



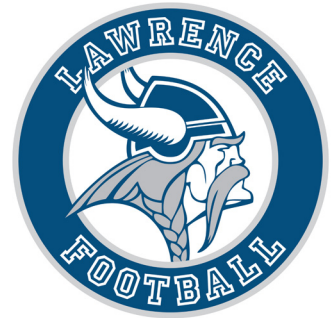

Last Week

Lawrence dug itself a big hole early on Saturday, and Rockford pulled away late for a 34-6 nonconference victory at Sam Greeley Field.

The Regents surged to a 19-0 lead just 11 minutes into the game, and Rockford then put up a pair of touchdowns in a 16-second span in the fourth quarter to seal the win.

Quarterback Andrew Stochl and

receiver Milton Phillips did most of the damage for the Regents. Stochl completed 17-of-27 passes for 291 yards and three touchdowns. Phillips caught five passes for 127 yards and a score.

Lawrence struggled on offense and had just 234 total yards. Rockford rolled up 448 yards of offense.

After two touchdown passes from Stochl and a scoring run from Pete Berry put the Regents up early, Lawrence cut the deficit to 19-6. Freshman Alic Riedel blocked Cody Casazza's punt to give Lawrence the ball at the Rockford 21-yard line. Lawrence scored eight plays later on Tanner Schuh's two-yard run.

Lawrence was driving again in the final minutes of the first half, but Schuh was intercepted in the Rockford end zone to end the threat.

The score remained the same until Rockford drove 73 yards in eight plays midway through the fourth quarter. Stochl hit Dane Kirk with a 22-yard scoring pass for a 27-6 lead with 8:59 left.

On the next play from scrimmage, Pascal Sylla intercepted Lawrence backup quarterback Chance Byrd and returned it 31 yards for a touchdown and a 34-6 lead.

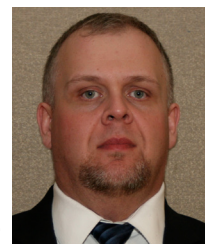
Schuh finished 10-of-29 passing for 103 yards. Byrd was 6-for-16 passing for 68 yards and two interceptions. Byrd led the team with seven carries for 34 yards, and Dan Rothbauer, Taylor Mandich and Tyler Lueck all had four catches apiece for the Vikings.

Vikings Update

►Lawrence had a change atop its program with the unexpected resignation of head coach Mike Barthelmess on Sunday. Barthelmess, who was starting his third season as the head coach, posted a record of 3-18 during his time at Lawrence.



►Director of Athletics Mike Szkodzin-ski named assistant coach Chris Harris as the interim head coach on Monday. Harris, in his second season at Lawrence, coached the offensive line in 2013. He took on the added responsibilities this season of co-offensive coordinator. Harris is the 27th head coach in Lawrence history.

►Lawrence amassed just 234 yards of offense in the season opener. The Vikings had only 63 yards rushing on 31 attempts, an average of 2.0 yards per carry. The most effective runner for the Vikings was reserve quarterback Chance Byrd (Lincoln, Ala./Lincoln), who ran seven times for 34 yards, an average of 4.9 yards.

►Sophomore Tanner Schuh (Appleton, Wis./North) made his first career start at quarterback and completed 10-of-29 passes for 103 yards. Schuh also scored his first career touchdown with a two-yard run in the second quarter. Schuh gave way to Byrd in the third quarter. He was 6-of-16 passing for 68 yards. The quarterbacks combined to throw three interceptions.

►It was a solid debut for freshman defensive back Alic Riedel (Appleton, Wis./East). Riedel blocked the punt of Rockford's Cody Casazza early in the second quarter, and that led to

Lawrence's only touchdown of the afternoon. Riedel recorded the first blocked punt for the Vikings since Sam Wagner blocked the punt of Illinois College's Kevin Fuller on Sept.

29, 2012. Riedel also picked up seven tackles and forced a fumble against the Regents.

►Sophomore defensive end Tony Harth (Madison, Wis./West) had the biggest game of his young career. Harth tied for team-high honors by picking up a career-best eight tackles.

Sabercats Update

►Maranatha Baptist opened its season with a 63-24 nonconference loss against Martin Luther, a college located in New Ulm, Minn. Martin Luther raced to a big lead as the Knights led 30-0 with 10:43 left in the first half. Quarterback Luke Rothe ran for 129 yards on 13 carries for Martin Luther, and he completed 3-of-5 passes for 65 yards and a touchdown.



►Maranatha competes as an independent and has a difficult schedule. The Sabercats will face Washington University (Mo.) and Central in the next five weeks.

►Maranatha has a new head coach in alumnus Nathan Spate. A 1998 graduate of Maranatha and former football standout, Spate took over earlier this year for Andy Peterson, who coached Maranatha for three seasons. Peterson, also a Maranatha graduate, had a 4-26 record.

►In addition to a new coach, Maranatha also has a new nickname and altered the name of the institution. After being the Crusaders since the inception of athletics at Maranatha, the school changed the nickname to Sabercats earlier this year. The school is now Maranatha Baptist University, a change from Maranatha Baptist Bible College.

►Maranatha was held to 281 total yards in the loss at Martin Luther, including 99 on the ground. The Sabercats averaged 89.1 yards rushing a season ago and picked up 213.2 yards through the air.

►Quarterback Tanner Carrillo completed 15-of-28 passes for 182 yards and three touchdowns in the season opener.

►Jordan DeLay is a major receiving and running threat for the Sabercats. DeLay caught 10 passes for 144 yards and three touchdowns against Martin Luther. He also ran five times for 30 yards.

►Against Martin Luther, the defense was paced by linebacker Ben Schulz. He made 14 tackles, including 0.5 tackles for loss. Linebacker Ethan Kennon and defensive back Timothy Matzke both picked up 13 tackles apiece in the opener.

Rockford 34, Lawrence 6

ROCKFORD, Ill.

— The Lawrence University football team dug itself a big hole early, and Rockford University pulled away late for a 34-6 nonconference victory at Sam Greeley Field.



The Regents (1-0) surged to a 19-0 lead just 11 minutes into the game, and Rockford then put up a pair of touchdowns in a 16-second span in the fourth quarter to seal the win.

Quarterback Andrew Stochl and receiver Milton Phillips did most of the damage for the Regents. Stochl completed 17-of-27 passes for 291 yards and three touchdowns. Phillips caught five passes for 127 yards and a score.

Lawrence (0-1) struggled on offense and had just 234 total yards. Rockford rolled up 448 yards of offense.

After two touchdown passes from Stochl and a scoring run from Pete Berry put the Regents up early, Lawrence cut the deficit to 19-6. Freshman Alic Riedel blocked Cody Casazza's punt to give Lawrence the ball at the Rockford 21-yard line. Lawrence scored eight plays later on Tanner Schuh's two-yard run.

Lawrence was driving again in the final minutes of the first half, but Schuh was intercepted in the Rockford end zone to end the threat.

The score remained the same until Rockford drove 73 yards in eight plays midway through the fourth quarter. Stochl hit Dane Kirk with a 22-yard scoring pass for a 27-6 lead with 8:59 left.

On the next play from scrimmage, Pascal Sylla intercepted Lawrence backup quarterback Chance Byrd and returned it 31 yards for a touchdown and a 34-6 lead.

Schuh finished 10-of-29 passing for 103 yards. Byrd was 6-for-16 passing for 68 yards and two interceptions.

Byrd led the team with seven carries for 34 yards, and Dan Rothbauer, Taylor Mandich and Tyler Lueck all had four catches apiece for the Vikings.
