### THE COACHES

►Mike Szkodzinski (St. Norbert 2000) is in his eighth season at Lawrence and has a record of 89-110-17 (.451).

►Ron Fogerty (Colgate 1995) is in his seventh season at Adrian and has a record of 162-21-9 (.867).

### THE SERIES

►Adrian holds a 13-0-2 record against the Vikings in a series that started in the 2007-08 season. Lawrence picked up both of the ties in the series last season.

### LAST SERIES

Lake Forest posted a shutout and an overtime victory to sweep a week-end Northern Collegiate Hockey Association series from Lawrence.

Lake Forest College scored six times in the second period and went on to a 7-0 victory over Lawrence last Friday at the Appleton Family Ice Center.

Luke Swardenski scored a pair of goals, and Mike Violette had a goal and three assists to pace the Foresters.

Leo Podolsky stopped 31 shots

to pick up the shutout for Lake Forest. Mattias Soderqvist played the first 30 minutes and took the loss for Lawrence.

After a scoreless first period, the Foresters took advantage of some power-play chances and raced away to a big lead. Jack Lewis and Swardenski both scored on the power play in the first 4:38 of the second period to put the Foresters up 2-0.

Violette scored at the 6:07 mark, and Andrew Stein added a power-play goal at 9:16 to make it 4-0. Lake Forest added two more goals in the next 4:35 to build a 6-0 edge.

The Foresters fired 23 shots on net in the second period and had a 51-31 edge in shots for the game.

Bobby Barrett scored 53 seconds into overtime to lift Lake Forest to a 3-2 victory over Lawrence on Saturday at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse.

Lawrence had built a 2-1 lead in the second period, but the Vikings couldn't hang on. Senior forward Huck Saunders scored both goals for the Vikings.

Saunders scored just 28 seconds into the game to give Lawrence a 1-0 advantage. Mcauley Banning tied it for Lake Forest midway through the first period, but Saunders gave Lawrence a 2-1 lead with a power-play goal with 4:29 left in the second period.

Banning then scored 4:09 into the third period to tie it at 2-2.

Podolsky made 20 saves to get the win for Lake Forest. Soderqvist stopped 39 shots and took the loss for Lawrence.

### VIKINGS UPDATE

►Lawrence is hanging onto the eighth, and final, playoff spot by just two points. The Vikings have eight points and Northland is in ninth place with



six points. While Lawrence has a tough test heading to Adrian this weekend, Northland also has to go on the road as it travels to Concordia (Wis.).

►Since Lawrence started a conference affiliation for the 1997-98, the Vikings have only missed the league playoffs once. Lawrence didn't participate in the conference playoffs in the 1999-2000 season when the team went 1-15-1 in Dave Ruhly's first season as head coach.

►After this weekend's two games, 10 of Lawrence's 23 games this season will have been against ranked opponents.

►Senior forward Huck Saunders (Seattle, Wash.) continues to be Lawrence's hottest player on offense lately. Saunders scored both goals in Lawrence's 3-2 loss at Lake Forest last Saturday. Saunders has now scored Lawrence's last five goals over a span of four games.

►Saunders has the team lead with 11 goals, including a team-best four on the power play, and ranks second on the squad with 17 points.

►With 24 career goals, Saunders is now tied with Josh DeSmit for 18th place on Lawrence's career list.

►Freshman forward Blake Roubos (Niagara Falls, Ontario) leads the team with 20 points and is tied for the team lead with defenseman Brandon Boelter (Saginaw, Mich.) with 13 assists.

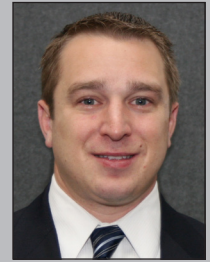

►Roubos ranks first in the Northern Collegiate Hockey Association in freshman scoring at 1.00 points per game. He is tied with St. Norbert defenseman Blake Thompson.

►Freshman goaltender Mattias Soderqvist (Stockholm, Sweden) was spectacular in the first period last Friday against Lake Forest but ended up being touched for four goals, including three on the power play, in the second period. Soderqvist bounced back to make 39 saves at Lake Forest on Saturday.

►On the season, Soderqvist has a .903 save percentage and a 3.90 goals against average. He leads the team in both categories.

►The Vikings went 1-for-7 on the power play last weekend and rank seventh in the league on the power play at 13.1 percent. Lawrence is 13-for-99 on the man-advantage this season.

►Lawrence is ninth in the league on the penalty kill after Lake Forest went 3-for-10 this past weekend. The Vikings are now at 78.9 percent (86-for-109) on the penalty kill this season.

►Only MSOE (111) has had to kill off more penalties this season than the Vikings.

►Lawrence ranks eighth in the league in scoring offense at 2.14 goals per game. The Vikings are eighth in scoring defense at 4.29 goals per contest.

►The big loss last Friday cost the Bulldogs the No. 1 ranking in the USCHO.com poll. St. Norbert received nine first-place votes and moved up to No. 1. Adrian got seven first-place votes but slipped to No. 2.

►Junior forward Josh Ranalli powers the Adrian offense. He leads the team with 16 goals and ranks third in the country and 0.80 goals per game. Ranalli, who has 26 points, is 16th in the nation at 1.30 points per game.

►Junior forward Duston Hebebrand is second on the team with 25 points and is second with 12 goals.

►Junior forward Ryan Lowe has a team-best 19 assists and ranks fourth in the nation at 0.95 assists per game.

►The Bulldogs have 12 players with at least 12 points this season.

►The Bulldogs lost a major weapon from last season in forward Shaquille Merasty. He was third in the nation as a rookie last season at 0.79 goals per game. Merasty, who is not on the team this season, finished his freshman campaign in 2012-13 with 22 goals and 16 assists for 38 points.

►Adrian ranks second in the conference and fifth in the nation in scoring offense at 4.29 goals per game. The Bulldogs are second in the conference and ninth in the nation in scoring defense at 2.00 goals per game.

►The Bulldogs have two outstanding goaltenders in juniors Scott Shackell and James Hamby. Shackell is 8-0-1 with a .936 save percentage and 1.74 goals against average. Hamby is 9-1-2 with a .917 save percentage and 2.16 GAA.

►Adrian leads the conference and ranks ninth in the nation on the pow-

er play at 26.7 percent. Adrian has converted on 31-of-116 power-play chances. Ranalli has a team-best eight power-play goals.

►Adrian is fourth in the conference on the penalty kill at 84.5 percent. The Bulldogs have killed off 87-of-103 chances.
