THE COACHES

▶Mike Szkodzinski (St. Norbert 2000) is in his seventh season at Lawrence and has a record of 88-101-17 (.468).

▶Chris Brooks (Western Michigan 1996) is in his third season at UW-Stevens Point and has a record of 38-23-5 (.614).

▶Matt Loen (UW-Eau Claire 1995) is in his seventh season at UW-Eau Claire and has a record of 89-75-13 (.540).

THE SERIES

▶UW-Stevens Point holds a 4-1-0 edge in the series with Lawrence, but the last meeting was a 5-4 victory for the Vikings back in 2010-11.

▶UW-Eau Claire has a 3-1-0 edge in the series with Lawrence. The Vikings' only victory in the series was a 3-2 win back in 2009-10. The teams haven't played since the 2010-11 season.

LAST SERIES

Lawrence scored three times in the third period and displayed a dominant power play en route to a 5-2 nonconference hockey win over St. Mary's (Minn.) on Tuesday.

Lawrence scored twice on the power play in a span of 1:01 in the third period to seal the victory, and the Vikings finished 4-for-8 on the man-advantage.

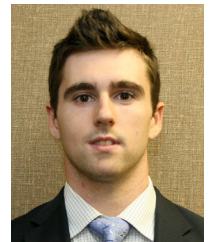
After Lawrence grabbed a 3-1 lead on Ryan Eardley's first career goal at 3:18 of the third period, St. Mary's cut the lead to one goal with a power-play goal at the 9:50 mark.

The Cardinals were back on the power play when Renato Engler got sent off for hooking at 13:28, but St. Mary's was whistled for a pair of penalties in the next 1:29.

The Vikings made them pay with a pair of goals. Lawrence had a two-man advantage when William Thoren scored at the 15:43 to put the Vikings up 4-2. Logan Lemirande then sealed the win with another power-play goal at 16:44.

Lawrence grabbed a 2-0 lead with a pair of power-play goals in the opening period. Ryan Rumble got the scoring started for the Vikings with a tally at the 4:50 mark, and Engler scored at 13:08 for the 2-0 edge.

Lawrence goaltender Anton Olsson made 28 saves to pick up the win. Phil Heinle stopped 24 shots and took the loss.

VIKINGS UPDATE

►Lawrence continues its stretch of games against tough opponents with two members of the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference this weekend. UW-Stevens Point checks in at No. 4 in the USCHO.com poll this week, and UW-Eau Claire is at No. 10. Both of these teams were members of the previous incarnation of the Northern Collegiate Hockey Association. The five WIAC schools moved out of the NCHA to play just under the auspices of the WIAC.

►Lawrence is on a modest two-game winning streak and will go for a three in a row at UW-Stevens Point on Friday. Lawrence has not won three straight since a stretch where the Vikings won six in a row from Jan. 27-Feb. 11, 2012.

►Lawrence racked up four power-play goals in the win over St. Mary's, and the Vikings finished 4-for-8 on the man-advantage. That is the most power-play goals for the Vikings since they tallied three of them in an 8-6 win at Northland on Nov. 10, 2012.

►Lawrence has four players tied for the team lead with two power-play goals apiece. Logan Lemirande (Janesville, Wis.), Huck Saunders (Seattle, Wash.), William Thoren (Gothenburg, Sweden) and Ryan Rumble (Newmarket, Ontario) have all lit the lamp twice on the man-advantage.

►Freshman forward Blake Roubos (Niagara Falls, Ontario) continues to lead the team in scoring with 15 points. Roubos leads the squad with six goals and is tied for second with nine assists.

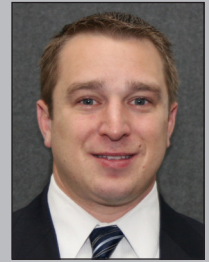

►Defenseman Brandon Boelter (Saginaw, Mich.) leads the team with 10 assists and is tied with for third place on the team with 11 points. Boelter leads all NCHA defensemen at 1.00 points per game.

►Freshman forward Ryan Eardley (Ile Bizard, Quebec) picked up his first career goal in just his fifth game. His third-period tally against St. Mary's on Tuesday proved to be the game-winner.

►Junior goaltender Anton Olsson (Stromstad, Sweden) made his fifth consecutive start in net since returning from an injury last month. Olsson is now 3-4-1 on the season with a .903 save percentage and 3.68 goals against average.

►After being beset by injuries in the first month of the season, the Vikings are getting a bit more healthy. Freshman defenseman Felix Henriksson (Helsinki, Finland) had missed the previous three games but returned to the lineup Tuesday against St. Mary's.

►The Vikings really helped their power-play percentage with the performance against St. Mary's and are now at 18.0 percent (11-61). That ranks fourth in the NCHA.

►Lawrence went 3-for-5 on the penalty kill and dropped to 79.3 percent (46-for-58) this season. That ranks eighth in the league.

►Lawrence ranks fifth in the league in scoring offense at 3.09 goals per game. The Vikings are eighth in scoring defense at 4.00 goals per contest.

►Lawrence leads the NCHA in penalty minutes at 20.8 per game. Two teams, Marian (87) and Concordia (80) have been whistled for more penalties this season than Lawrence (79).

►One last tidbit from the win over St. Norbert last Saturday. The Green Knights have allowed only eight third-period goals all season, and four of them were scored in last Saturday's game by Lawrence.

SCOUTING UW-STEVENS POINT

►The fourth-ranked Pointers are coming off their first loss of the season. UW-Stout topped Stevens Point 3-2 on the Pointers' home ice last Saturday. Joe Kalisz scored with 2:10 left for the Pointers, but Stevens Point could not get the equalizer. Stout won despite being outshot 61-17 by the Pointers.



►Senior forward Garrett Ladd leads the Pointers in goals and points. Ladd has 10 goals to go along with nine assists for 19 points in 10 games.

►Freshman forward Kyle Sharkey is tied for the team lead with nine assists.

►Two of freshman forward Lawrence Cornellier's five goals this season have been short-handers.

►Junior goaltender Brandon Jaeger has played all but 60 minutes in net this season. He has an impressive 1.67 goals against average and .918 save percentage to go along with his sparkling 8-1-0 record.

►Stevens Point enters the game leading the WIAC in scoring offense at 5.60 goals per game. The Pointers are also first in scoring defense, allowing just 1.50 goals per contest.

►Stevens Point has scored on just 15.3 percent (8-53) of its power plays, and that ranks fourth among the five WIAC teams.

►The Pointers have been outstanding on the penalty kill at 91.7 percent (55-60). That ranks second in the league.

SCOUTING UW-EAU CLAIRE

►UW-Eau Claire started the season on a four-game win streak, but the Blugolds are just 1-3-2 in their last six contests. Eau Claire is coming off a 2-2 tie at UW-Superior last Saturday.



►Eau Claire is fresh off winning the NCAA Division III championship last season. The Blugolds defeated Oswego 5-3 for the title at Lake Placid.

►Senior forward Jon Waggoner and junior forward Joe Krause are tied for the team lead with nine points. Waggoner has a team-high five goals, and Charles Thauwald, Jack Callahan and Daniel Olszewski are all tied for top honors with six assists.

►Waggoner leads the team with two power-play goals, and the Blugolds have only four power-play goals this season.

►The Blugolds are at 11.4 percent (4-35) on the power play. That ranks last in the WIAC. Eau Claire is tops in the league on the penalty kill at 92.5 percent (37-40).

►Eau Claire is third in the WIAC in scoring offense at 3.33 goals per game. The Blugolds are also are third in scoring defense at 2.67.

►Sophomore goaltender Tyler Green has seen the bulk of the action in net this season. Green has been solid with a 3-3-0 record to go with a .901 save percentage and 3.18 goals against average.
