## THE COACHES

Joel DePagter (Lawrence 1998), the 1997 Midwest Conference Player of the Year and 2009 Midwest Conference Coach of the Year, is in his seventh season at Lawrence and has a record of 86-59 (.593). Paul Combs (Ripon 1993) is in his first season at Carroll. He is in his 15th season overall and has a record of 219-161 (.576).

## THE SERIES

Lawrence holds a 70-62 lead in the series that dates back to 1907. Carroll has won the last two meetings with the Vikings.

## LAST MEETING

Carroll scored 46 second-half points and held Lawrence to just 24

percent shooting after the break to rally for a 74-68 Midwest Conference victory on Jan. 23, 2013, at Alexander Gymnasium.

Kevin Hurd and Alec Molter both posted double-doubles for Carroll. Hurd had 16 points and 10 rebounds, and Molter had 10 of 13 points and 10 of his 11 rebounds in the second half.

Conor Klusendorf had a double-double of 12 points and a game-high 13 rebounds to pace Lawrence. Ryan DePouw led the Vikings with 15 points and Tyler Mazur added 13.

Lawrence was in command in the first half as the Vikings sprinted to a 38-28 lead at the break while shooting 53.6 percent from the floor.

The Vikings went cold in the second half and hit on only 7 of 29 shots (24.1 percent) from the floor. Lawrence was 3-for-14 on 3-pointers in the second half, connecting on just one of its first 12 tries from beyond the arc in the final 20 minutes.

Lawrence led 43-30 early in the second half, but Carroll scored 14 consecutive points to take a 44-43 lead on Molter's layup with 13:40 left. The

teams then traded the lead before the Pioneers took the lead for good at 49-48 on Hurd's layup with 9:33 left.

Carroll built its lead to as many as nine points at 60-51, but Klusendorf answered with a three-point play. Lawrence then trimmed the lead back to 62-58 on a pair of free throws from DePouw with 2:27 left.

Lawrence missed its next two shots from the floor, both 3-pointers, and Carroll pushed the lead back to 68-58. Lawrence never got closer than six points after that.

### LAST GAME

Bryant Ackerman came off the bench to score 29 points and lead Elmhurst to a 96-81 nonconference victory over Lawrence on Nov. 23 at Alexander Gymnasium.

Kyle Wuest added 25 points, and Nick Sanford had a double-double with 13 points and 11 rebounds for the Bluejays.

Chris Siebert scored 26 points to lead Lawrence and became the 21st player in school history to top the 1,000-point plateau. Siebert now has 1,019 points in his career and moved past Rob Cohen (1,005) into 20th place on the career scoring list.

Lawrence made several runs at the Bluejays in the second half, but Elmhurst was deadly from long-range after the break. The Bluejays went 6-for-8 from beyond the arc in the second half and hit 52.4 percent (11-21) for the game.

Ackerman went 10-for-15 from the floor, including 7-for-10 from 3-point range.

The Vikings trailed by 10 at the half and were still down by that margin after a 3-pointer from Ackerman with 14:19 left. Lawrence then reeled off eight consecutive points, six coming on back-to-back 3-pointers from Siebert, to cut the margin to 58-56 with 12:47 left.

The Bluejays answered with a conventional three-point play from Wuest, five consecutive points from Ackerman and a layup from Will Nixon to push the lead back to 68-58.

Sanford then hit a jumper and Ackerman made another 3-pointer to answer for the Bluejays. Sonnleitner, who finished with 12 points and five rebounds, buried another 3-pointer for Lawrence, but Elmhurst scored the next five points to push the margin back to 82-68.

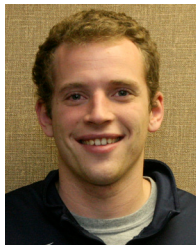
### VIKINGS UPDATE

►Lawrence opens its Midwest Conference season with a stern test against Carroll. The Vikings figure to be one of the teams Lawrence will have to battle for a spot in the MWC Tournament so it is an important early contest.



►Lawrence is 6-0 in Midwest Conference opens under head coach Joel DePagter.

►Senior guard Chris Siebert (Baraboo, Wis./Baraboo) topped the 1,000-point plateau after scoring 26 in the game against Elmhurst. Siebert is the 21st player in Lawrence history with 1,000 points.

►With 1,019 points, Siebert is 20th in Lawrence career scoring. He passed Rob Cohen (1,005) on the list against Elmhurst. Next up are Jim Rasmussen (1,030) and Bob Townsend (1,031).

►Siebert ranks fourth in the conference in scoring at 23.7 points per game. He is the only Lawrence player among the top 30 scorers in the league.

►Siebert and senior guard Brian Gryszkiewicz (Menomonee Falls, Wis./Sussex Hamilton) are tied for the team lead in assists at 3.7 per game. That ranks sixth in the Midwest Conference. Gryszkiewicz had a season-high six assists against Elmhurst.

►Lawrence ranks fourth in the league at 15.3 assists per game. The Vikings are second in the conference with .56 assists per made basket. Illinois College leads the league in assists at 26.0 per game, and the Blueboys are at an

►Lawrence ranks fifth in the Midwest Conference in scoring offense at 82.0 points per game. The Vikings are eighth in scoring defense at 90.7 points per contest.

►The Vikings are eighth in the league field goal percentage at 45.1 percent and fourth in 3-point shooting at 34.4 percent. The Vikings rank eighth in field goal percentage defense at 51.1 percent and 11th in 3-point field goal percentage defense at 54.9 percent.

day. Rose Hulman's Julian Strickland missed a 3-pointer with six seconds left that would have tied it for the Engineers. Alec Molter paced Carroll with 20 points and seven rebounds.

▶Carroll opened its conference season on Nov. 26 with a 67-51 victory over visiting Lake Forest.

▶Carroll has a new coach this season, but he should be a familiar face to long-time MWC followers. Paul Combs played basketball at Ripon for Bob Gillespie in the early 1990s and then served as Gillespie's assistant. Combs has had coaching stops at Lakeland, UW-Platteville and Wayne State before coming to Carroll.

▶The Pioneers have three players averaging in double figures. Alec Molter leads the squad at 14.8 points per game and is shooting 75 percent (18-24) from the floor. Molter leads the Midwest Conference in field goal percentage. Molter also is averaging a team-best 6.5 rebounds per game. Kevin Hurd and Andrew Nottling are both averaging 12.0 points per game.

▶Carroll is last in the league in scoring offense at 65.0 points per game, but the Pioneers are first in scoring defense at 60.7 points per contest.

▶The Pioneers are first in the conference in field goal percentage at 54.8 percent. Carroll ranks third in field goal percentage defense at 40.4 percent.

▶Carroll ranks 10th in the league in 3-point shooting at 25.0 percent, but the Pioneers are tops in the league at defending the 3-pointer at 27.8 percent.

## 2013-14 Game Recaps

### November 15

#### Lawrence 92, Wisconsin Lutheran 77

APPLETON, Wis. — Chris Siebert poured in 30 points to lead the Lawrence



University men's basketball team to a 92-77 nonconference victory over Wisconsin Lutheran College in the season opener for both teams.

Siebert, a senior guard, hit 11 of 15 shots from the floor, including 4 of 7 from 3-point range. Siebert, who matched the career high for points he set last season at Monmouth College, also had three rebounds, four assists and a steal.

All five starters scored in double figures for Lawrence (1-0), and the starters combined to shoot 30-for-50 (60 percent) from the floor. Ryan DePouw added 14 points for the Vikings, and Jamie Nikitas had 12 points, a game-high nine rebounds and a game-high seven steals. Brian Gryzkiewicz also had 12 points, and Davis DeWolfe had 11.

Jake Jarnigo led Wisconsin Lutheran (0-1) with 25 points and eight rebounds.

The Warriors led only once in the first half, by one point, and Lawrence got a jumper from Siebert to post a 41-36 lead at the break.

The Vikings pulled away early in the second half with a 7-0 run to push the advantage to 53-44 with 16:26 remaining. Lawrence then went on another 7-0 spurt, capped by DeWolfe's 3-pointer, to build a 65-49 lead with 13:30 left.

Lawrence maintained that advantage for the rest of the game. The Vikings led by as many as 22 points and never led by less than 14 points the rest of the way.

lead the No. 4 UW-Stevens Point men's basketball team to a 99-73 nonconference win over Lawrence University at Quandt Fieldhouse.

Hass went 13-for-17 from the floor and hit all seven of his 3-point attempts, but he did miss all four of his shots from the foul line. Tyler Tillema added 23 points as he went 9-for-11 from the field. The Pointers shot 36-for-60 from the floor for a red-hot 60 percent.

Lawrence (1-1) got a balanced attack with five players scoring in double figures. Chris Siebert and Ryan DePouw scored 15 points apiece to pace the Vikings. Jamie Nikitas added 11 points, and Tyler Mazur and Davis DeWolfe chipped in with 10 points apiece.

Stevens Point (1-0) jumped out to a double-digit lead early in the game and held that type of advantage until the second half. The Vikings trailed 64-48 before going on a 13-3 scoring run.

Siebert scored five points in that stretch and Mazur drilled a 3-pointer during the run. Tom Antosz finished the outburst and cut the Pointers' lead to 67-61 with 11:29 left in the contest.

The Pointers bounced right back and scored the game's next six points over the next 1:25 to grab a 73-61 edge. Lawrence never got closer than eight points the rest of the way.

#### Elmhurst 96, Lawrence 81

— Bryant Ackerman came off the bench to score 29 points and lead the Elmhurst College men's basketball team to a 96-81 nonconference victory over Lawrence University at Alexander Gymnasium.

Kyle Wuest added 25 points, and Nick Sanford had a double-double with 13 points and 11 rebounds for the Bluejays (2-2).

Chris Siebert scored 26 points to lead Lawrence (1-2) and became the

21st player in school history to top the 1,000-point plateau. Siebert now has 1,019 points in his career and moved past Rob Cohen (1,005) into 20th place on the career scoring list.

Lawrence made several runs at the Bluejays in the second half, but Elmhurst was deadly from long-range after the break. The Bluejays went 6-for-8 from beyond the arc in the second half and hit 52.4 percent (11-21) for the game.

Ackerman went 10-for-15 from the floor, including 7-for-10 from 3-point range.

The Vikings trailed by 10 at the half and were still down by that margin after a 3-pointer from Ackerman with 14:19 left. Lawrence then reeled off eight consecutive points, six coming on back-to-back 3-pointers from Siebert, to cut the margin to 58-56 with 12:47 left.

The Bluejays answered with a conventional three-point play from Wuest, five consecutive points from Ackerman and a layup from Will Nixon to push the lead back to 68-58.

After a Wuest free throw moved the lead to 72-59 with 9:19 left, Lawrence made another run. Troy Miller drilled a 3-pointer and Trace Sonnleitner followed with another 3-pointer to cut the margin to 72-65 with 8:13 left.

Sanford then hit a jumper and Ackerman made another 3-pointer to answer for the Bluejays. Sonnleitner, who finished with 12 points and five rebounds, buried another 3-pointer for Lawrence, but Elmhurst scored the next five points to push the margin back to 82-68.

Lawrence didn't get closer than 10 points the rest of the way.
