►Lawrence completes the regular season with a home-and-home series with Lake Forest. The Vikings travel to Lake Forest for a 7 p.m. game on Friday and then host the Foresters in a 7 p.m. game on Saturday at the Appleton Family Ice Center.

THE COACHES

►Mike Szkodzinski (St. Norbert 2000) is in his 10th season at Lawrence and has a record of 105-145-22 (.426).

►Sean O'Malley (Brockport 2010) is in his second season at Lake Forest and has a record of 24-21-5 (.520).

THE SERIES

►In a series that dates back to the first season of Lawrence hockey, 1986-87, Lake Forest holds a 19-8-2 advantage. The Foresters have on the last four meetings, but prior to that, Lawrence had posted a 5-2-1 record over an eight-game stretch.

LAST SERIES

Lawrence picked up three points in the Northern Collegiate Hockey Association standings with a win and a tie at Northland last weekend.

In the series opener last Friday, Lawrence scored the game's final two goals and posted a 4-2 victory over Northland at the Bay Area Civic Center.

Four different players scored for

Lawrence, and goaltender Mattias Soderqvist made 41 saves to get the win for the Vikings.

The game was tied 2-2 when Ryan Eardley gave the Vikings the lead for good with just 1:06 left in the second period. He scored off assists from Brandon Boelter and Felix Henriksson to put the Vikings up 3-2.

Lawrence expanded that lead to 4-2 just 5:14 into the third period when senior forward Renato Engler scored off assists from linemates Nick Felan and Lane King.

The Vikings then withstood nearly two minutes at the end of the game with an extra attacker on the ice for the Lumberjacks.

Northland jumped out to a 1-0 lead just 1:32 into the game when Anthony Stempin scored. The Vikings tied it at 1-1 at the 8:05 mark on Matt Moore's goal off a pass from Ryan Rumble.

Rumble gave the Vikings a 2-1 advantage when he scored on the power play with Boelter and Steve Hughes picking up assists at the 12:57 mark of the first. The Vikings went 1-for-2 on the power play, and Northland was 0-for-4.

The score stayed that way until Northland's Oscar Larsson scored with 4:45 left in the second to tie it at 2-2.

AJ Smith made 27 saves and took the loss for Northland.

Lawrence settled for a 2-2 overtime tie with Northland in the series finale. Neither team scored for the final 21:52 of regulation or in the five-minute overtime, but the Vikings had the better of the play. Lawrence outshot the Lumberjacks 10-6 in the third

period and had three quality chances in the overtime.

The Vikings jumped on Northland just one minute into the game when freshman Josh Koeplinger scored off assists from Ryan Robertson and Jake Roeper for a 1-0 lead.

The Lumberjacks scored just 1:47 into the second period on Wyatt Gargan's goals, but Lawrence took the lead back late in the second.

The high-scoring line of King, Engler and Felan struck again when King scored with 4:28 left in the second off assists from Engler and Felan. The Lumberjacks tied it 2:26 later on Jason Reynolds' first goal of the season.

Soderqvist made 34 saves for the Vikings. Jason DeLillo stopped 29 shots for the Lumberjacks.

VIKINGS UPDATE

►Lawrence enters play this weekend two points behind MSOE for the final playoff spot from the North Division. St. Norbert has locked down the North's No. 1 spot and St. Scholastica is in the No. 2 position. While the Vikings face Lake Forest, MSOE has a tougher test as the Raiders take on No. 1-ranked St. Norbert. The No. 3 seed will travel to St. Scholastica for the NCHA quarterfinals on Feb. 26-27.

►A tie with MSOE in the standings would be good enough because Lawrence holds the tiebreaker with the Raiders. Lawrence posted a win and a tie in the series with the Raiders earlier this month.

►Lawrence coach Mike Szkodzinski has a bit of history on his side when it comes to the playoffs. The Vikings have qualified for the playoffs in every year of his tenure at Lawrence.

►Junior goaltender Mattias Soderqvist (Stockholm, Sweden) was named the NCHA Defensive Player of the Week for the second consecutive week and the third time this season. Soderqvist got a win and a tie in the series at

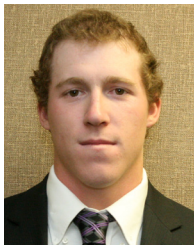


Mattias Soderqvist

►Soderqvist picked up a win and moved past Daniel Ljung for third place with 17 career wins. Evan Johnson tops the list with 41, and Andrew Isaac is second with 30.

►Senior defenseman Brandon Boelter (Saginaw, Mich.) picked up two assists last weekend and has 48 for his career. That moved him past William Thoren (47) for ninth place on the career list. Lawrence Hall of Famer Tom Conti ranks eighth with 49.

►Lawrence is seventh in the NCHA in scoring at 2.52 goals per game. The Vikings are eighth in scoring defense at 4.00 goals per game.

SCOUTING LAKE FOREST

►Lake Forest is in the same position as Lawrence in battling for a playoff spot. The Foresters are tied with Concordia (Wis.) for third place in the South Division, but Concordia holds the tie-breaker.

►The Foresters picked up four big points last weekend with 6-2 and 7-1 victories over visiting Finlandia last weekend.

►Junior forward Jack Lewis is the top goal scorer on the squad with 11, and Billy Kent and Ian Pichel have nine goals apiece. Lewis and Kent are tied for the team lead with 17 points. Sophomore forward Charlie Izaguirre has a team-high 11 assists.

►Senior goaltender Leo Podolsky is having a bit of a down season after posting some spectacular numbers in 2014-15. Podolsky has a 1.99 GAA and .940 save percentage a season ago, but has slipped to a 3.92 GAA and .882 save percentage this season.

►Lake Forest ranks sixth in the NCHA at 2.78 goals per game. The Foresters are ninth in scoring defense at 4.04 goals per game.

►The second period seems to be the make-or-break period for the Foresters. Lake Forest has scored 27 of its 64 goals this season in the second period. The Foresters have also allowed 40 of the opponents' 93 goals in the second period.
