In the series opener at the Appleton Family Ice Center, Lawrence scored the game's final four goals on to pull away for a 6-2 victory.

Mattias Soderqvist stopped 40 shots for Lawrence and didn't allow a goal for the final 44:07 of the contest.

Renato Engler had a goal and three assists for Lawrence, and Blake Roubos picked up a goal and two assists for the Vikings.

Concordia led 1-0 when freshman Matt Montemurro scored his first ca-

reer goal for Lawrence, a power-play tally, to tie the game at 1-1 at the 13:12 mark of the first. Roubos scored less than a minute later at 14:09 to give the Vikings a 2-1 edge.

Cody Dixon then tied it at 2-2 when he scored for the Falcons at the 15:53 mark of the first.

Lawrence then got two goals in a span of six seconds to take command in the second. Engler swiped the puck and scored unassisted at the 4:02 mark of the second to put Lawrence up 3-0. The Vikings won the ensuing faceoff and Matt Moore scored at 4:08 for a 4-2 edge.

Lawrence sealed the win when freshman Jake Kreutzer scored on the power play at 10:47 of the third to give the Vikings a 5-2 advantage. Brandon Boelter added a power-play goal with just 1:21 left to close out the scoring.

In the series finale at the Ozaukee Ice Center, Roubos scored twice and Engler piled up three points to lead Lawrence to a 4-2 victory.

Roubos scored the game's first goals in span of 3:36 in the opening period to give Lawrence the lead. Roubos scored at the 10:09 mark off assists from Engler and Kreutzer for a 1-0 lead. He then added a power-play goal at 13:45 off a pass from Engler for a 2-0 advantage.

The Falcons cut the margin in half on Chris Hughes' goal at the 14:34 mark and Lawrence led 2-1 after the opening period.

Moore scored 4:31 into the second period, and the score stayed 3-1 until Engler scored just 1:45 into the third period. The Falcons scored with 1:42 remaining for the final margin.

Soderqvist stopped 44 shots to pick up the win for Lawrence. Dylan Frank made 33 saves for Concordia.

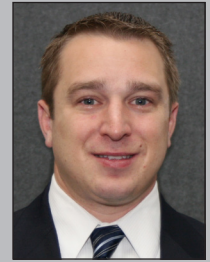

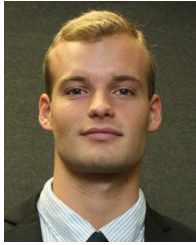

This isn't the first time Lawrence has been in the "others receiving votes" category during the tenure of head coach Mike Szkodzinski, but the Vikings have yet to crack the Top 15.

►Lawrence goaltender Mattias Soderqvist (Stockholm, Sweden) earned NCHA Defensive Player of the Week honors after picking up a pair of wins against Concordia

(Wis.). Soderqvist was outstanding as he stopped 84 of 88 shots for a .955 save percentage and a 2.00 goals against average. This was the first conference Player of the Week award for Soderqvist, who joined the team at midseason in 2013-14.

►The line of junior Renato Engler (Davos, Switzerland), sophomore Blake Roubos (Niagara Falls, Ontario) and freshman Jake Kreutzer (Lake Orion, Michigan) are off to a blazing start.

They combined for 16 points in the two games. Engler had two goals and five assists for seven points. Roubos, the team's leading scorer last season, had three goals and two assists for five points, and Kreutzer had one goal and three assists for four points.

►Kreutzer scored his first career goal, a power-play tally, in the third period of the opener. Freshman Matt Montemurro (Glenview, Ill.) got his first career goal on Lawrence's first score of the season in the opener.

►Sophomore forward Ryan Eardley (Ile Bizard, Quebec) and junior forward Ryan Rumble (Newmarket, Ontario) are both off to a quick start. Eardley and Rumble both picked up a pair of assists in the opening weekend. Rumble had just one assist and five goals on his way to six points last season, and Eardley had two assists and one goal for three points in 2013-14.

►Lawrence went 4-for-12 on the power play (.333), and the Vikings were at .818 on the penalty kill after allowing two goals in 11 chances to Concordia (Wis.).

SCOUTING MARIAN

►Marian drew a tough assignment in the season opening series with defending national champion and No. 1-ranked St. Norbert. The Green Knights topped Marian 5-2 and 4-1 in the series.



►St. Norbert's shadow also falls over this series since both head coaches, Lawrence's Mike Szkodzinski and Marian's A.J. Aitken, have a St. Norbert connection. Szkodzinski was an All-America goaltender for the Green Knights and then served as an assistant under legendary St. Norbert coach Tim Coghlin. Aitken was an assistant at St. Norbert before taking the head coaching job at Marian. Coghlin has mentored two others that went on to be head coaches, Cory Borys
