THE SERIES

The game was tied 3-3 heading to the third period, but the Vikings struck early. Rookie forward Nick Felan hammered in a rebound just 1:21 into the period to put the Vikings up 4-3.

After killing off a pair of penalties, Lawrence expanded its lead when Sean Reynolds scored off a rebound at the 12:34 mark for a 5-3 advantage.

The Foresters then pulled goalie Leo Podolsky with just under three minutes left, but Matt Montemurro sealed the win for Lawrence with a short-handed empty-net goal with 1:01 remaining.

Mattias Soderqvist stopped 40 shots to pick up the win for the Vikings. Podolsky made 47 saves for Lake Forest.

Lake Forest College scored three times in the third period Friday to post a 4-2 win at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse and create the do-or-die game in the season finale.

VIKINGS UPDATE

►Lawrence faced a must-win game this past Saturday against Lake Forest, and the Vikings had to fight from a two-goal deficit to win. The Vikings entered the game on Saturday two points behind MSOE for the final play-off spot from the North Division. Lawrence's victory forged a tie with MSOE, and the Vikings held the tiebreaker over the Raiders.

►Lawrence coach Mike Szkodzinski has seen his team make the conference playoffs in all 10 of his seasons with the Vikings.

►Lawrence has a 9-7-2 record in the quarterfinal playoff round during Mike Szkodzinski's tenure with the Vikings.

►The win over Lake Forest also marked the first time this season Lawrence had rallied from a two-goal deficit to win. The Vikings trailed 3-1 just three minutes into the second period and

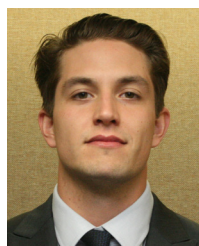

►The two goals the Vikings scored in the second period against Lake Forest were the quickest back-to-back goals Lawrence had scored all season. Lawrence trailed 3-1 when senior forward Steve Hughes (Goodrich, Mich.) scored at the 3:34 mark. Senior forward Renato Engler (Davos, Switzerland) scored just 24 seconds later to tie the game at 3-3. The quickest back-to-back goals had come from Jake Kreutzer (Orchard Lake, Mich.) and Felix Henriksson (Helsinki, Finland) in 47 seconds as part of a 6-4 win over Aurora on Jan. 16.

►The Vikings had some serious balance to the offense against Lake Forest as 14 players picked up at least one point in the weekend series. Defenseman

Matt Montemurro (Glenview, Ill.) led the way with three points. He also scored the first short-handed goal of his career in the closing minutes of Saturday's win over the Foresters.

►Senior forward Renato Engler (Davos, Switzerland) leads the team in all three categories with nine goals, 16 assists and 25 points. Rookie Forward Nick Felan (Highland Village, Texas) is second in all three with seven goals, 13 assists and 20 points.

►Junior goaltender Mattias Soderqvist (Stockholm, Sweden) continued his great play in the second half of the season and heads into the playoffs on a high note. Soderqvist has posted a 2.69 goals against average and .929 save percentage in the second half of the season. On the season, he has a 3.48 GAA and .902 save percentage.

►Senior defenseman Brandon Boelter (Saginaw, Mich.) picked up another assist last weekend and now has 49 for his career. That moves him into a tie for eighth place on Lawrence's career list with Hall of Famer Tom Conti.

►The Vikings went 1-for-7 on the power play last weekend and are at 14.8 percent (18-122) on the season. That ranks fifth in the NCHA.

►The Vikings went 10-for-10 on the penalty kill last weekend to improve to 80.0 percent (100-125) for the season. Lawrence ranks seventh in the league on the penalty kill.

►Lawrence is sixth in the NCHA in scoring at 2.64 goals per game. The Vikings are eighth in scoring defense at 3.96 goals per game.

SCOUTING ST. SCHOLASTICA

►St. Scholastica ran the murderer's row of the NCHA over the past two weekends. The Saints hosted No. 1-ranked St. Norbert



and then took on No. 2-ranked Adrian the last two weekends. St. Scholastica played four tight games but posted a 0-3-1 record against the nation's top teams.

►St. Scholastica hasn't won a game since a 5-1 victory at Concordia (Wis.) on Feb. 6. The Saints posted 6-2 and 3-1 wins at Lawrence back in January.

►The Saints are ranked 15th this week in the USCHO.com poll. The Saints are 16th in the D3hockey.com poll.

►St. Scholastica is paced by the trio of high-scoring forwards. Senior Dylan Nowakowski is tops on the team with 13 goals, 22 assists and 35 points. Junior Brandon Millin is tied for the team lead with 13 goals and has 16 assists for 29 points. Senior Keegan Bruce also has 29 points on 10 goals and 19 assists.

►The Saints rank fourth in the league in scoring at 3.60 goals per game. St. Scholastica is fifth in scoring defense at 2.40 goals per contest.

►St. Scholastica boasts the top power play in the league at 27.6 percent (32-116). Keegan Bruce has a team-best six power-play goals.
