Lawrence scored a pair of secondperiod goals to grab the lead, but Gustavus got the equalizer at the seven-minute mark of the third. Gustavus had three power-play opportunities later in the third but couldn't cash in.

The Gusties went 0-for-6 on the power play, and Lawrence was 0-for-2.

Jake McCann gave Gustavus a 1-0 lead with his goal at 8:36 of the opening period. Lawrence tied it at 1-1 just over two minutes later when Brendan Vetter scored off a pass from Matt Moore.

Gavin Tufte gave the Gusties a 2-1 lead when he scored at 3:47 of the second, but the Vikings scored twice in a two-minute span to take the lead. Ryan Rumble scored off a pass from Brandon Boelter at 8:47 to tie it, and Jake Kreutzer scored off a pass from Austin Frank at 10:44 to give Lawrence a 3-2 advantage.

Andy Pearson then scored at 7:11 of the third for the Gusties to tie it at 3-3.

Mattias Soderqvist made 42 saves for the Vikings, and Erik Johnson stopped 20 shots for Gustavus.

In Sunday's game, Rumble scored Lawrence's final two goals to lift the Vikings to a 4-3 victory over St. Olaf.

Rumble gave Lawrence a 3-2 lead late in the second period and then broke a tie early in the third, and that proved to be the difference.

Rumble gave Lawrence the lead when he scored off assists from Ryan Robertson and Jake Roeper with 1:30 left in the second period. That lead didn't last as Matt Guerts scored on the power play with just 19 seconds left in the period to tie it at 3-3.

Lawrence grabbed the 4-3 lead when Rumble scored 3:45 into the third period with Roeper and Robertson picking up assists again.

Soderqvist made that lead stand up as he stopped all 15 St. Olaf shots in the final period. Soderqvist finished with 37 saves.

The Vikings also had to kill off a pair of third-period penalties and held the Oles to 1-for-5 on the man-ad-vantage for the game. St. Olaf pulled their goaltender for the final 1:22 but couldn't get the equalizer.

Lawrence trailed 1-0 when Vetter scored with 9:00 left in the first period. The score remained tied at 1-1 until Roeper scored his first collegiate goal, a power-play tally, at the 5:58 mark of the second. The Oles tied it at 2-2 on a short-hander by Brian Hickey at the 14:21 mark of the second.

Luke Andriuk made 27 saves and took the loss for St. Olaf.

riod. For the two games, Soderqvist stopped 79 of 85 shots for a .929 save percentage and 2.88 goals against average. On the season, Soderqvist improved his record to 5-3-1. He now has a .924 save percentage and 2.76 GAA.

▶ Freshman forward Jake Kreutzer (Lake Orion, Mich.) leads the team with seven assists and 10 points. Junior forward Renato Engler (Davos, Switzerland) is next with six assists and nine points. Sophomore forward Blake Roubos (Niagara Falls, Ontario) is and freshman defenseman Brendan Vetter (Phillips, Wis.) are tied for the team lead with four goals apiece.

The Vikings recorded the biggest win in program history against the Green Knights last December. Lawrence rallied from a 4-1 deficit entering the third period for a 5-4 victory on Dec. 7, 2013. It marked just the second time St. Norbert had lost when leading entering the third period at the Cornerstone. St. Norbert entered that game with a record of 237-1-2 when leading at home after two periods. It also marked the highest-ranked opponent (No. 2) Lawrence had ever defeated.

Lawrence ranks seventh in the NCHA in scoring offense at 3.10 goals per game. The Vikings are fifth in scoring defense at 2.90 goals per contest.

Lawrence is fifth in the league on the penalty kill at 81.8 percent (36-44). Lawrence is eighth in the league on the power play at 15.6 percent (7-45).

▶ Juniors Michael Hill and Erik Cooper are tops on the squad with six goals apiece. The powerful St. Norbert offense features 16 players with at least one goal through nine games.

Senior forward Mason Baptista leads the squad with 11 assists and is tops with 15 points. Senior forward Cullen Bradshaw is next with nine assists and 14 points.

The Green Knights have a superlative goaltending duo in senior David Jacobson and sophomore Tony Kujava. Jacobson was the 2014 Sid Watson Award winner and the NCHA Player of the Year and has been just as good this season. Jacobson has a 1.17 goals against average, .939 save percentage and one shutout in 360 minutes. In three games, Kujava has two shutouts, a 0.65 GAA and .957 save percentage.

St. Norbert ranks first the NCHA on the power play at 31.1 percent (14-45), and that is good for eighth in the nation. The Green Knights are also first in the conference on the penalty kill at 94.1 percent (32-34), and this is fourth nationally.
