Austin Frank scored twice in the final 6:20 Saturday to lift Lawrence to the victory over St. Olaf.

Lindblad's power-play goal just 2:27 into the third period. All three of St. Olaf's goals came on the man-advantage.

Lawrence struck back on the power play after Judd Loewenstein was sent off for cross-checking at 13:08. Frank, off assists from Brandon Boelter and Nick Felan, scored at the 13:40 mark to tie the game at 3-3.

The Vikings then killed off a penalty before getting the game-winner. Frank scored with just 1:15 left off assists from Brad Mueller and Sean Reynolds to give Lawrence the lead.

St. Olaf pulled goaltender Robert MacDonald for the final 56 seconds but couldn't get the equalizer. MacDonald made 27 saves for the Oles.

Mattias Soderqvist stopped 25 shots to pick up the win for Lawrence.

Josh Koeplinger gave Lawrence a 1-0 lead when he scored on the power play at 7:21 of the first with assists from Felan and Renato Engler. The Oles tied it with Lindblad's power-play with with 2:00 left in the first.

Mikkel Joehnk put Lawrence on top 2-1 with a goal 4:37 into the second as Koeplinger and Mueller picked up assists. St. Olaf tied it at 2-2 on Ole Setsaas' power-play goal at the 9:57 mark.

The Vikings went 2-for-9 on the power play, and St. Olaf was 3-for-8.

On Friday, UW-Eau Claire's Brandon Wahlin scored just 3:50 into the game and the Blugolds were on their way. Wahlin also added a goal in the third period.

Ethan Nauman scored midway through the first period, and the Blugolds led 2-0 after the first. Garret Clemment then scored at the 12:08 mark of the second for a 3-0 after two.

Eau Claire then scored four times in the third to break the game open.

Tyler Green made 19 saves to pick up the shutout for Eau Claire. Freshman Greg Procopio, playing in his first collegiate game, made 30 saves for Lawrence.

►Lawrence coach Mike Szkodzinski earned career victory No. 100 when his Vikings defeated St. Olaf last Saturday. Szkodzinski is Lawrence's career wins leader by a wide margin. Dave Ruhly, who coached the Vikings from 1999-2006, is second on the wins list with 50.



►Sophomore defenseman Austin Frank (DeForest, Wis.) was chosen for the all-tournament team at the Thanksgiving Showdown last weekend. Frank scored two late goals, the equalizer and the game-winner, in Lawrence's 4-3 victory over St. Olaf. Frank is tied for the team lead with three goals and has a pair of assists for five points.

►Senior forward Renato Engler (Davos, Switzerland) picked up one assist on the weekend and leads the team with six. He also has two goals for a team-best eight points.

►Freshman forward Josh Koeplinger (Saginaw, Mich.) also scored against St. Olaf and is tied with Frank for the team lead with three goals. He has one assist and four points.

►Junior goaltender Mattias Soderqvist (Stockholm, Sweden) picked up the win against St. Olaf and improved his goals against average to 3.94 and his save percentage to .861. Soderqvist now has 12 wins for his career and is just one win away from tying Grant Henderson for fifth place on the career wins list.

The teams then skated to a 2-2 overtime tie in the series finale as St. Norbert rallied from a 2-0 deficit.

►Senior forward Erik Cooper is tops on the team with six assists, and he has four goals for a team-high 10 points. Junior forward Noah Nelson has the team lead with six goals, and he has three assists for nine points.

►Junior Tony Kujava has been dominant in goal this season. He leads the NCHA with a 0.96 goals against average and .946 save percentage. Kujava is 7-0-0 on the season.

►The last time St. Norbert lost a game when leading after two periods was Lawrence's 5-4 victory over the Green Knights at the Cornerstone Community Center on Dec. 7, 2013.
