### THE COACHES

►Mike Szkodzinski (St. Norbert 2000) is in his 10th season at Lawrence and has a record of 103-145-20 (.422).

►Mark Ostapina (Wisconsin 1979) is in his 15th season at MSOE and has a record of 224-167-15 (.570). He is in his 30th season overall and has a record of 287-252-23 (.531).

### THE SERIES

►In a series that dates back to the 1992-93, MSOE holds a 49-20-2 advantage. The Vikings won the season series finale last season to snap MSOE's 12-game win streak in the series.

### LAST SERIES

Top-ranked Adrian swept a Northern Collegiate Hockey Association series from the visiting Vikings last weekend.

Adrian pulled away early and rolled to an 8-2 win the series opener last Friday.

The Bulldogs scored four times in the first period and got two goals

apiece from Trevor Boyd and Connor Armour in the game.

Lawrence got goals from a pair of freshmen, Josh Koepplinger and Nick Felan.

Adrian scored two goals in a span of 26 seconds in the first period to grab the lead. Armour got the Bulldogs on the board at the 11:28 mark, and Adrian went on the power play immediately with Boyd scoring on the man-advantage at 11:54 for a 2-0 edge.

Lawrence cut the lead in half on Felan's goal at 13:27 with Brendan Vetter and Lane King picking up assists.

The Bulldogs stretched the lead to 4-1 as Cory Dunn and Taylor McCloy both scored in the final 5:35 of the period.

Koepplinger gave the Vikings some hope when he scored off assists from Vetter and King just 1:11 into the second period to trim the margin to 4-2.

Adrian struck back quickly with two goals in a span of 1:34. Boyd scored at 5:16 and Brent Sauve scored at 6:50 to push the lead to 6-2. Adrian added goals by Mat Thompson and Armour in the third period.

Tyler Parks made 31 saves to pick up the win for Adrian. Mattias Soderqvist started and made 16 saves for the Vikings before being removed in the second period. Greg Procopio stopped 18 shots in relief for the Vikings.

Adrian skated to a 5-1 win on Saturday to complete the series sweep.

Jeremy Olinyk scored twice for the Bulldogs, who picked up three goals on special teams. Adrian went 2-for-8

on the power play and added a short-handed goal.

Dillon Kelley made 21 saves to pick up the win for Adrian. Procopio stopped 30 shots for the Vikings.

Adrian scored a pair of first-period power-play goals, including one with just three seconds left, for a 2-0 edge after one.

Olinyk made it 3-0 on a goal just 3:16 into the second period, and he picked up a short-handed goal at the 10:41 mark of the second for a 4-0 lead.

The Bulldogs led 5-0 when Lawrence's Ryan Robertson scored his first career goal at the 12:57 mark of the third. The junior defenseman scored off assists from Jake Roeper and Koepflinger.

## VIKINGS UPDATE

►Lawrence is in a brutal stretch of games to finish the season. Including the games at Adrian, Lawrence will play just two of its final eight games at the Appleton Family Ice Center.



►The Vikings slipped back to fifth place in the NCHA North Division. Northland swept Finlandia last weekend and moved up to fourth place with 12 points. The Vikings are now fifth with 11 points and both teams are chasing MSOE (14 points) for the final playoff berth. St. Norbert and St. Scholastica comfortably lead the division with 24 and 22 points, respectively. While Lawrence and MSOE face off this weekend, Northland hosts No. 2-ranked St. Norbert.

►Senior forward Matt Moore (Grosse Pointe Park, Mich.) played in his 100th game for the Vikings this past Saturday. Moore is just the ninth player to hit the 100-game plateau for Lawrence. Senior defenseman Brandon Boelter (Saginaw, Mich.)

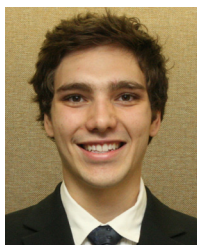

►The Vikings also got forward Ryan Rumble (Newmarket, Ontario) and defenseman Brendan Vetter (Phillips, Wis.) back last weekend. Rumble went out of the game vs. St. Scholastica on Jan. 22 after taking a shot off his helmet. Vetter has been battling injury all season but played in both games last weekend at Adrian.

►Junior Ryan Robertson (Alpharetta, Ga.) picked up his first career goal vs. Adrian last Saturday. Robertson has a pair of assists this season for a total of three points.

►Freshman goaltender Greg Procopio played the bulk of the minutes last weekend at Adrian. He allowed two goals in 33 minutes of relief in the opener last Friday and then made the start on Saturday. He now has a 5.48 GAA and .835 save percentage on the season.

►The Vikings have now gone four games without a power-play goal. Lawrence is now 0-for-18 on the man-advantage in the last four contests. Lawrence is sixth in the NCHA on the power play at 14.0 percent (14-100).

►The Vikings went 8-for-11 on the penalty kill last weekend to fall to 76.0 percent (76-100) for the season. Lawrence ranks eighth in the league on the penalty kill.
