THE COACHES

Mike Szkodzinski (St. Norbert 2000) is in his seventh season at Lawrence and has a record of 85-98-16 (.467). Steve Fabiilli (Canisuis 2001) is in his ninth season at Northland and has a record of 38-171-9 (.195).

THE SERIES

Lawrence has a dominating 55-14-2 edge in the series that goes back to the 1997-98 season. Lawrence put together a 23-game winning streak and 26-game unbeaten streak in the series from 2003-10. The Vikings are 30-4-0 against the Lumberjacks during Mike Szkodzinski's tenure as head coach.

Berger scored on the power play at the 15:41 mark of the first period to give the Sabres a 1-0 lead. Marian then pulled away with two goals in the first 4:40 of the second period. Derek Perl scored 1:21 into the second, and Milnthorp scored on the power play at 4:40.

Matt Moore got Lawrence on the board with a goal at the 5:13 mark, but Berger answered for the Sabres with a goal at 7:29 to push Marian's lead back to 4-1.

The Sabres got third-period goals from Milnthorp and Rjay Berra to seal the win. Pino added a late goal for the Vikinas.

Junior goaltender Anton Olsson (Stromstad, Sweden) was solid in net last Friday and picked up his first win of the season and the second of his career. Anton Olsson Olsson, who made



23 saves in the 3-1 win, is now 2-4-1 in his career. Despite his 1-2-0 record on the season, Olsson has good numbers with a 2.89 goals against average and .907 save percentage.

- ▶The Vikings were a bit better on teh power play against Marian and finished 1-for-6 (16.6 percent) for the two games. Lawrence ranks eighth in the NCHA on the power play at 9.5 percent (2-21) on the season.
- Lawrence gave up a pair of powerplay goals last weekend to Marian and have killed of 18 of 22 power plays this season. Lawrence ranks sixth in the league on the penalty kill at 81.8 percent.
- ▶Lawrence ranks seventh in the league in scoring offense at 2.25 goals per game. The Vikings are eighth in scoring defense at 4.00 goals per contest.

SCOUTING NORTHLAND

Northland has had a rough start to the season, but the Lumberjacks have faced two very good teams in Adrian and Lake Forest.



▶The Lumberjacks looked like they get their first win of the year last Friday. Northland scored the game's first two goals and still led 3-2 after the second period, but Lake Forest scored the game's final three goals to get the win. The Foresters capped the victory with a short-handed empty-net goal in the final seconds. Lake Forest left no doubt about the outcome the following day by racing out to a 5-1 lead after the first period. Lake Forest then scored six times in the second period and went on to a 13-2 victory.

Senior forward Mike Lennon, one of the league's finest players, is off to a good start this season. Lennon leads the Lumberjacks with four points on two goals and two assists. Lennon is tied with freshman forward Anthonly Stempin for the team lead in goals.

Sophomore forward Mike Mikulan is tops on the squad with three assists.

▶Sophomore Mason Riley has seen the bulk of the action in goal for the Lumberjacks. Riley has a 6.59 goals against average and .865 save percentage.
