the regular season and secured the final spot in the Northern Collegiate Hockey Association playoffs in the process.

In the opener last Friday, Shigenobu Kakudate scored 3:08 into overtime to lift Finlandia to a 4-3 victory over Law-

rence at the Appleton Family Ice Center.

The overtime goal spoiled a nice comeback by the Vikings, who trailed by three goals late in the second period.

Lawrence was down 3-0 and got on the board when Steve Hughes scored on the power play off passes from Huck Saunders and William Thoren with 2:39 left in the second period.

The Vikings then scored a pair of goals in a span of 46 seconds in the third period to tie it at 3-3. After a tripping penalty put the Vikings on the power play, Renato Engler scored for Lawrence with assists from Blake Roubos and Saunders at the 7:19 mark.

Logan Lemirande then tied it at 8:05 with an even-strength goal with Engler and Hughes picking up assists.

Andrew Brownlee stopped 49 shots to pick up the win for Finlandia.

Roubos' hat trick led Lawrence to a 4-2 victory over Finlandia on Saturday and put the Vikings in the league playoffs.

It was Saunders who gave Lawrence the lead with his goal at 12:27 of the first off passes from Roubos and Thoren.

Roubos made it 2-0 with a power-play goal 4:20 into the second period as Thoren and Hughes collected assists. Roubos gave Lawrence a 3-0 edge when he scored just 2:21 into the third period.

The Lions cut the lead to 3-2 in the third period, but Roubos then completed the hat trick with another power-play goal at the 10:51 mark. Thoren got his third assist of the night on that goal, and Engler picked up his second assist in the game.

Mattias Soderqvist made 26 saves to pick up his second win of the season for Lawrence. Brownlee was tagged with the loss after allowing the game's first three goals.

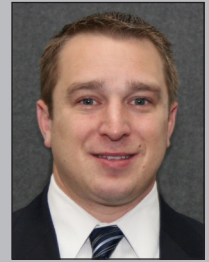

tion's top-ranked team, St. Norbert, for the quarterfinal series. The Vikings can draw on the positive feelings of having beaten the Green Knights once this season. Lawrence posted a 5-4 victory at St. Norbert on Dec. 7 that included rallying from a 4-1 deficit in the final period.

►The Vikings also kept alive a streak of making the conference playoffs. Lawrence has now made the league playoffs for 14 consecutive seasons. Lawrence brings a record of 10-3-1 in the conference quarterfinals under head coach Mike Szkodzinski.

►Senior defenseman/forward William Thoren (Gothenburg, Sweden) handed out four assists this past weekend and that gives him 46 for his career. Thoren is now tied for ninth on the career list and needs three more to catch Tom Conti, who had 49 from 1998-2002.

►Freshman forward Blake Roubos (Niagara Falls, Ontario) recorded his first and the program's first hat trick since Marc Howe did it against Northland on Nov. 21, 2009, with three goals in the win over Finlandia this past Saturday.

▶Saunders leads the team with 13 goals and has nine assists for 22 points, which ranks second on the squad. Saunders is sixth in the conference at 0.52 goals per game.

▶Freshman goaltender Mattias Soderqvist (Stockholm, Sweden) picked up his second win of the season against Finlandia. He improved his save percentage to .904 and lowered his goals against average to 3.56 on the season.

▶The Vikings have been very good on the power play over the last two series. Against Finlandia, the Vikings went 4-for-8 on the power play. In the previous series at Adrian, the Vikings were 4-for-10. Lawrence is 8-for-18 on the power play for a hefty 44.4 percent on the power play during that four-game stretch.

▶On the season, Lawrence has improved to 17.9 percent on the power play, and that ranks fifth in the conference. Lawrence is 21-for-117 on the season.

▶Lawrence also has been better on the penalty kill during the last four games. Lawrence has killed off 17 of 20 chances in the past four games for 85.0 percent. On the season, Lawrence is seventh in the league on the penalty kill at 79.8 percent.

▶Lawrence ranks seventh in the league in scoring offense at 2.28 goals per game. The Vikings are eighth in scoring defense at 4.12 goals per game.

last 13 games, are a unanimous No. 1 in the USCHO.com poll this week. St. Norbert brings an all-time record of 56-12-1 in the NCHA playoffs into this weekend's play.

▶Legendary St. Norbert coach Tim Coghlin has a close connection with Lawrence coach Mike Szkodzinski. Szkodzinski was an All-America goaltender for St. Norbert and served as Coghlin's assistant coach for two seasons before becoming Lawrence's head coach.

▶Junior forward Mason Baptista leads the team with 31 points on the strength of a team-best 22 assists to go with nine goals.

▶Senior forward Joe Perry is tops on the team with 16 goals and sophomore forward Michael Hill is second

with 15.

▶Junior goaltender David Jacobson is one of the best in the nation and has impressive numbers with a .934 save percentage and 1.36 goals against average to go with his 17-1-1 record.

▶St. Norbert leads the league and is second in the nation in scoring offense at 4.72 goals per game. The Green Knights also lead the conference and are second nationally in scoring defense at 1.56 goals per game.

▶St. Norbert also is one of the top teams in the nation on special teams. The Green Knights are first in the conference and eighth nationally on the power play at 24.2 percent (30-124). St. Norbert ranks third nationally and first in the conference on the penalty kill at 93.1 percent (94-101).
