The Series

This is the second meeting with Maranatha Baptist, and the Vikings won the first game 59-0 on Sept. 13, 2014, in the Banta Bowl. This is Lawrence's first trip to Watertown.

Last Meeting

Lawrence routed Maranatha Baptist 59-0 on Sept. 13, 2014, in a nonconference game at the Banta Bowl.

Lawrence quarterback Tanner Schuh played only the first half but ran for 99 yards and a touchdown and threw for 244 and two touchdowns as the Vikings bolted a 28-0 lead at the half. Backup quarterback Chance Byrd completed 11 of 15 passes for 152 yards and two touchdowns and ran 11 times for 46 yards and a score.

Taylor Mandich grabbed seven passes for 181 yards and three touchdowns, including a 70-yard scoring pass in the first half. Dalton Sendelbach added 14 carries for 89 yards and a touchdown for the Vikings. Lawrence kicker Patrick O'Mahoney also tied the school record of Cody Robel and Kraig Krueger with eight extra points.

The Lawrence defense, which held Maranatha to just 76 yards, recorded its first shutout since beating Ripon College 26-0 in 1991. It was a team effort on defense with Tony Harth leading the way with six tackles, including a sack and 2.5 tackles for loss. Lawrence limited Maranatha (0-2) to 20 carries for a minus-32 yards on the ground.

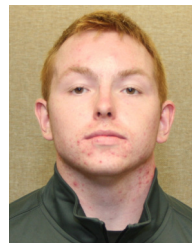
The Vikings also intercepted five passes, one each by Alic Riedel, Dan Taylor, Nick Ulloa, Jake Walker and

defensive end Gabor Bukszar.

Lawrence scored touchdowns on its first three possessions and four of its first five. Trevor Spina had a four-yard run for the first touchdown, and Schuh scored from three yards out on the next drive for a 14-0 lead.

After Mandich had his 55-yard touchdown catch called back due to a penalty, he hooked up with Schuh on a 70-yard scoring pass on the next play for a 21-0 lead. Mandich then caught a 23-yard scoring pass with 4:51 left in the second quarter to put the Vikings up 28-0.

Lawrence got a 21-yard field goal from O'Mahoney to make it 31-0 midway through the third quarter. The Vikings then picked up touchdowns on four of their next five possessions to complete the scoring. Byrd connected with Cole Erickson on an 11-yard touchdown pass and then hit Mandich from 21 yards out to push the lead to 45-0 after three quarters. Byrd had a 19-yard scoring run in

the fourth quarter, and Sendelbach finished the scoring with a 20-yard touchdown scamper.

The big bright spot for the Sabercats was linebacker Ethan Kennon, who recorded 21 tackles, including 15 solo.

Last Week

Rockford used a powerful running game to roll to a 52-17 nonconference victory over Lawrence last Saturday.

It was the first football game played on the renovated Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Chance Manning ran 32 times for 211 yards and three touchdowns for Rockford, and he caught two passes for 86 yards and a score. The Regents finished with 58 carries for 438 yards and rolled up 605 yards of offense.

Quarterback Adam O'Malley completed 7-of-13 passes for 167 yards and a touchdown. He also ran 10 times for 62 yards.

Lawrence was limited to just 83 yards of offense, including just 25 through the air.

Rockford jumped out to a 21-0 lead after one quarter with a trio of big plays. Pete Berry broke free for a 65-yard scoring run, Manning added a 40-yard TD run and Manning caught a 53-yard touchdown pass.

Manning added two more touchdown runs in the second quarter, and the Regents led 35-0 at the half.

Sophomore Alic Riedel got Lawrence on the board with an 81-yard kickoff return for a touchdown. It was Riedel's first collegiate touchdown.

Austin Tucker's 64-yard fumble return set up Lawrence's next score as the Vikings took over at the Rockford 16-yard line.

Trevor Spina punched it in from a yard out two plays later to cut the lead to 45-14.

The Vikings later added a 24-yard field goal from Pat O'Mahoney to complete their scoring.

Vikings Update

►The Vikings bounced back after a rough first half last Saturday and played Rockford to a 17-17 stalemate in the final two quarters.



►Last Saturday marked the warmest season opener in more than a decade. With temperatures hovering in the high 80s with oppressing humidity, it was a sticky afternoon on the Ron Roberts Field turf. It marked the warmest home opener since 2004 vs. Knox, when the kickoff temperature was 83 degrees on Sept. 4. It was the hottest opener since the first game of the 2002 season when the kickoff temperature was 87 degrees for Lawrence's game at Wisconsin Lutheran. That contest was played on the artificial turf at Marquette's Valley Fields.

►Lawrence's two freshman quarterbacks both played two quarters in the season opener. Kemani Pittman (Covington, Ga./Rockdale County) got the starting nod and played the first and third quarters. He had five carries for five yards and completed 1-of-5 passes for nine yards and an interception. Rookie Ryan Butterfield saw action in the second and fourth quarters. He ran four times for 18 yards and completed 2-of-6 passes for 16 yards.

►The first offensive fireworks of the season came on special teams from cornerback Alic Riedel (Appleton, Wis./East). Riedel took his first career kickoff return all the way back, 81 yards for a touchdown. It marked the first time Lawrence had returned

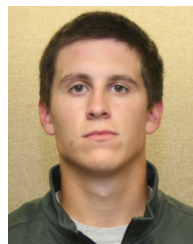
a kickoff for a touchdown since Sam Wagner did it in the season opener against St. Scholastica in 2010. That also was Wagner's first career kickoff return. Riedel's kickoff return was chosen as the Midwest Conference Play of the Week. On defense, Riedel finished the game with two pass breakups and a tackle.

►Punter Cole Erickson (Appleton, Wis./North) was forced to kick eight times last Saturday but did a superb job. He averaged 39.8 yards per kick and downed two punts inside the 20. Erickson also launched a career-long 60-yard punt.

started fall camp as a quarterback but has made the conversion to defensive end. Gostisha finished with nine tackles, including 2.0 TFLs and 1.0 sacks. Rookie linebacker Hunter Adams (Franklin, Tenn./Page) finished with a game-high 10 tackles, and freshman

linebacker/defensive lineman Chris Edwards (Avondale, Ariz./Buckeye Union) made eight stops.

► Hard-hitting sophomore defensive back Carl Olsen (Bishop, Calif./Union) made a career-high eight tackles against Rockford. Olsen's previous best was seven tackles last season vs. Macalester.

►Despite having to come out of the game with an injury, sophomore linebacker Dan Rothbauer (Appleton, Wis./North) had an impact. He made five tackles, including 1.5 TFLs, and forced and recovered a fumble.

Sabercats Update

►Maranatha Baptist dropped its season opener 35-0 at Martin Luther last Saturday.



The Sabercats were limited to just 141 yards on offense while Martin Luther rolled up 434 yards, including 296 on the ground.

►Maranatha has now been shut out in three consecutive contests and four of its last six.

►Tanner Carrillo got the starter at quarterback for Maranatha and completed 8-of-24 passes for 77 yards in the opener. Jowan Williams caught four passes for 28 yards to pace the Sabercats.

►The top runner for Maranatha was Clint Saxon, who ran 17 times for 42 yards.

►Junior linebacker Ben Schulz was the top tackler in week one as he made 11 stops, all solo, and picked up 1.0 TFLs and forced a fumble. Freshman Christopher Webb had a great

►The Sabercats are in a similar situation as Lawrence with a small squad. Maranatha has 34 players listed on its roster.

►Maranatha failed to complete its schedule in 2014. After dropping the first six games of the season, the Sabercats' final four games were canceled last fall.

►Maranatha is a NCAA Division III member and competes as part of the Association of Division III Independents and in the National Christian College Athletic Association.

2015 Game Recaps

Rockford 52, Lawrence 17

APPLETON, Wis. — The Rockford University football team used



a powerful running game to roll to a 52-17 nonconference victory over Lawrence University.

It was the first football game played on the renovated Ron Roberts Field at the Banta Bowl.

Chance Manning ran 32 times for 211 yards and three touchdowns for Rockford (1-0), and he caught two passes for 86 yards and a score. The Regents finished with 58 carries for 438 yards and rolled up 605 yards of offense.

Quarterback Adam O'Malley completed 7-of-13 passes for 167 yards and a touchdown. He also ran 10 times for 62 yards.

Lawrence (0-1) was limited to just 83 yards of offense, including just 25 through the air.

Rockford jumped out to a 21-0 lead after one quarter with a trio of big plays. Pete Berry broke free for a 65-yard scoring run, Manning added a 40-yard TD run and Manning caught a 53-yard touchdown pass.

Manning added two more touchdown runs in the second quarter, and the Regents led 35-0 at the half.

Sophomore Alic Riedel got Lawrence on the board with an 81-yard kickoff return for a touchdown. It was Riedel's first collegiate touchdown.

Austin Tucker's 64-yard fumble return set up Lawrence's next score as the Vikings took over at the Rockford 16-yard line. Trevor Spina punched it in from a yard out two plays later to cut the lead to 45-14.

The Vikings later added a 24-yard field goal from Pat O'Mahoney to complete their scoring.
