### THE COACHES

►Mike Szkodzinski (St. Norbert 2000) is in his 10th season at Lawrence and has a record of 99-137-19 (.425).

►Matt Loen (UW-Eau Claire 1995) is in his ninth season at UW-Eau Claire and has a record of 127-89-16 (.582).

►Sean Goldsworthy (St. Olaf 1994) is in his 20th season at St. Olaf and has a record of 196-239-64 (.457).

### THE SERIES

►UW-Eau Claire holds a 7-1-0 lead in a series that started during the 2000-01 season. Lawrence's lone victory in the series was a 3-2 triumph in the 2009-10 campaign.

►St. Olaf has an 18-4-0 lead in a series that dates to the 1987-88 season. Lawrence has won three of the last four meetings, including a 4-3 victory last season.

### LAST SERIES

The Vikings split a Northern Collegiate Hockey Association series at Finlandia last weekend. The Lions won Friday's opener 4-3 in overtime and Lawrence took the finale in convincing fashion 7-2.

Lawrence rallied to tie it in the third period Friday, but Bryce Mitzel scored 1:08 into overtime to deliver the victory for Finlandia at Houghton County Arena.

Lawrence trailed 2-0 heading into the third but tied it midway through the period.

Freshman Nick Felan scored his first collegiate goal at the 6:32 mark to cut the lead to 2-1.

Austin Frank then scored off a feed from Matt Moore at the 10:44 mark to tie the game at 2-2.

Finlandia countered with a goal from Thomas Malkmus at the 15:53 to grab a 3-2 advantage. Lawrence struck back just 16 seconds later when Steve Hughes scored his first goal of the season to tie it. Felan and Ryan Rumble picked up assists on Hughes' goal.

Mattias Soderqvist made 19 saves for the Vikings, and Walker Enstad made 29 saves for Finlandia. Lawrence had a 32-23 edge in shots.

The Vikings came up empty on the power play at 0-for-4, and the Lions were 1-for-5.

Lawrence University broke on top early and never looked back on Saturday.

Rumble and Sean Reynolds scored two goals apiece, and Renato Engler had a goal and three assists for the Vikings. Sophomore Lane King, who transferred to Lawrence from Finlandia earlier this year, picked up three assists against his former mates.

Soderqvist made 25 saves to earn the victory for Lawrence.

The Vikings broke on top less than five minutes into the game. After Lawrence's Ryan Eardley was sent off for interference at the 3:49 mark, Engler scored a short-hander at 4:44 and Lawrence led 1-0.

The score stayed that way until early in the second when Rumble scored an even-strength goal 2:27 into the period. Reynolds scored on the power play at 13:36, and Eardley added a goal at 15:53 off a feed from Engler to make it 4-0.

Freshman Josh Koepflinger scored just 2:32 into the third to put the Vikings up 5-0, and Reynolds stretched the lead to 6-0 when he scored Lawrence's second short-hander of the night off a pass from Engler.

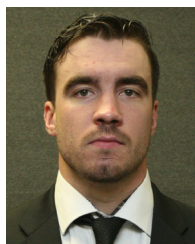
The Lions broke up the shutout with a pair of power-play goals late in the third, and Rumble scored again with 1:10 remaining to complete the scoring for Lawrence.

► Junior forward Sean Reynolds (Anaheim, Calif.) recorded the first multi-goal game of his career with a pair of goals in Saturday's 7-2 win over Finlandia. They were the first two goals of the season for Reynolds.

► Senior forward Ryan Rumble (Newmarket, Ontario) recorded the third multi-goal game of his career with two goals in the 7-2 win over Finlandia. Rumble matched his career high of two goals in a game, which he did at Adrian on Feb. 8, 2014, and vs. St. Olaf on Nov. 30, 2014.

► The seven goals is the most in a game for Lawrence since the Vikings defeated Northland College 8-6 back on Nov. 10, 2012.

► Lawrence scored a pair of short-handed goals in Saturday's victory over Finlandia, and that hasn't happened since the 2012-13 season. The Vikings did it twice that season, vs. Finlandia on Dec. 1, 2012, and at Northland on Nov. 9, 2012.

► Sophomore forward Lane King (Waunakee, Wis.) established a career high with three assists this past Saturday against his former team, Finlandia. King, who transferred to Lawrence this fall, had three assists total during his rookie season in 2014-15.

► Freshman forward Nick Felan (Highlands Village, Texas) returned to the lineup against Finlandia and picked up his first collegiate goal in the series opener.

► Junior goaltender Mattias Soderqvist (Stockholm, Sweden) improved to a 4.11 goals against average and .855 save percentage. Soderqvist now has 11 wins for his career and is just two wins shy of tying Grant Henderson for fifth place on the career wins list.

►UW-Eau Claire is ranked 10th this week in both the USCHO and D3hockey.com polls.

►Junior forward Adam Knochenmus is tops on the team with nine goals in just eight games. He also has three assists for a total of 12 points. Junior forward Garret Clemment is tops on the squad with seven assists.

►Both Jay Deo and Tyler Green have been superb in goal for the Blugolds. Deo is 3-0-1 with a 1.72 GAA and .936 save percentage. Green is 2-1-1 with a 1.73 GAA and .935 save percentage.
