

The score stayed that way until early in the third period when Steve Hughes put the Vikings ahead 2-1 at the 5:17 mark. Hughes picked up his third goal of the season off assists from Ryan Rumble and Matt Montemurro.

Concordia finally tied the score at 2-2 with just 4:03 left in the third on Adam Fauchoux's goal.

The Falcons fired six shots in the overtime, and Lawrence had four. Concordia finished with 42 shots for the game, and Lawrence had 41.

VIKINGS UPDATE

Lawrence turned in its best defensive series of the season, allowing just two goals to Concordia (Wis.) in two games. The Vikings also were perfect



on the penalty kill and were whistled for just nine penalties total on the weekend.

Lawrence picked up three points in the NCHA standings and now has seven on the season. Lawrence is just one point behind third place MSOE in the North Division. The top three teams in each division earn a spot in the NCHA playoffs.

Lawrence goaltender Mattias Sodergvist (Stockholm, Sweden) earned his first career shutout and was named NCHA Defensive Player of the Week for the third time in his career. Soderqvist went 1-0-1, posted a .971 save percentage and 0.96 goals against average. He stopped 26 shots last Friday to earn the shutout. He stopped 40 shots in Saturday's game. Soderqvist improved to 4-6-1 on the season with an .877 save percentage and 3.92 GAA.

Sophomore forward Luke McDiarmid (Alden, Mich.) scored his first career goal and picked up his first career point in the tie on Saturday.

Senior forward Renato Engler (Davos, Switzerland) picked up an assist this weekend to push his team-best total to eight. He also leads the team with four goals and has a team-high 12 points.

Freshman forward Nick Felan (Highland Village, Texas), who has been limited to nine games due to injury, scored his second goal of the season on Friday. Felan also has five assists and is tied for second on the team with seven points.

power play last weekend and are now 9-for-72 on the season. The Vikings are at 12.5 percent and that ranks seventh in the conference. The Vikings were a perfect 8-for-8 on the penalty kill last weekend and climbed to ninth in the conference at 75.3 percent (58-for-77).

Lawrence is tied for eighth in the NCHA in scoring at 2.23 goals per game. The Vikings are ninth in scoring defense at 4.54 goals per game.

SCOUTING AURORA

This Aurora's is first season as a fullfledged member of the NCHA. The Spartans joined the league last season but did not



take part in the conference schedule.

Aurora picked up its first league victory back in November when it won 4-1 at Finlandia.

The Spartans are coming off a rough weekend at the hands of secondranked Adrian. The Bulldogs downed Aurora 8-1 last Friday and then finished the weekend sweep with an 11-0 victory on Saturday. Adrian fired 107 shots on goal for the two games, and Aurora was limited to just 30 shots against the powerful Bulldogs.

Sophomore forward Trevor Hoth leads the team with six assists and has a team-best eight points. Four players, Rihards Marenis, Tim Santopoalo, Tom Greene and Ron Lindgren, are tied for the team lead with three goals apiece.

Four players have seen action in net for the Spartans, but junior Jared Rutledge has seen the overwhelming majority of time in goal. Rutledge has a 5.36 GAA to go with an .881 save percentage.

Aurora ranks 10th in the NCHA at 2.00 goals per game. The Spartans are last in the league in scoring defense at 6.08 goals per contest.
