THE COACHES

►Mike Szkodzinski (St. Norbert 2000) is in his eighth season at Lawrence and has a record of 96-126-19 (.438).

►Patrick Kelliher (St. Lawrence 2010) is in his first season and has a record of 11-3-5 (.710).

THE SERIES

►Lake Forest holds a 17-8-2 record against Lawrence in a series that goes back to the 1986-87 season. Since the 2005-06 season, Lawrence has a 7-5-2 record against the Foresters.

LAST SERIES

St. Scholastica swept the Northern Collegiate Hockey Association series from the Vikings last weekend in Duluth, Minn.

St. Scholastica scored four times in the second period and went on to a 6-1 win over Lawrence at Mars Lakev-

iew Arena last Friday.

The game was tied 1-1 after the opening period, but the Saints scored twice in the first 3:39 of the second and then added two more goals in a span of 36 seconds midway through the period.

Dylan Nowakowski and Luke Simpson both scored two goals for the Saints.

Brandon Boelter scored the first goal of the game for the Vikings on the power play at 12:47 of the first. Nowakowski's goal with just 54 seconds left in the first period tied it at 1-1.

Tyler Bruggeman made just 14 saves to pick up the win for St. Scholastica, which had a 45-15 edge in shots. Mattias Soderqvist made 24 saves and allowed five goals for the Vikings before being removed midway through the second period. Peter Emery stopped 15 shots and gave up one goal in relief of Soderqvist.

St. Scholastica used its special teams for nearly all of its offense and went on to a 4-2 win on Saturday to complete the sweep.

The Saints got a pair of power-play goals and a short-hander.

Lawrence jumped out to a 2-0 lead 12:10 into the first period. The Vikings scored first on Tom Lee's second goal of the season at the 7:54 mark. Lawrence made it 2-0 when Blake Roubos scored his sixth goal of the season at the 12:10 mark.

A Cory Bastian roughing penalty put the Saints on the power play, and Nowakowski cashed in at the 13:59 mark to cut the lead to 2-1.

The Vikings were on the power play to start the second period, but Michael Spring's short-hander 30 seconds into the period tied the game at 2-2.

The Saints were on a two-man advantage after penalties to Patrick Coyne and Kevin Killian, and Derek Hill scored on the power play at the 10:42 mark of the second to put St. Scholastica up 3-2.

St. Scholastica was 2-for-6 on the power play, and the Vikings went 0-for-5.

The score stayed that way until Joel Paiement scored with just 6:29 remaining in the third period to help seal the victory.

Bruggeman made 24 saves to pick up the win for the Saints. Soderqvist stopped 42 shots for the Vikings.

VIKINGS UPDATE

►Lawrence looked like it was on its way to a split of last weekend's series with St. Scholastica after grabbing a 2-0 lead in the first period on Saturday (the Saints rallied for a 4-2 victory). Under coach Mike Szkodzinski, Lawrence has a great record when it scores first. The Vikings were 66-27-9, a .691 winning percentage, when scoring first heading into the series with St. Scholastica. Lawrence scored first in both games but came up short both times. Lawrence also led after the first period on Saturday, and heading into that game, the Vikings were 53-15-4 when leading after the first period. That's a .764 winning percentage.

►Lawrence struggled again on the penalty kill over the weekend. St. Scholastica went 4-for-11 on the power play. Lawrence ranks 10th in the NCHA on the penalty kill at 74.3 percent (78-of-105).

►Lawrence also allowed its third short-handed goal of the season last weekend. The Vikings gave up just

three shorties all of last season.

▶The Vikings scored one power-play goal last weekend to fall to 12.6 on the power play this season. Lawrence has converted on 11-of-87 power-play chances, and that ranks ninth in the league.

▶Lawrence ranks ninth in the NCHA in scoring offense at 2.37 goals per game. Lawrence is seventh in scoring defense at 4.21 goals per contest.

▶Sophomore forward Blake Roubos (Niagara Falls, Ontario) picked up his team-best sixth goal of the season against St. Scholastica. He has eight assists and is tied for the team

lead with 14 points. Roubos now has at least one point in five of the last seven games.

▶Rookie forward Jake Kreutzer (Lake Orion, Mich.) did not play in the series against St. Scholastica but continues to lead the team with nine assists. He has five goals and is tied with Roubos for the team lead with 14 points.

▶Sophomore goaltender Mattias Soderqvist (Stockholm, Sweden) saw his season numbers slip a bit after the weekend. Soderqvist is now 6-10-1 on the season with a 3.99 goals against average and .902 save percentage.

SCOUTING LAKE FOREST

▶Lake Forest is on a huge roll entering play this weekend. The Foresters haven't been de-



feated since a 5-1 setback to UW-Stevens Point way back on Nov. 21. Lake Forest has posted a 9-0-4 record since Nov. 22 so the Foresters haven't lost in 69 days.

▶The Foresters have been great in all areas of the game with a balanced offense, superb goaltending and great special teams play.

▶Lake Forest's balanced attack features 19 players who have scored at least one goal. Senior forward Luke Swardenski leads the team with 11 goals and is third on the squad with 16 points.

▶Sophomore forward Jack Lewis and junior defenseman Ben Certo have been handing out assists left and right. Lewis leads the team with 15 assists to go with seven goals for a team-best 22 points. Certo has 14 assists and four goals and is second on the team with 18 points.

▶Junior goaltender Leo Podolsky has seen virtually all of the action in net this season and his numbers are stellar. He is 11-2-3 with a 1.63 GAA and league-leading .951 save percentage.

▶Lake Forest has been great on the penalty kill at 90.7 percent, and that ranks second in the NCHA. The Foresters have allowed just seven power-play goals on the season and have killed off 68-of-75 chances.
