►Sean Goldsworthy (St. Olaf 1994) is in his 19th season at St. Olaf and has a record of 184-210-55 (.471).

THE SERIES

►Gustavus Adolphus holds a 4-0-1 record against Lawrence since the teams first met during the 1999-2000 season. The Vikings are 0-2-1 against the Gusties during the tenure of head coach Mike Szkodzinski.

LAST SERIES

Lawrence dropped a pair of non-conference games on the road this past weekend.

Tenth-ranked UW-River Falls scored a pair of second-period goals last Friday to break a tie and went on to a 4-1 victory over Lawrence at Hunt Arena.

The game was tied 1-1 midway through the second period when Blake Huppert scored on the power play for the Falcons at 9:59. River Falls added to that lead just 3:14 later when Mike Fazio scored his second goal of

the game for a 3-1 edge.

The Falcons added a power-play goal with just 26 seconds left in the game to seal the win.

Fazio gave the Falcons a 1-0 lead when he scored at the 8:16 mark of the first period. Lawrence tied it at 1-1 when Sean Reynolds scored his first goal of the season for the Vikings off a feed from Brendan Vetter at the 8:22 mark of the second period.

Mattias Soderqvist made 24 saves and took the loss for the Vikings. Tanner Milliron stopped 28 shots for River Falls.

A goal early in the third period proved to be the difference on Saturday as UW-Stout defeated Lawrence 2-1 at the Dunn County Ice Arena.

The Blue Devils got a goal from Justin Moody just 1:24 into the third period to break a 1-1 tie. The Vikings had a 14-12 edge in shots in the final period and pulled goaltender Anton Olsson for the final 1:27 but could not get the equalizer.

Stout had grabbed a 1-0 lead on Tyler Cayemberg's power-play goal with just two seconds left in the first period. Lawrence tied it on Matt Moore's goal off a feed from Brandon Boelter at the 17:08 mark of the second period.

Olsson made 25 saves for the Vikings, and Spencer Viele made 30 saves for the Blue Devils.

VIKINGS UPDATE

►Lawrence's offense generated 60 shots in the two games this past weekend but the Vikings cashed in only twice. Lawrence also went 0-for-8 on the power play in the two contests.



►Sophomore forward Sean Reynolds (Anaheim, Calif.) scored his first goal of the season and his second career goal in the game at UW-River Falls. Reynolds picked up his first career goal in a win over St. Scholastica on Jan. 25, 2014.

►The leading scorer for the Vikings continues to be junior forward Renato Engler (Davos, Switzerland). Engler has a team-best six assists to go with three goals for nine points. Sophomore forward Blake Roubos (Niagara Falls, Ontario) leads the team with four goals and is second with eight points.

►Sophomore goaltender Mattias Soderqvist (Stockholm, Sweden) played against UW-River Falls last weekend and stopped 24 shots. He now has a .922 save percentage and 2.72 goals against average.

►Lawrence ranks fourth in the NCHA in scoring offense at 3.00 goals per game. The Vikings are fifth in scoring defense at 2.88 goals per contest.

►Lawrence moved to fourth in the league on the penalty kill at 79.4 percent (27-34). Lawrence is eighth in the league on the power play at 16.2 percent (6-37).

SCOUTING GUSTAVUS

►Gustavus Adolphus ran its unbeaten streak to five games with a 2-2 tie against Hamline last Saturday. The Gusties have played three consecutive ties (3-3 with Concordia, Minn., 3-3 with Hamline and 2-2 with Hamline). Prior to that, the Gusties defeated UW-Stout 4-3 in overtime and Concordia (Minn.) 2-1.



►Gustavus hasn't lost since a 4-1 setback to visiting UW-Stevens Point on Nov. 7.

►Freshman forward Conor Deal istops on the team with seven points. He is tied for the team lead with four points and has three goals. Senior forward Blake Schammel and freshman defenseman Jake Bushey lead the team with four goals apiece.

►Sophomore Erik Johnson has played every minute in net for the Gusties

this season. Johnson has a .905 save percentage and 2.66 goals against average.

►The Gusties rank fourth in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference in scoring offense at 2.88 goals per game. Gustavus is sixth in scoring defense at 2.88 goals per contest.

►Gustavus is tops in the MIAC on the power play at 26.1 percent. The Gusties are 6-for-23 on the man-advantage this season. The Gusties are also first on the penalty kill at 95.7 percent. Gustavus has allowed just one power-play goal in 23 chances this season.

SCOUTING ST. OLAF

►St. Olaf has just two wins on the season, but they have already defeated a ranked opponent. The Oles topped UW-Stevens Point,



currently ranked ninth the USCHO.com poll, 3-2 back on Nov. 8.

►St. Olaf is coming off a 2-1 victory over St. Thomas last Saturday and that snapped a three-game losing streak for the Oles.

►Junior forward Peter Lindblad and sophomore forward Steven Sherman are the top scorers for the Oles. Lindblad has a team-high three goals to go with two assists for five points. Sherman has a team-high four assists and one goal for five points.

►Only three players, Lindblad, Jonas Fredriksson and Brian Hickey, have scored more than one goal through the first eight games.

►Senior goaltender Steve Papciak has

been solid in net all season. He has a 2.77 goals against average and .907 save percentage.

►St. Olaf ranks last in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference in scoring offense at 1.62 goals per game. The Oles have been held to one goal or less in four of their eight games. The Oles are eighth in the league in scoring defense at 3.25 goals per game.

►St. Olaf ranks second in the league on the power play at 22.2 percent (6-27). The Oles have scored almost half of their 13 goals on the season on the man-advantage. St. Olaf is fourth in the league on the penalty kill at 86.2 percent (25-29).
