on a 14-yard touchdown pass. Lawrence

answered on its next possession as the Vikings went 77 yards in 11 plays for the score. Barthelmess hit Mandich with a seven-yard scoring pass with 1:34 left in the first quarter to tie the game at 7-7.

Lawrence then scored on its next possession to take a 13-7 lead. The Vikings went 49 yards in nine plays, with

Isaac Barthlemess scoring his first collegiate touchdown on a three-yard run. Jake Rotkvich blocked the extra point, and the Vikings led by six.

Lake Forest then took the lead for good late in the second quarter. The Foresters went 50 yards in seven plays as Charlie Quinn ripped off a 20-yard touchdown run. Lake Forest converted on the extra point and led 14-13 with 4:48 left in the first half.

### The Coaches

Mike Barthelmess (Principia 1983) is in his second season at Lawrence and has a record of 2-10 (.167). Barthelmess is in his 11th season overall and has a record of 17-70-1 (.199). Chris Brann (West Virginia Wesleyan 1991) is in his eighth season at Beloit and has a record of 20-52 (.278). He is in his 12th season overall and has a record of 29-93 (.238).

### Vikings Update

►The Vikings look to bounce back after a difficult loss to Lake Forest last Saturday. Lawrence is looking for its first road win since winning 24-14 at Grinnell on Oct. 27, 2012.



►Senior quarterback Luke Barthelmess (Appleton, Wis./Principia) was named the Midwest Conference Offensive Player of the Week after an impressive performance against Lake Forest last Saturday. Barthelmess ran for more than 100 yards and threw for nearly 300. Barthelmess ran 21 times for 124 yards for a 5.9-yard average. Barthelmess completed 24 of 36 passes for 284 yards, one touchdown and no

interceptions. Barthelmess' first-quarter touchdown pass was the 50th of his career, which ties him for second place on Lawrence's career list with Eric Aspenson.

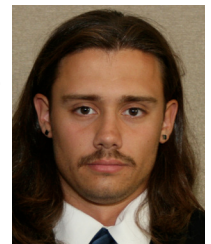

►Luke Barthelmess has now run for more than 100 yards in both games this season. He is the first Lawrence back to run for more than 100 yards in consecutive games since Craig Ebert did it in the final two games of the 2008 season. Barthelmess has 41 carries for 241 yards on the season and ranks third in the league in rushing at 120.5 yards per game.

►Luke Barthelmess has pushed his career passing yards total to 6,496. Barthelmess needs just 166 passing yards to move past Illinois College's Derek Leonard for 10th place on the Midwest Conference's career passing yards list. The conference's career passing leader is Monmouth's Alex Tanney with an astronomical 14,249 yards.

►Senior wide receiver Taylor Mandich (Green Bay, Wis./Southwest) tied his

career high with seven catches last Saturday against Lake Forest. He also set a career high with 95 receiving yards.

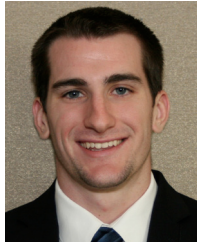
►For the second consecutive week, Lawrence enjoyed a huge advantage in time of possession. Lawrence held the ball for 36:37 against Lake Forest after having it for 37:04 in the season opener against Cornell.

►The Vikings ran 76 offensive plays and rang up 450 yards of total offense against the Foresters. Lawrence ranks fourth in the Midwest Conference in total offense at 390.5 yards per game. The Vikings are eighth in scoring offense at 13.5 points per contest.

►The Lawrence defense limited Lake Forest to just 239 yards of total offense last Saturday. That was the lowest total for an opponent since the Vikings limited Grinnell to just 268 yards in 2012.

►The Vikings rank third in the league in total defense at 346.0 yards per game. Lawrence is eighth in scoring defense at 29.5 points per game.

►Sophomore defensive back Zach Eichhorst (Brillion, Wis./Brillion) leads the Vikings with 15 tackles. Defensive back Sam Wagner (Salem, Wis./Burlington Catholic Central) and linebacker Brandon Taylor (Johnsburg, Ill./Johnsburg) are tied for second with 14.

### Buccaneers Update

►Beloit is coming off a rough outing against Monmouth last Saturday. The Scots rolled to a 49-0 lead at the half and went on to a 59-14 victory over the Bucs at Bobby Woll Field in Monmouth, Ill.



►Beloit is looking to snap a 13-game losing streak. Beloit went winless in 2012, and the Bucs haven't won since a 20-14 victory over Lawrence in week nine of the 2011 campaign.

►Beloit's leading rusher is Mason Dixon, who has 41 carries for 145 yards, a 3.5-yard average. Dixon is the son of former Beloit great Steve Dixon. It was Steve Dixon who broke the Wisconsin rushing record of Lawrence All-American Scott Reppert.

►Beloit has only 152 passing yards through two games this season. Kamaron Sallee is the Bucs' leading passer at 6 of 15 for 105 yards and a touchdown.

►The top receiver for Beloit is Michael Nolden, who has five catches for 99 yards and a touchdown.

## 2013 Game Recaps

**September 7**

**Cornell 45, Lawrence 14**

MOUNT VERNON, Iowa — The Cornell College football team scored on its first



five possessions and went on to a 45-14 Midwest Conference win over Lawrence University at Ash Park.

Cornell quarterback Juan Flores had a big day as he completed 21 of 27 passes for 275 yards and three touchdowns.

Lawrence quarterback Luke Barthelmess was only 18 of 41 passing for 155 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions. Barthelmess also ran 20 times for 117 yards and a touchdown.

Cornell (1-0, 1-0 MWC) forced a punt on Lawrence's opening possession of the game and moved 56 yards in only three plays for the first touchdown of the game. Flores hit Justin Cox with a 23-yard scoring pass for a 7-0 lead. After another Lawrence punt, Cornell moved 53 yards in six plays, with Flores connecting with Brit Connor from 18 yards out, for a 14-0 lead.

Myron Seabrook then intercepted Barthelmess on the next possession and ran it back 22 yards for a touchdown and a 21-0 lead. After a Lawrence drive stalled at the Cornell 38-yard line, the Vikings punted. Cornell drove 75 yards in seven plays for another touchdown and a 28-0 lead.

Lawrence (0-1, 0-1) got its first score of the game when Barthelmess hit Taylor Mandich from six yards out for a touchdown. The drive covered 88 yards and took 12 plays and trimmed the lead to 31-7 with 3:59 left in the first half. Mandich finished the day with four catches for 34 yards.

The Vikings picked up their other touchdown early in the fourth quarter after a 12-play, 61-yard drive. Barthelmess ran it from four yards out to cut Cornell's lead to 45-14.

Linebacker Brandon Taylor led Lawrence's defense with 10 tackles.

Jeremy Demlow had 14 tackles, including 3.5 tackles for loss, to pace the Rams.

The Vikings actually had one more first down (22-21) and ran 33 more offensive plays than the Rams. Lawrence enjoyed a huge edge in time of possession (37:04-22:56).

**September 14**

**Lake Forest 14, Lawrence 13**

APPLETON, Wis. — The Lake Forest College football team blocked two fields in the



final three minutes, including one on the last play of the game, to hang on for a 14-13 Midwest Conference win over Lawrence University in the Banta Bowl.

The Foresters (2-0, 1-0 MWC) also blocked an extra point that proved to be the winning margin.

Lawrence trailed by a point when it took over at its own 36-yard line with 9:51 left. The Vikings took 13 plays to move all the way to the Lake Forest two-yard line before being stopped. Freshman Patrick O'Mahoney lined up for a 19-yard field goal, and the kick was blocked. The ball went out of the end zone and Lake Forest took over at its own 20 with 2:41 left.

Lawrence (0-2, 0-2) was out of timeouts, but the Foresters failed to pick up a first down. Lake Forest did the Vikings a favor by throwing an incomplete pass on third down to stop the clock. Lake Forest punted, and Lawrence got the ball back at its own 23 with 47 seconds left.

Lawrence quarterback Luke Barthelmess hit Sam Wagner with a 32-yard completion on the first play to move the ball to the Lake Forest 45. Barthelmess then ripped off runs of 11 and 24 yards to move to the Lake Forest 10-yard line.

After a pair of incompletions, the Vikings were called for offensive pass interference with six seconds left. O'Mahoney lined up for a 42-yard

field goal, but the kick was blocked again as time expired.

Barthelmess ran 21 times for 124 yards, and he completed 24 of 36 passes for 284 yards and a touchdown. Taylor Mandich grabbed seven passes for 95 yards for the Vikings.

The Lawrence offense piled up 450 yards of offense, including 166 on the ground. The Lawrence defense limited Lake Forest to just 239 yards, and the Foresters were just 3-for-11 on third down.

Alec Howe paced the Lake Forest offense by running 20 times for 121 yards. Quarterback Mike Lewis was 8-for-17 for 75 yards and a touchdown.

Lake Forest took a 7-0 lead when it moved 76 yards in six plays with Lewis connecting with Mike Rantis on a 14-yard touchdown pass. Lawrence answered on its next possession as the Vikings went 77 yards in 11 plays for the score. Barthelmess hit Mandich with a seven-yard scoring pass with 1:34 left in the first quarter to tie the game at 7-7.

Lawrence then scored on its next possession to take a 13-7 lead. The Vikings went 49 yards in nine plays, with Isaac Barthelmess scoring his first collegiate touchdown on a three-yard run. Jake Rotkvich blocked the extra point, and the Vikings led by six.

Lake Forest then took the lead for good late in the second quarter. The Foresters went 50 yards in seven plays as Charlie Quinn ripped off a 20-yard touchdown run. Lake Forest converted on the extra point and led 14-13 with 4:48 left in the first half.
