THE COACHES

▶Mike Szkodzinski (St. Norbert 2000) is in his 10th season at Lawrence and has a record of 101-141-20 (.424).

▶Mark Wick (St. Scholastica 1985) is in his 12th season at St. Scholastica and has a record of 156-129-38 (.542). He is in his 17th season overall and has a mark of 192-163-41 (.514).

THE SERIES

▶In a series that started in the 2001-02 season, St. Scholastica holds a 10-2-1 advantage. Lawrence's last win was a 3-2 victory over the Saints during the 2013-14 season.

LAST SERIES

Lawrence swept Aurora at the Appleton Family Ice Center and picked up its second shutout of the season in the process.

Lawrence put together a dominating performance en route to a 7-0 NCHA victory last Friday.

Playing in front of a near-capacity crowd for the Body Check Cancer Game, the Vikings got two goals apiece from Renato Engler, Josh Koepplinger and Felix Henriksson. Mattias Soderqvist stopped 27 shots to

earn his second shutout in the last three games.

The Vikings went 3-for-5 on the power play and fired 55 shots on goal.

Henriksson scored his first career goal midway through the first period off an assist from Ryan Eardley and the Vikings led 1-0 at the 10:34 mark. Engler made it 2-0 with just 58 seconds left in the first when he passed the puck to himself off the boards and beat Aurora goaltender Jared Rutledge.

Koepplinger made it 3-0 just 2:40 into the second period with assists from Sean Reynolds and Ryan Robertson.

The score stayed that way until the Vikings scored three consecutive power-play goals in the third. Koepplinger scored on the man-advantage at 7:46 of the third with assists coming again from Robertson and Reynolds. Engler then scored on the power play just 1:13 later with Nick Felan and Brandon Boelter picking up assists. Lane King fired in another power-play goal at 11:39 with Felan and Boelter assisting again.

That was the end of the night for Rutledge, who finished with 44 saves for the Spartans.

The Vikings finished the scoring on Henriksson's second goal of the night at the 15:13 mark.

Lawrence scored three unanswered goals in the third period last Saturday to rally for a 6-4 win over Aurora.

Felan had a goal and three assists for Lawrence, and Engler picked up a goal and two assists.

Soderqvist pushed his unbeaten

streak to four games for the Vikings and made 31 saves.

Trevor Hoth had a goal and two assists for Aurora, and Rutledge made 39 saves for the Spartans.

Tim Santopalo scored just 1:06 into the third period to give Aurora a 4-3 lead, but the Vikings rallied quickly.

Jake Kreutzer, in just his second game back from injury for the Vikings, took the puck to the right of Rutledge and went top shelf. The puck snuck inside the upper corner for a goal to tie the game at 4-4 at the 4:43 mark.

Less than a minute later, Henriksson fired a puck through a screen of multiple defenders and past Rutledge to give the Vikings a 5-4 lead at the 5:30 mark. That would prove to be the game-winner, the second game-winning goal for Henriksson in as many nights.

The Vikings then stretched the lead on the power play midway through the period. Engler beat Rutledge with assists from Felan and Steve Hughes, who finished with three helpers in the game, at the 11:08 mark.

The Spartans pulled Rutledge for the final 1:40 but couldn't score.

Felan got Lawrence on the board with his third goal of the season at the 8:54 mark of the first. Lawrence made it 2-0 on Matt Moore's goal just 43 seconds into the second period.

Aurora scored the game's next two goals in the ensuing 5:01 to tie it at 2-2. Lawrence grabbed a 3-2 lead on Boelter's power-play goal at the 16:13 mark of the second, but Toth scored for Aurora with 1:08 left in the period to make the score 3-3 after two.

Lawrence finished the game with 45 shots and went 2-for-5 on the power play.

VIKINGS UPDATE

►Lawrence topped Aurora twice last weekend to pick up its first series sweep of the season. It was the first series sweep for Lawrence since the

►Lawrence piled up 13 goals in the sweep of Aurora, and that is the highest total in a series since the Vikings scored 18 in a sweep of Northland on Nov. 9-10, 2012. Lawrence won those games 10-1 and 8-6.

►Lawrence earned four points with the sweep of Aurora and now has 11 for the season. The Vikings moved one point ahead of MSOE for third place in the North Division. The top three teams in each division make the playoffs.

►Lawrence goaltender Mattias Soderqvist (Stockholm, Sweden) earned his second career shut-out last Friday and posted a 2.01 goals against average and .935 save percentage on the weekend. Soderqvist improved to 6-6-1 on the season and improved his GAA to 3.61 and his save percentage to .886.

►Junior defenseman Felix Henriksson (Helsinki, Finland) scored his first three career goals last weekend. Henriksson scored twice in the series opener against Aurora and then netted another goal on Saturday. Both goals were the game-winners.

►Rookie forward Josh Koeplinger (Saginaw, Mich.) picked up the first multi-goal game of his career with a pair of scores against Aurora last Friday. He is second on the team with five goals and has a pair of assists for seven points.

►The Vikings went 5-for-10 on the power play last weekend and are 14-for-82 (17.1 percent) on the season, good for fifth in the NCHA. The Vikings improved to 75.3 percent on the penalty kill, good for eighth in the league, after killing off 3-of-4 chances.

►Lawrence is fifth in the NCHA in scoring at 2.80 goals per game. The Vikings are ninth in scoring defense at 4.20 goals per game.

►St. Scholastica is coming off a split against visiting MSOE last weekend. The Saints won the opener 2-0 and then lost 3-2 on Saturday. St. Scholastica then played a non-conference game on Tuesday and skated to a 3-3 overtime tie at UW-Stout.

►Senior Tyler Bruggeman has seen nearly all of the action in goal for the Saints. He has an impressive 2.21 GAA and .914 save percentage.

►The Saints have the NCHA's most prolific power play and are converting at 27.5 percent clip. St. Scholastica is 19-for-69 on the man-advantage this season, and senior Keegan Bruce has a team-high five power-play goals.

►The Saints rank second in the league on the penalty kill at 88.5 percent. St. Scholastica has allowed six power-play goals in 52 chances this season.

►St. Scholastica is third in the league in scoring offense at 3.60 goals per game. The Saints are fifth in scoring defense at 2.33 goals per contest.
