THE COACHES

Mike Szkodzinski (St. Norbert 2000) is in his 10th season at Lawrence and has a record of 100-141-19 (.421). Jasen Wise (St. Thomas 1996) is in his fourth season at Concordia and has a record of 33-53-5 (.390). He is in his 12th season overall and has a record of 152-141-19 (.518).

THE SERIES

Lawrence holds a 12-5-1 advantage in the series that started in the 2007-08 season. Lawrence swept the two games a season ago by the scores of 6-2 and 4-2.

LAST SERIES

Two short-handed goals propelled Augsburg to a 6-3 non-conference victory over Lawrence on Saturday at Saugestad Rink.

Short-handed goals from Max Pernhem in the second period and Mack Ohnsted in the third broke a 3-3



tie.

Lawrence's Brandon **Boelter** scored the second of his two goals to tie it at 3-3 with 4:01 left in the second period. Ryan Rumble and Lane King picked up assists for the Vikings.

The Auggies then got a shorthanded goal from Pernhem with 2:58 left in the period to take a 4-3 lead after two. Ohnsted then picked up another short-hander with 7:06 left in the third to put Augsburg up 5-3.

Ohnsted then added a power-

play goal on a twoman advantage with 1:38 left to seal the victory.

Kaufer Jordyn stopped 31 shots to pick up the win for Auasbura. Mattias Brandon Boelter Soderqvist stopped



30 shots for the Vikings.

Lawrence grabbed an early 1-0 lead when Steve Hughes scored just 2:36 into the first period off a feed from Renato Engler.

That lead didn't last as Drew Anderson scored just over four minutes later to tie the game at 1-1. The Auggies took a 2-1 lead on Eli May's power-play goal at the 10:26 mark.

Boelter tied the game at 2-2 for the Vikings less than three minutes later when he scored off assists from Brad Mueller and Matt Moore.

Anderson grabbed the lead right back for Augsburg when he scored with 3:09 left in the first. The Auggies took that 3-2 advantage into the first intermission, and the scored stayed that way deep into the second period.

VIKINGS UPDATE

► Lawrence will play as many home games (four) in the next 16 days as it did in the first two months of the season.



Senior captain Brandon Boelter (Saginaw, Mich.) posted the first multi-goal game of his career when he scored twice on the power play at Augsburg. It was the first multi-point game for Boelter since he had two assists in a 5-4 victory at St. Norbert on Dec. 7, 2013. Boelter is tied for third on the team with five points.

Senior forward Renato Engler (Davos, Switzerland) picked up an assist at Augsburg and continues to lead the team in goals, assists and points. Engler has Renato Engler four goals and seven assists for 11 points.



▶Junior goaltender Mattias Soderqvist (Stockholm, Sweden) has seen the bulk of the action over the last three games. He currently has an .853 save percentage and Mattias Sodergvist

average. Sodergvist has 12 wins for his career and is just one win away from tying Grant Henderson for fifth place on the career wins list.

The Vikings went 5-for-23 on the power play over the past three games and are now 9-for-64 on the season. The Vikings have improved to 14.1 percent and that ranks seventh in the conference. The Vikings were 16-for-21 on the penalty kill and are last in the league at 72.5 percent (50-for-69).

The Vikings gave up a pair of shorthanded goals to Augsburg this past

Saturday. This marks the first time Lawrence had allowed two shorthanded goals in a game since a 6-6 tie with Gustavus Adolphus back on Nov. 29, 2013. Lawrence hadn't allowed a short-handed goal since the season opener vs. UW-Eau Claire.

Lawrence is tied for eighth in the NCHA in scoring at 2.27 goals per game. The Vikings are 10th in scoring defense at 5.18 goals per game.

SCOUTING CONCORDIA

Concordia has been on a roll since early November. The



Falcons are 7-1-1 in their last nine games dating back to Nov. 7. Concordia has won four straight, sweeping a non-conference series with Bethel and then sweeping a NCHA series with Aurora. The most impressive win in that stretch was a 2-1 victory at No. 10 UW-Eau Claire back on Nov. 20.

► Concordia hasn't played since the sweep of Aurora back on Dec. 4-5. The Falcons won 6-2 and 5-3.

Concordia picked up two points in this week's D3hockey.com Top 15 poll.

► Four freshmen are among the top five scorers for the Falcons. Rookie forward Stefan Seel is tops on the team with 15 points. He's tied for the team lead with six goals and tied for the top spot with nine assists. Sophomore Braden Crone is next with 14 points and he is tied with Seel with nine assists. Freshman forward Connor Hogg is third with 10 points and is tied with Seel with six goals.

►A pair of freshmen, Andy Munroe and Jack Romanuik, have split time in goal this season. Romanuik has a .928 save percentage to go with his 1.78 goals against average. His is 4-0-1 on the season. Munroe has a .920 save percentage and 2.17 GAA to go with his 4-2-0 record.
