THE COACHES

► Mike Szkodzinski (St. Norbert 2000) is in his seventh season at Lawrence and has a record of 88-103-17 (.464).

▶ Chris Brooks (Western Michigan 1996) is in his third season at UW-Stevens Point and has a record of 40-23-5 (.625).

► Matt Loen (UW-Eau Claire 1995) is in his seventh season at UW-Eau Claire and has a record of 91-75-13 (.545).

THE SERIES

▶UW-Stevens Point holds a 5-1-0 edge in the series with Lawrence, and the last victory for the Vikings was a 5-4 decision back in 2010-11.

▶UW-Eau Claire has a 4-1-0 edge in the series with Lawrence. The Vikings' only victory in the series was a 3-2 win back in 2009-10. The teams hadn't played since the 2010-11 season before playing in December.

LAST SERIES

Lawrence dropped a pair of nonconference games against Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference rivals before taking a break for the holidays.

No. 3 UW-Stevens Point stopped Lawrence 9-2 at Willett Arena on Dec. 13.

Lawrence trailed 2-1 heading into the second period when the Pointers scored three goals in the second period and added two more early in the third to take command.

Scott Heneger scored two goals for Stevens Point, and Nick D'Avlio added a goal and two assists.

Ryan Eardley scored in the first period for the Vikings, and Paul Zuke picked up a goal in the third period. Gustav Lindgren assisted on both goals for Lawrence.

Anton Olsson played the first 27 minutes in goal for Lawrence and took the loss. Spencer Viele made 11 saves to pick up the win for Stevens Point.

Tenth-ranked UW-Eau Claire downed Lawrence 5-0 on Dec. 14 at the Appleton Family Ice Center.

Eau Claire broke open a close game with two goals early in the third period. The Blugolds led 2-0 when Preston Hodge scored just 2:59 into the period. Eau Claire then added a power-play goal from Jon Waggoner just 1:27 later to put the advantage to 4-0.

Jay Deo was outstanding in net and made 14 saves to pick up the shutout for Eau Claire. Mattias Soderqvist stopped 33 shots for the Vikings.

Eau Claire jumped on top mid-

way through the first period when Joe Krause scored with an extra attacker on the ice following a delayed penalty. Krause made it 2-0 at 9:04 of the second.

The Blugolds had a 38-14 edge in shots on goal and went 2-for-6 on the power play. Lawrence was 0-for-2 on the man-advantage.

VIKINGS UPDATE

Lawrence returns from its break for the holidays and heads right into a brutal weekend of games. The Vikings face the second- and 10th-



ranked teams in the nation on the road this weekend. These are the final two nonconference games of the season. After this weekend, Lawrence will play 10 consecutive Northern Collegiate Hockey Association games to finish the regular season.

▶Freshman forward Blake Roubos (Niagara Falls, Ontario) ended the first half of the season as the team's leading scorer. He has six goals and nine as- Blake Roubos sists for 15 points in



13 games. Roubos started the season with at least one point in each of his first seven games. He has been limited to one goal and one assist in the last six games.

▶Roubos, who leads the team with six goals, ranks first in the league in freshman scoring at 1.15 points per game.

Sophomore defenseman Brandon Boelter (Saginaw, Mich.) is tops on the team with 10 assists and has 11 points. Boelter is the top scoring defenseman Brandon Boelter in the conference at 0.85 points per contest.

▶ Freshman goaltender Mattias Soderqvist (Stockholm, Sweden) made his first Lawrence start in the loss to UW-Eau Claire back in December. Soderqvist had a rough debut in relief against UW-Stevens Point, but he is likely to see more action this weekend.

▶ Junior goaltender Anton Olsson (Stromstad, Sweden) has seen the vast majority of action in net. He is tops on the team with a 3.95 goals against aver- Anton Olsson age and .898 save



percentage. Olsson also has one assist, which he picked up in Lawrence's win over St. Mary's on Dec. 10.

- Lawrence added a new player during the break for the holidays. Defenseman Ryan Robertson (Atlanta, Ga.) has joined the team. He last played for the Nepean Raiders of the Central Canada Hockey League.
- ▶The Vikings rank fourth in the NCHA on the power play at 16.9 percent. Lawrence has converted 11 of 65 chances on the man-advantage.
- Lawrence has slipped to ninth in the league on the penalty kill at 76.5 percent. Lawrence has killed off 52 of 68 power-play chances.
- ▶Lawrence ranks sixth in the league in scoring offense at 2.77 goals per game. The Vikings are eighth in scoring defense at 4.46 goals per contest.
- ▶Lawrence has struggled in the defensive zone this season. The Vikings have allowed 25 third-period goals, which is tied for worst in the NCHA.

▶UWSP needed a big rally to post a 4-3 victory at fellow NCHA school Lake Forest last Saturday. The Pointers trailed 3-1 with six minutes left in the second period before scoring twice late in the period to tie it. Stevens Point then got a goal seven minutes into the third period to win it.

▶UWSP's only loss this season was a 3-2 setback to UW-Stout in December.

Senior forward Garrett Ladd leads the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference in scoring at 1.92 points per game. Ladd is tops on the team in both goals (12) and assists (11) and has 23 points.

▶ Junior goaltender Brandon Jaeger has seen nearly all the action for the Pointers in net. He has an impressive 9-1-0 record with a 1.80 goals against average and .917 save percentage.

▶UWSP is the top scoring team in the IWAC at 5.75 goals per game. The Pointers are also tops in scoring defense at 1.67 goals per game.

▶The Pointers are second in the WIAC and sixth nationally on the penalty kill at 92.1 percent. Stevens Point is 58-for-63 on the penalty kill.

Stevens Point ranks third in the WIAC on the power play at 17.2 percent. The Pointers are 10-for-58 on the man advantage.

▶The Blugolds have a balanced attack led by junior forward Joe Krause. Krause has a team-high seven goals to go along with seven assists for a team-leading 14 points. Senior forward Jon Waggoner is tied for second on the squad with junior defenseman Jack Callahan with 11 points. Callahan leads the team with nine assists.

▶Sophomore Tyler Green and freshman Jay Deo have split time in net this season. Deo is 4-0-1 with a stunning .962 save percentage and 0.79 goals against average. Deo leads the WIAC in both categories. Green is impressive as well with a .901 save percentage and 3.18 GAA with a 3-3-0 record.

▶Eau Claire ranks second in the WIAC in scoring offense at 3.73 goals per game. The Blugolds are third in the league in scoring defense at 2.27 goals per game.

▶The Blugolds are first in the WIAC and second nationally on the penalty kill at 93.6 percent. Eau Claire has allowed only three goals on the power play and has killed off 44 of 47 power-play chances.

▶The Blugolds are last in the WIAC on the power play at 15.1 percent and have converted just 8 of 53 opportunities.
