### SCOUTING MARIAN

►Marian opened its season with an impressive split against No. 7 St. Norbert. After falling 4-1 in the season opener, the Sabres won 4-2 at the Cornerstone Community Center the following evening. Marian trailed 1-0 on Saturday but scored four consecutive goals, including two in a stretch of just 1:14 in the first two minutes of the second period.



►The win over St. Norbert was the first for rookie head coach Erik Largen, who came to Marian from the Janesville Jets of the North American Hockey League this summer. Largen took over for A.J. Aitken, who returned to St. Norbert to be the assistant coach for the Green Knights.

►Senior forward Devin Stuermer was named the NCHA Offensive Player of the Week after scoring the go-ahead goal and assisting on another in Marian's first victory ever against St. Norbert.

►Goaltenders Mike Gudmandson and Mike Baldwin both played last weekend against St. Norbert. Gudmandson was in net in Saturday's win over the Green Knights and finished with 23 saves. Baldwin gave up three goals and made 28 saves in the season opener.

The No. 9 UW-Eau Claire hockey team scored three third-period goals to break open a close game and defeated Lawrence University 5-1 at the Appleton Family Ice Center.



The Blugolds led 2-1 after the second period in the season opener for both teams, but Eau Claire scored twice in the first 9:20 of the final period to break it open.

Preston Hodge's goal to make it 3-1 came on a strange play. Lawrence was on the power play when the Vikings were called for a delayed penalty. Eau Claire goaltender Tyler Green was pulled and Hodge scored at the 5:16 mark on a short-handed goal.
