The Series

Lawrence holds a 58-36-5 edge in a series that dates all the way back to 1899. This year marks the 100th game in the series, which is the second-longest rivalry for Lawrence. The Vikings have played 114 games against Ripon, and that series dates to 1893. Lawrence has won three of the last five meetings with Beloit, and that includes a 21-13 victory at the Banta Bowl in 2014.

Last Meeting

Chance Byrd tossed three touchdown passes and Taylor Mandich had a career day as Lawrence topped Beloit 21-13 on Oct. 11, 2014, in a Midwest Conference North Division game at the Banta Bowl.

Byrd, a freshman quarterback

making his first start, was 23-for-36 for 274 yards and three touchdowns. Mandich, a senior receiver from Green Bay, had a career-high eight catches for 130 yards and a touchdown for the Vikings.

The Lawrence defense limited Beloit to 266 yards and made a key stop late in the game to preserve the victory. Linebacker Brandon Taylor paced the Lawrence defense with 14 tackles and two pass breakups.

Beloit was down by eight but got an interception on a tipped ball and took over at the Beloit 35-yard line with 5:30 left. After three consecutive runs by Mason Dixon, who had 31 carries for 132 yards, the Bucs were facing fourth-and-four. Evan Phillips' fourth-down pass was deflected away from receiver Michael Nolden by Taylor to give the ball back to Lawrence.

The Vikings then picked up a pair of first downs to run out the clock.

Beloit led 3-0 in the opening quarter, but Lawrence took the ensu-

ing possession and moved 75 yards in 12 plays for the game's first touchdown. Byrd hit freshman receiver and Appleton native Cole Erickson with an eight-yard touchdown pass to complete the drive and give Lawrence a 7-3 lead.

The Vikings then put together another long scoring drive early in the second quarter. Lawrence went 80 yards in eight plays and Byrd found Trevor Spina with a 24-yard touchdown pass for a 14-3 Lawrence lead with 11:53 left in the first half.

Beloit kicker Kam Sallee connected on a 36-yard field goal midway through the third quarter to cut the lead 14-6.

Sallee then missed a 27-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter, and Lawrence hit on a big play on the next drive. Mandich caught a 55-yard touchdown pass from Byrd, and Lawrence led 21-6 with 8:43 left in the game.

The Bucs marched right back

down the field and Phillips found Sallee on a 12-yard scoring pass on fourth down to cut the margin to 21-13 with 6:45 remaining.

It was Lawrence's homecoming game and marked the Vikings first victory at homecoming since a 17-13 win over Knox College in 2009.

Last Week

Lawrence bolted to a 24-6 lead at the half and rolled to 51-6 nonconference win over Maranatha Baptist last Saturday at Maranatha Stadium.

Three Vikings scored their first career touchdowns, and rookie Lawrence head coach Rob McCarthy picked up his first career victory.

Cam Boerm caught a pair of touchdown passes and Jacob Berman ran for a pair of scores for Lawrence. Senior running back Corey Fisher also got his first career touchdown for the Vikings.


Lawrence freshman quarterback Ryan Butterfield tossed his first two career touchdown passes and finished 6-for-11 passing for 92 yards. He also ran three times for 22 yards. Boerm finished with five catches for 61 yards, and Berman ran eight times for 88 yards and two scores.

Lawrence's other freshman quarterback, Kemani Pittman, also was 8-for-13 and finished with 54 yards passing.

The Vikings, who finished with 420 yards of offense, limited Maranatha to just 236 yards, including just 28 on the ground.

Junior linebacker Jacob Lueck had a team-high 10 tackles for Lawrence and that included 2.0 tackles for loss. Lueck also forced two fumbles and recovered a fumbles. Maranatha fumbled five times on the afternoon and lost all five to the Vikings. Lawrence also intercepted three passes as Hunter Adams, Wes Hetcher and Nick Ulloa all recorded picks.

Lawrence's defense was in the backfield all afternoon as the Vikings picked up seven sacks, including 2.5 by Colt Duncan and 2.0 by Jake Gosti-

The Vikings took advantage of a short field on its first two scoring drives to jump out to a 13-0 lead. Fisher scored on a two-yard run, and Trevor Spina scored from a yard out.

After a Maranatha touchdown cut the lead to 13-6, Lawrence scored twice in the final 2:41 of the first half. Boerm caught a 25-yard touchdown pass, and Pat O'Mahoney kicked a 27-yard field goal to give Lawrence a 24-6

lead at the half.

Dalton Sendelbach had a six-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, and Berman then scored on runs of 39 and 10 yards early in the fourth quarter. The Vikings added a late touchdown by Boerm to finish the scoring.

The Coaches

Rob McCarthy (Concordia Moorhead 1989) is in his first season as Lawrence's head coach and has a record of 1-1 (.500). Seth Duerr (Wooster 2000) is in his second season at Beloit and has a record of 4-8 (.333).

Vikings Update

►The Vikings earned the first career win for rookie head coach Rob McCarthy last Saturday, and the victory moves the Lawrence program closer to a milestone. Lawrence needs three more wins to reach 500.



►Several players had individual firsts last Saturday against Maranatha. Freshmen Cam Boerm (Port Lavaca, Texas/Calhoun), sophomore Jacob Berman (Bethesda, Md./Wallace) and senior Corey Fisher (Glen Ellyn, Ill./Principia) all scored their first career touchdowns. Boerm caught TD passes of 25 and eight yards and finished with five catches for 65 yards. Berman had scoring runs of 39 and 10 yards and finished the day with eight runs for 88 yards and three catches for 32 yards. Fisher scored the game's first TD and had six carries for 75 yards.

►Rookie quarterback Ryan Butterfield (McDonough, Ga./Strong Rock Christian) also threw the first two

touchdown passes of his career against Maranatha. Butterfield finished the game 6-of-11 passing for 92 yards, and he ran three times for 22 yards.

►Lawrence has now scored at least 50 points in a game in four of the last five seasons. Prior to 2011, Lawrence had only scored more than 50 points in a game twice in the previous 12 seasons (a 51-20 win over Knox in 207 and a 52-20 win over Lake Forest in 2005).

►Senior linebacker Colt Duncan (Columbia, Tenn./Zion Christian) picked up Midwest Conference Defensive Player of the Week honors after Lawrence's win over Maranatha.



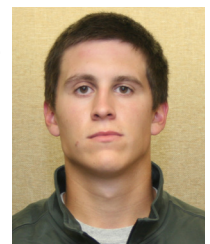

Duncan finished with eight tackles, which included a career-high 2.5

sacks and a career-high 3.0 tackles for loss. Duncan also recovered a fumble. It was the first weekly conference honor for Duncan, and the first time a Lawrence player has won since Patrick O'Mahoney (Evanston, Ill./Evanston Township) was named the Special Teams Player of the Week on Sept. 15, 2014. It was the first time the Vikings have won the Defensive Player of the Week honor since defensive end Andy Paider did it on Oct. 7, 2013.

►Duncan also blocked a 50-yard field goal attempt against Maranatha, and 6-foot-7 freshman Chris Shaw (Bronx, N.Y./Beacon) blocked a PAT attempt. It was the first time Lawrence had blocked two kicks in a game since 2009 when the Vikings blocked two punts in a 17-13 win over Knox.

►Sophomore Jake Gostisha (Appleton, Wis./East) has been simply outstanding in his move from quarterback to defensive end. Gosti-

sha leads the team with 18 tackles and has a team-high 3.0 sacks to go with 3.0 TFLs.

►The Vikings also picked up some firsts on defense as freshman line-backer Hunter Adams (Franklin, Tenn./Page) and sophomore safety Wes Hetcher (Wautoma, Wis./Wautoma) both had first their career interceptions. Adams was later injured in the game and did not return.

►The defense limited Maranatha to just 28 rushing yards on 30 carries last Saturday. That is the lowest rushing total for an opponent since Lawrence held the Sabercats to a minus-32 yards rushing in the Vikings' 59-0 victory in 2014.

►The Vikings recorded 7.0 sacks last Saturday, and that is the most for the Vikings since 6.0 sacks in the first meeting against Grinnell in 2014.

Bucanneers Update

►Beloit is fresh off a 41-31 shootout victory over Grinnell last Saturday to improve to 1-1 on the season. The Bucs are now averaging 45.5 points per game this season after a 51-50 loss in the season opener against Concordia Chicago.



►The Bucs' offense is powered by running back Mason Dixon, who ran for 228 yards and averaged 7.4 yards per carry in the win over Grinnell. It's the third 200-yard game of Dixon's career. Dixon has carried the ball 69 times for 368 yards, a 5.3-yard average, and five touchdowns this season.

►Triggering the passing game is quarterback Danny May. He has completed 47-of-67 passes (70.1 percent) for 573 yards and four touchdowns and three interceptions. May is averaging 286.5 yards passing per contest.

2015 Game Recaps

September 5

Rockford 52, Lawrence 17

APPLETON, Wis. — The Rockford University football team used a powerful running



game to roll to a 52-17 nonconference victory over Lawrence University.

It was the first football game played on the renovated Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Chance Manning ran 32 times for 211 yards and three touchdowns for Rockford (1-0), and he caught two passes for 86 yards and a score. The Regents finished with 58 carries for 438 yards and rolled up 605 yards of offense.

Quarterback Adam O'Malley completed 7-of-13 passes for 167 yards and a touchdown. He also ran 10 times for 62 yards.

Lawrence (0-1) was limited to just 83 yards of offense, including just 25 through the air.

Rockford jumped out to a 21-0 lead after one quarter with a trio of big plays. Pete Berry broke free for a 65-yard scoring run, Manning added a 40-yard TD run and Manning caught a 53-yard touchdown pass.

Manning added two more touchdown runs in the second quarter, and the Regents led 35-0 at the half.

Sophomore Alic Riedel got Lawrence on the board with an 81-yard kickoff return for a touchdown. It was Riedel's first collegiate touchdown.

Austin Tucker's 64-yard fumble return set up Lawrence's next score as the Vikings took over at the Rockford 16-yard line. After an end around by Trevor Spina got the ball to the one-yard line, Spina punched it in from a yard out on the next play to cut the lead to 45-14.

The Vikings later added a 24-yard field goal from Pat O'Mahoney to complete their scoring.

September 12

Lawrence 51, Maranatha 6

WATERTOWN, Wis. — The Lawrence University football team bolted to a 24-6 lead at



the half and rolled to 51-6 nonconference win over Maranatha Baptist University.

Three Vikings (1-1) scored their first career touchdowns, and rookie Lawrence head coach Rob McCarthy picked up his first career victory.

Cam Boerm caught a pair of touchdown passes and Jacob Berman ran for a pair of scores for Lawrence. Senior running back Corey Fisher also got his first career touchdown for the Vikings.

Lawrence freshman quarterback Ryan Butterfield tossed his first two career touchdown passes and finished 6-for-11 passing for 92 yards. He also ran three times for 22 yards. Boerm finished with five catches for 61 yards, and Berman ran eight times for 88 yards and two scores.

Lawrence's other freshman quarterback, Kemani Pittman, also was 8-for-13 and finished with 54 yards passing.

The Vikings, who finished with 420 yards of offense, limited Maranatha (0-2) to just 236 yards, including just 28 on the ground.

Junior linebacker Jacob Lueck had a team-high 10 tackles for Lawrence and that included 2.0 tackles for loss. Lueck also forced two fumbles and recovered a fumbles. Maranatha fumbled five times on the afternoon and lost all five to the Vikings. Lawrence also intercepted three passes as Hunter Adams, Wes Hetcher and Nick Ulloa all recorded picks.

Lawrence's defense was in the backfield all afternoon as the Vikings picked up seven sacks, including 2.5 by Colt Duncan and 2.0 by Jake Gostisha.

The Vikings took advantage of a short field on its first two scoring

drives to jump out to a 13-0 lead. Fisher scored on a two-yard run, and Trevor Spina scored from a yard out.

After a Maranatha touchdown cut the lead to 13-6, Lawrence scored twice in the final 2:41 of the first half. Boerm caught a 25-yard touchdown pass, and Pat O'Mahoney kicked a 27-yard field goal to give Lawrence a 24-6 lead at the half.

Dalton Sendelbach had a six-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, and Berman then scored on runs of 39 and 10 yards early in the fourth quarter. The Vikings added a late touchdown by Boerm to finish the scoring.
