#### THE COACHES

► Mike Szkodzinski (St. Norbert 2000) is in his seventh season at Lawrence and has a record of 86-99-16 (.468).

▶ A.J. Aitken (Michigan Tech 2000) is in his second season at Marian and has a record of 16-15-1 (.516).

▶Brett Petersen (Denver 1992) is in his 14th season at Gustavus Adolphus and has a record of 187-144-28 (.560). ▶Sean Goldsworthy (St. Olaf 1994) is in his 18th season at St. Olaf and has a record of 171-199-52 (.467).

#### **THE SERIES**

▶Gustavus Adolphus has a 4-0-0 lead in the series with Lawrence. The teams mets for the first time in the 1999-2000 season.

▶St. Olaf has a 17-3-0 lead in the series with Lawrence, but the Vikings have won the last two meetings. The teams met for the first time in the 1987-88 season, and Lawrence swept a twogame set when the teams last met in 2006-07.

#### **LAST SERIES**

Lawrence split a road series at Northland on Nov. 15-16.

In the series opener, Northland scored the first two goals of the third period to break a 2-2 tie and went on to a 4-3 victory.

Thomas Greene scored just 2:52 into the final period, and Anthony Stempin added a goal at the 8:55 mark to put the Lumberjacks up by two.

Rudi Pino then scored his second goal of the game for Lawrence at the 18:34 mark off assists from Brandon Boelter and Logan Lemirande to cut the lead to 4-3.

The Vikings pulled goaltender Peter Emery for the final minute of the game but couldn't get the equalizer against Northland goalie Jesse DiLillo.

DiLillo stopped 41 shots for the Lumberjacks. Lawrence had a 44-43 edge in shots.

In the series finale, freshman forward Blake Roubos scored twice, and Lawrence held off a late rally by Northland to down the Lumberjacks 5-3.

The Vikings led 4-2 when Northland scored a pair of goals in a 15-second span with just over two minutes left in the game. The Lumberjacks were then whistled for boarding with 1:29 left but pulled DiLillo in the final minute.

Lemirande then sealed the victory with an empty-net goal with just 21 seconds remaining.

Roubos got Lawrence on the board just 7:39 into the game when he scored off a pass from William Thoren. Huck Saunders made it 2-0 Lawrence when he scored with 5:10 left in the second period off assists from Roubos and Lemirande.

Northland cut the lead in half on Mike Lennon's goal 4:33 into the third period. Roubos stretched the lead back to 3-1 when he scored on the power play at the 7:06 mark. Lemirande and Boelter picked up assists on that goal.

Thoren made it 4-1 when he scored on his first goal of the season on a two-man advantage at the 10:33 mark.

Emery got the win after stopping 23 shots.

#### **VIKINGS UPDATE**

▶Freshman forward Blake Roubos (Niagara Falls, Ontario) is the top rookie scorer in the NCHA at 1.33 points per game. Roubos has three goals



and five assists for eight points. He is the only player on the squad who has at least one point in every game.

- ▶Roubos ranks 12th in the league in points per game and is the only freshman in the top 20.
- ▶Roubos leads the team with eight

Boelter had four assists in the series against Northland. Sophomore forward Rudi Pino (Vancouver, Wash.) leads the team with five goals.

- ▶Junior goaltender Anton Olsson (Stromstad, Sweden) was knocked out of the series against Northland due to injury, but he continues to lead the Vikings in net. Despite his 1-2 record, Olsson has a 2.92 goals against average and solid .916 save percentage.
- ▶ Junior goaltender Peter Emery (Goleta, Calif.) picked up the win in the series finale against Northland and now has 15 for his career. He is just one victory shy of tying Daniel Ljung for thrd place on the Lawrence career wins list.
- ▶The Vikings went 3-for-9 on the power play against Northland and are now at 16.7 percent (5-30) on the man-advantage this season. That ranks sixth in the NCHA.
- Lawrence gave up one power-play goal against Northland and limited the Lumberjacks to 1-for-6 on the man-advantage. Lawrence ranks sixth in the NCHA on the penalty kill at 82.1 percent (23-28).
- Lawrence ranks sixth in the league in scoring offense at 2.83 goals per game. The Vikings are seventh in scoring defense at 3.83 goals per contest.
- ▶The Vikings scored first in the series finale against Northland, and Lawrence has been tough when it gets on the board before the opponent. Lawrence has won or tied 76.9 percent of the time when it scores first under head coach Mike Szkodzinski. Lawrence has 62 wins and eight ties

#### **SCOUTING MARIAN**

Marian is coming off a weekend split of nonconference games against Wisconsin Intercollegiate



Athletic Conference teams. Marian downed UW-Superior 7-3 last Friday and were shut out 2-0 at UW-Stevens Point last Saturday.

- Senior forward Tyler Klein has been on a tear through the first nine games this season. Klein leads the team in all scoring categories with eight goals and seven assists for 15 points.
- ▶Klein is first in the NCHA in scoring at 1.67 points per game. He ranks third in the conference at 0.89 goals per game.
- ▶ Senior Josh Baker has seen the bulk of the action in net for Marian and has stellar numbers despite a 2-5-0 record. Baker has a .937 save percentage and 2.13 goals against average.
- Marian ranks fifth in the NCHA at 2.89 goals per game. The Sabres are third in scoring defense at 2.33 goals per game. Marin is third on the power play at 23.3 percent (7-30) and third on the penalty kill at 85.4 percent (35-41).

#### **SCOUTING GUSTAVUS ADOLPHUS**

▶Gustavus enters the weekend on a three-game win streak after sweeping Hamline last weekend by the scores of 5-2 and 5-1.

▶Sophomore John McLean has played all but 52 minutes in net this season. He has a 2.38 goals against average and .902 save percentage.

Gustavus ranks second in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference in scoring offense at 3.25 goals per game. The Gusties are fifth in scoring defense at 2.75 goals per game.

▶Gustavus has struggled on the power play and rank eighth in the MIAC at 10.8 percent (4-37). Gustavus is sixth on the penalty kill at 84.8 percent (28-33).

#### **SCOUTING ST. OLAF**

St. Olaf had a tie and loss last weekend against St. Thomas. The Oles posted a 2-2 tie in the series open-



er and then lost 3-0 in the series finale.

- Senior forward Dan Cecka is tops on the squad with five goals and seven points. Freshman forward Steven Sherman has handed out a team-high four assists.
- Steve Papciak has seen the vast majority of action in net for the Oles. He has a 2.82 goals against average and solid .903 save percentage.
- ▶St. Olaf is averaging just 1.75 goals per game, which ranks seventh in the MIAC. The Oles are eighth in scoring defense at 3.88 goals per game.
- ▶St. Olaf is sixth in the league on the power play at 12.5 percent (4-32). The Oles are seventh on the penalty kill at 75.7 percent (28-37).
