THE COACHES

►Mike Szkodzinski (St. Norbert 2000) is in his eighth season at Lawrence and has a record of 88-107-17 (.455).

►Mark Wick (St. Scholastica 1985) is in his 10th season at St. Scholastica and has a record of 128-107-33 (.539). Wick is in his 15th season overall and has a record of 164-141-36 (.534).

THE SERIES

►St. Scholastica holds a 7-1-1 lead in a series that started in the 2001-02 season. Lawrence's lone victory in the series was a 4-2 win in the 2010-11 season. The Saints have won the last two games in the rivalry.

LAST SERIES

Lawrence managed only one goal in two games with the Milwaukee School of Engineering last weekend and dropped both contests to the Raiders.

Steven Shaffroth's second-period goal was the lone tally as MSOE downed Lawrence 1-0 last Friday in a Northern Collegiate Hockey Associa-

tion game at the Kern Center.

Shaffroth scored his second goal of the season at the 15:03 mark of the second off assists from West Bauman and Michael Thompson.

Austin Campbell stopped 22 shots to pick up the shutout for MSOE. Mattias Soderqvist made 50 saves but took the loss for Lawrence.

MSOE shut down the Lawrence attack again on Saturday night and posted a 4-1 victory at the Appleton Family Ice Center.

MSOE jumped out to a 2-0 lead, and Lawrence never got its offense going. The Vikings were limited to a short-handed goal.

Nick Kohn made 27 saves to pick up the win for the Raiders. Soderqvist stopped 23 shots for the Vikings.

MSOE got on the board just 3:44 into the game when Michael Thompson scored off a pass from Bauman. Laurie Genei then scored his first goal of the night, a power-play tally, at the 8:21 mark to give the Raiders a 2-0 edge.

Lawrence cut the lead in half when William Thoren scored a short-hander off a pass from Matt Moore at the 14:20 mark.

That was it for the Lawrence offense as MSOE added a second period goal from Genei, and a third-period score from Bauman to finish the scoring.

VIKINGS UPDATE

►Lawrence is looking to bounce back from a rough offensive weekend against MSOE. The Vikings were limited to one goal in the two-game series (a 1-0 loss and 4-1 loss). Lawrence hasn't been held to one goal in a two-game series in the 2008-09 season when the Vikings lost 2-0 to Marian and then tied the Sabres 1-1.

►Freshman forward Blake Roubos (Niagara Falls, Ontario) played in only one game last weekend due to injury but he continues to lead the team in scoring. Roubos is tops on the squad with seven goals and has 10 assists for a team-best 17 points.

►Roubos ranks first in the Northern Collegiate Hockey Association in freshman scoring at 1.06 points per game. St. Norbert's Blake Thompson is second at 1.00 points per game.

►Lawrence's offense took a hit last week when sophomore forward Rudi Pino (Vancouver, Wash.) was lost for the season due to injury. Pino, who had 25 points last season, had five goals and four assists for nine points in 15 games this season.

►Sophomore defenseman Brandon Boelter (Saginaw, Mich.) leads the team with 11 assists and is tied for third with 12 points. Boelter ranks fourth in the NCHA for defenseman scoring at 0.71 points per game.

►The only goal the Vikings scored last weekend was a short-hander on Saturday by senior defenseman William Thoren (Gothenburg, Sweden). It was the second short-hander of the season for Lawrence and the second of Thoren's career.

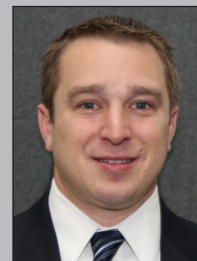

►Freshman goaltender Mattias Soderqvist (Stockholm, Sweden) got the starting nod in both games last weekend. He stopped a season-best 50 shots in the game at MSOE last Friday and allowed a season-low one goal. Soderqvist improved to an .896 save percentage and 4.28 goals against average on the season.

►The Vikings went 0-for-8 on the power play last weekend and ranks sixth in the league on the power play at 13.8 percent. Lawrence is 11-for-80 on the man-advantage this season.

►Lawrence went killed off 7-of-8 power plays last weekend and ranks eighth in the league on the penalty kill at 80.9 percent. Lawrence is 72-for-89 on the penalty kill.

►Lawrence ranks eighth in the league in scoring offense at 2.29 goals per game. The Vikings are eighth in scoring defense at 4.35 goals per contest.

SCOUTING ST. SCHOLASTICA

►St. Scholastica battled No. 1-ranked Adrian last weekend and came away with a point. The Saints skated to a 1-1 tie with Adrian last Friday as the Bulldogs got the tying goal early in the third period. Adrian then pulled out a 4-3 overtime victory on Saturday. The Bulldogs tied it at 3-3 on Duston Hebebrand's goal at the 14:33 mark of the third and then won it on Justin Basso's goal 1:58 into overtime.



►The Saints have a balanced attack with six players with at least 11 points. Sixteen players have scored at least one goal for St. Scholastica.

►Leading the team in goals and points is Brandon Nowakowski. The senior forward has nine goals to go along with eight assists for 17 points.

►Junior defenseman Matt Malenstyn has a team-high nine assists to go with two goals for 11 points.

►St. Scholastica ranks fourth in the league in scoring offense at 3.29 goals per game. The Saints are third in scoring defense at 2.41 goals per game.

►The Saints rank second in the league on the power play at 22.6 percent. St. Scholastica has converted 12-of-53 chances on the power play.

►St. Scholastica also is third in the league on the penalty kill at 86.4 percent. The Saints have killed off 57-of-66 of their opponents' power-play opportunities.
