The Series

Lawrence holds a 27-21 lead in the series, which dates back to 1902. Lawrence won a series record eight consecutive games against the Foresters from 1935-82. Lake Forest has won the last six meetings against the Vikings.

Last Meeting

A late rally came up short for Lawrence, and Lake Forest hung on for a 20-16 Midwest Conference win at Farwell Field on Sept. 8, 2012.

Lawrence got a touchdown from quarterback Luke Barthelmess with 15 seconds left, but the onside kick attempt failed and secured the win

for Lake Forest.

Barthelmess was 24 of 43 passing for 362 yards and a touchdown, but he was sacked eight times by the Lake Forest defense. Dan Dubnicka had the biggest game of his Lawrence career with five catches for 136 yards.

Running back Al Mitchell did nearly all the damage for Lake Forest by running 23 times for 202 yards and a touchdown.

Mitchell gave Lake Forest a 6-0 lead when he ran 68 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter. Lawrence cut the lead in half when it drove the ball to the Lake Forest 12 before the drive stalled. Cody Robel booted a 28-yard field goal with 8:54 left in the first half to trim the lead to 6-3.

The Foresters then sacked Barthelmess in the end zone for a safety and an 8-3 lead with 5:20 left in the half. Lake Forest took the ensuing free kick and scored. Joey Valdivia ran 18 yards for the score and a 14-3 lead.

The teams then exchanged fumbles, and Lawrence moved the ball

to the Lake Forest 10 in the final seconds of the first half. Lake Forest got another sack to end the half.

Lawrence trimmed the margin to 14-10 early in the fourth quarter. The Vikings got the ball after Jon Hope intercepted Pete Scaffidi at the Lake Forest 27-yard line. Barthelmess hit Jermaine Taylor for 20 yards, and Ben Hartman then grabbed an eight-yard touchdown pass with 14:17 left in the contest.

Lake Forest countered by driving 69 yards in 12 plays for a touchdown. Alec Howe finished the drive with a two-yard touchdown run, and Lake Forest led 20-14.

Lawrence then drove to the Lake Forest 26, but turned the ball over on downs. The Vikings got the ball back with 1:42 left and moved 98 yards in 10 plays for a touchdown. Barthelmess ran it in from seven yards out to trim the margin to 20-16.

The Vikings touched the ensuing onside kick before it went 10 yards and Lake Forest took a knee to end

Last Week

Cornell scored on its first five possessions last Saturday and went on to a 45-14 Midwest Conference win over Lawrence at Ash Park.

Cornell quarterback Juan Flores had a big day as he completed 21 of 27 passes for 275 yards and three touchdowns.

Lawrence quarterback Luke Barthelmess was only 18 of 41 passing for 155 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions. Barthelmess also ran 20 times for 117 yards and a touchdown.

Cornell forced a punt on Lawrence's opening possession of the game and moved 56 yards in only three plays for the first touchdown of the game. Flores hit Justin Cox with a 23-yard scoring pass for a 7-0 lead.

After another Lawrence punt, Cornell moved 53 yards in only six plays, with Flores connecting with Brit Connor from 18 yards out, for a 14-0 advantage.

Myron Seabrook then intercepted Barthelmess on the next possession and ran it back 22 yards for a touchdown and a 21-0 lead. After a Lawrence drive stalled at the Cornell 38-yard line, the Vikings punted. Cornell drove 75 yards in seven plays for another touchdown and a 28-0 lead.

Lawrence got its first score of the game when Barthelmess hit Taylor Mandich from six yards out for a touchdown. The drive covered 88 yards and took 12 plays and trimmed the lead to 31-7 with 3:59 left in the first half. Mandich finished the day with four catches for 34 yards.

The Vikings picked up their other touchdown early in the fourth quarter after a 12-play, 61-yard drive. Barthelmess ran it from four yards out to cut Cornell's lead to 45-14.

Linebacker Brandon Taylor led Lawrence's defense with 10 tackles. Jeremy Demlow had 14 tackles, including 3.5 tackles for loss, to pace the Rams.

The Vikings acutally had one more first down (22-21) and ran 33 more

Vikings Update

► Lawrence dropped its seventh consecutive season opener with the loss at Cornell last Saturday. The Vikings are 53-66-1 in season openers. The last Lawrence victory in a season opener was a 21-8 win over Minnesota-Morris on Sept. 2, 2006.



► This marks the second consecutive season Lawrence has played an evening home game at the Banta Bowl. Lawrence defeated Beloit 38-14 in the lone night game in 2012.

► Senior quarterback Luke Barthelmess (Appleton, Wis./Principia) picked up a touchdown pass in the game at Cornell and now has 49 for his career. He is one touchdown pass shy of tying Eric Aspenson for second place on the career list. All-American and Lawrence Hall of Famer Jim Petran is the career leader with 59.

► Barthelmess was Lawrence's main running threat against Cornell. Barthelmess ran 20 times for 117 yards for the third 100-yard rushing game of his career and the first since he went for 103 yards against Grinnell on Oct. 27, 2012. Barthelmess ran for a career-best 132 yards in the 2012 season opener against Cornell.

► The Vikings enjoyed a huge advantage in both time of possession and the total number of offensive plays against the Rams. Lawrence had the ball for 37:04 last Saturday, compared to 22:56 for the Rams. Lawrence also ran 33 more plays than Cornell (88-55).

► Cornell offset Lawrence's advantage in both time of possession and number of plays by hitting on several "explosive" plays. The Rams had five

plays of 20 or more yards and a like number of plays that went for at least 15 yards.

► Junior linebacker Brandon Taylor (Johnsburg, Ill./Johnsburg) picked right up where he left off last season. Taylor posted a team-best 10 tackles in the game at Cornell.

► Sophomore defensive lineman Brady Busha (Weston, Wis./Schofield D.C. Everest) posted a career-high four tackles and 2.0 tackles for loss in the season opener against the Rams.

► Lawrence finished eighth in the Midwest Conference in scoring offense at 27.5 points per game in 2012. The Vikings were fifth in total offense at 399.2 yards per contest.

► Lawrence was 11th in the conference in scoring defense, allowing 45.4 points per contest in 2012. The Vikings were 10th in total defense at 475.5 yards per game.

Foresters Update

► Lake Forest got its season off to a great start with a 45-3 drubbing of Concordia (Ill.) in a nonconference game last Saturday. The Foresters led only 7-0 after the first quarter, but Lake Forest pushed that lead to 21-3 at the half and then put the game away with 17 third-quarter points.



► The Foresters rolled up 295 yards of offense, but Lake Forest is retooling a bit after losing a pair of their top players to graduation. Quarterback Mike Lewis takes over for Pete Scaffidi, and Lewis went 13-for-22 for 176 yards, three touchdowns and two interceptions in the season opener. Running back Al Mitchell was lost to graduation, and the Foresters were paced by Charlie Quinn in the opener. Quinn

ran eight times for 90 yards, a healthy 11.2-yard average against Concordia.

►Sophomore kicker/punter Jon Gurchak was named the Midwest Conference Special Teams Player of the Week after kicking a career-long 47-yard field goal for the Foresters in the season opener. Gurchak scored nine points in the game, hitting the field goal and going 6-for-6 on extra points. Gurchak averaged 35.2 yards on five punts and put two inside the 20-yard line. He also put five of his eight kickoffs in the end zone.

►Senior linebacker Jordan Cruz and senior defensive lineman Jake Rotkovich led the Foresters with seven tackles apiece in the season opener.

►The Lake Forest defense, traditionally a strong area of the team, limited Concordia to just 58 yards rushing last week. The Foresters also held Concordia to just 3-for-17 (17.6 percent) on third-down conversions.

Cornell 45, Lawrence 14

MOUNT VERNON, Iowa — The Cornell College football team scored on its first



five possessions and went on to a 45-14 Midwest Conference win over Lawrence University at Ash Park.

Cornell quarterback Juan Flores had a big day as he completed 21 of 27 passes for 275 yards and three touchdowns.

Lawrence quarterback Luke Barthelmess was only 18 of 41 passing for 155 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions. Barthelmess also ran 20 times for 117 yards and a touchdown.

Cornell (1-0, 1-0 MWC) forced a punt on Lawrence's opening possession of the game and moved 56 yards in only three plays for the first touchdown of the game. Flores hit Justin Cox with a 23-yard scoring pass for a 7-0 lead. After another Lawrence punt, Cornell moved 53 yards in six plays, with Flores connecting with Brit Connor from 18 yards out, for a 14-0 lead.

Myron Seabrook then intercepted Barthelmess on the next possession and ran it back 22 yards for a touchdown and a 21-0 lead. After a Lawrence drive stalled at the Cornell 38-yard line, the Vikings punted. Cornell drove 75 yards in seven plays for another touchdown and a 28-0 lead.

Lawrence (0-1, 0-1) got its first score of the game when Barthelmess hit Taylor Mandich from six yards out for a touchdown. The drive covered 88 yards and took 12 plays and trimmed the lead to 31-7 with 3:59 left in the first half. Mandich finished the day with four catches for 34 yards.

The Vikings picked up their other touchdown early in the fourth quarter after a 12-play, 61-yard drive. Barthelmess ran it from four yards out to cut Cornell's lead to 45-14.

Linebacker Brandon Taylor led Lawrence's defense with 10 tackles.

Jeremy Demlow had 14 tackles, including 3.5 tackles for loss, to pace the Rams.

The Vikings actually had one more first down (22-21) and ran 33 more offensive plays than the Rams. Lawrence enjoyed a huge edge in time of possession (37:04-22:56).
