goalkeeper Anton Olsson with 50 seconds left in regulation. With the extra attacker on the ice, Roubos beat goalkeeper John McLean for the tying goal. Huck Saunders and Brandon Boelter picked up assists on the game-tying tally.

Both teams had good chances in the five-minute overtime, but neither squad was able to score.

Lawrence looked like it might put the game away early after scoring five consecutive goals. The Vikings got goals from Logan Lemirande and Boelter in the first period and led 2-1 heading into the first intermission.

The Vikings then scored the first three goals of the second period.

Saunders got things started just 21 seconds into the second, and Roubos and Ryan Rumble both picked up goals to put the Vikings up 5-1 with 5:57 left in that period.

Gustavus then ripped off the game's next five goals to take a 6-5 lead. The Gusties scored three times in the final 5:01 of the second to trim the margin to 5-4 after two periods.

Tyler Lopic then scored just 1:21 into the third to tie the game at 5-5, and Gustavus' Corey Leivermann scored at the 4:22 mark to put the Gusties up 6-5.

Olsson stopped 56 shots for Lawrence, and McLean made 31 saves for the Gusties.

St. Olaf took the lead in the second period on Saturday and pulled away in the third on its way to a 5-1 win over the Vikings.

Lawrence grabbed an early 1-0 lead when Logan Lemirande scored off assists from Boelter and Saunders just 6:18 into the contest. St. Olaf tied it on Dan Cecka's goal with just 1:28 left in the opening period.

The Oles took the lead for good just 2:24 into the second period on Nick Marsh's goal and then made it 3-1 when David Rath scored with 4:50 left in the period.

In an ugly third period, the Oles got goals from Geoff Gieni and Peter Lindblad to seal the victory.

Henrik Wood made 23 saves to get the win for St. Olaf. Olsson stopped 35 shots for the Vikings and took the loss.

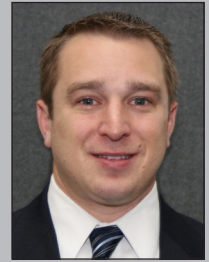

►Roubos' five points against the Gusties ties for the fifth-highest game total in Lawrence history. Roubos also ran his consecutive games point streak to seven

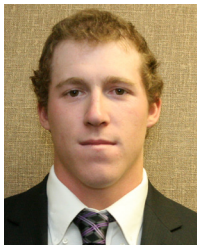

to start his career. That streak was finally snapped this past Saturday against St. Olaf.

►Roubos leads the team in goals assists and points. He is tied with Huck Saunders (Seattle, Wash.) with five goals and is tied with defenseman Brandon Boelter (Saginaw, Mich.) with eight assists. His 13 points is tops on the squad, and Saunders and Logan Lemirande (Janesville, Wis.) are tied for second with 10 points apiece.

►Boelter ranks second in the league for scoring by defensemen at 1.12 points per game.

►Junior goaltender Anton Olsson (Stromstad, Sweden) has emerged as the starter in net over the past few weeks. Olsson has a .904 save percentage and 3.88 goals against average in six games this season. Olsson stopped a career-high 56 shots against Gustavus. His previous high was 38 saves against Finlandia last season.

►The Vikings went 2-for-14 on the power play in the games against Gustavus Adolphus and St. Olaf. Lawrence is at 15.9 percent (7-for-44) on the power play and that ranks fifth in the NCHA.

►Lawrence gave up two power-play goals against St. Olaf and finished 11-for-13 on the penalty kill last weekend. Lawrence is now at 82.9 percent (34-for-41) on the penalty kill and that is fifth in the conference.

### November 1
