7:08 remaining to give the Sabres the win. Lawrence pulled goaltender Mattias Soderqvist for the final minute but could not get the equalizer.

After a scoreless first period, Lawrence grabbed a 1-0 lead on Gustav Lindgren's goal at the 7:53 mark. Marian tied the game with just 1:33 left in the second period when Ben Morgan scored on the power play.

Marian was 1-for-3 on the power play, and Lawrence was 0-for-1 in a

game that had only four penalties.

Soderqvist stopped 38 shots for Lawrence, and Mike Gudmandson made 25 saves for the Sabres.

The Sabres scored three times in the second period last Saturday and rode that outburst to a 5-2 win over Lawrence at the Appleton Family Ice Center.

The Sabres broke a 1-1 tie just 2:04 into the second period when Thorogood scored. Marian made it 3-1 at the 14:11 on Thomas Nosella's goal. The Sabres stretched the lead to 4-1 when Matt Williams scored just 1:50 later.

Lawrence cut the margin to 4-2 on Austin Frank's first collegiate goal at the 12:10 mark of the third period. Frank's power-play goal came off assists from Blake Roubos and Brad Mueller.

Marian then sealed the win on Brodie Jamieson's empty-net goal with 1:16 remaining.

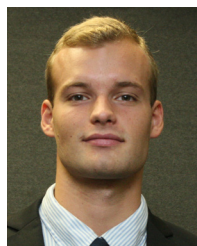

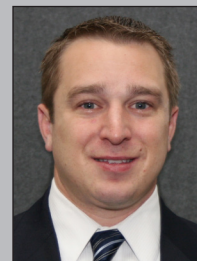

► Junior forward Renato Engler (Davos, Switzerland) leads the Vikings in scoring with two goals and five assists for seven points. Engler ranks fourth in the NCHA at 1.75 points per game. He's third at 1.25 assists per game and third at 0.75 power-play points per contest.

► Freshman forward Jake Kreutzer (Lake Orion, Mich.) is among the league leaders in freshmen scoring. Kreutzer, who has one goal and four assists for five points, ranks fourth in the league at 1.25 points per game.

► Freshman defenseman Austin Frank (DeForest, Wis.) scored his first collegiate goal in this past Saturday's game against Marian. It also was the first career point for Frank, who has played in all four games this season.

► The Vikings have been slow to start on offense in the opening period this season. In four games, Lawrence is a minus-38 in shots on goal in the first period. The Vikings have been outshot 66-28 in the opening period. Lawrence is plus-2 in shots in the final two periods this season.

► Just four games into the season, Lawrence ranks fourth in the NCHA in scoring defense at 2.75 goals per game. The Vikings are fifth in scoring offense at 3.25 goals per contest.

►Lawrence went 1-for-7 on the power play this past weekend against Marian and now rank fifth in the league at 26.3 percent (5-19). Lawrence allowed a pair of power-play goals and killed off only 3-of-5 power-play chances for the Sabres. Lawrence fell to seventh in the league on the penalty kill at 75 percent (12-16).

SCOUTING NORTHLAND

►Northland picked up its first victory of the season with an impressive 4-3 win over visiting Lake Forest last Saturday. The Lumberjacks scored three consecutive goals to take a 4-2 lead with 4:30 left in the second period. The Lumberjacks allowed a power-play goal in the third period but held Lake Forest scoreless for the final 12-plus minutes.



►The win must have been sweet for first-year Northland coach Seamus Gregory, who was an assistant coach at Lake Forest several years ago. He also served as interim head coach of the Foresters in 2010-11 after the retirement of long-time head coach Tony Fritz. The Lumberjacks hired Gregory earlier this year when Steve Fabiilli resigned to become the head women's hockey coach at Concordia (Wis.).

►Northland had not scored more than two goals in a game prior to the four-goal outburst against Lake Forest.

►Freshman defenseman Ben Owen and junior forward Colby Spoonmore lead the team with three points apiece. Owen and sophomore forward Anthony Stempin both have a team-high two goals. Spoonmore is tops on the team with three assists.

►This is a very, very young Northland team without a lot of proven scorers. Only senior Matt Lennon has as many as 30 career points. By contrast,

►Junior Tyler Ampe has been the majority of action in net this season for the Lumberjacks. He has a 7.86 goals against average and .787 save percentage. Jesse DiLillo was in net for Northland's win over Lake Forest, and he has a 2.41 GAA and .914 save percentage.

►The Lumberjacks will be road warriors until the middle of January. Northland will play just two of its next 11 games in Ashland.

►Northland is 10th in the league in scoring offense at 2.25 goals per game. The Lumberjacks are 10th in scoring defense at 6.25 goals per

game.

►Northland is 10th in the conference on the power play at 10.0 percent (2-20). The Lumberjacks are sixth in the league on the penalty kill at 76.0 percent (19-25).

►Northland leads the league in penalty minutes at 21.5 per game.
