THE COACHES

Joel DePagter (Lawrence 1998), the 1997 Midwest Conference Player of the Year and 2009 Midwest Conference Coach of the Year, is in his seventh season at Lawrence and has a record of 86-58 (.597). John Baines (Illinois Wesleyan 1998) is in his first season at Elmhurst. He is in his fourth season overall and has a record of 57-38 (600).

THE SERIES

The only meeting between the teams took place last season when Elmhurst posted a 76-65 victory over the Vikings at Elmhurst.

LAST MEETING

Lawrence had a frigid shooting

night from long range on Dec. 12, 2012, and Elmhurst posted a 76-65 nonconference victory at R.A. Faganel Hall.

Lawrence, one of the top 3-point shooting teams in the Midwest Conference, connected on only 5 of 22 shots from beyond the arc (22.7 percent). The Vikings also were outrebounded 37-20.

Nick Sanford scored 18 points and grabbed nine rebounds to pace Elmhurst. Taylor Baxter added 17 points and six boards for the Bluejays.

Conor Klusendorf and Davis De-Wolfe scored 13 points apiece for the Vikings. Ryan DePouw and Max Burgess added 10 points apiece for Lawrence.

Elmhurst went on an early 13-2 run to grab a 20-9 lead with 11:44 left in the first half. The Bluejays would build that lead to 38-22 at the half.

The Bluejays opened the second half with an 11-5 run to push the lead to 22 points at 49-27. Lawrence chipped away at the lead throughout the second half and finally got it under double digits at 72-63 on Burgess'

layup with 1:00 left.

Elmhurst then hit four consecutive free throws to seal the win.

LAST GAME

Trevor Hass scored 33 points to lead No. 4 UW-Stevens Point to a 99-73 nonconference win over Lawrence this past Saturday at Ouandt Fieldhouse.

Hass went 13-for-17 from the floor and hit all seven of his 3-point attempts, but he did miss all four of his shots from the foul line. Tyler Tillema added 23 points as he went 9-for-11 from the field. The Pointers shot 36for-60 from the floor for a red-hot 60 percent.

Lawrence got a balanced attack with five players scoring in double figures. Chris Siebert and Ryan DePouw scored 15 points apiece to pace the Vikings. Jamie Nikitas added 11 points, and Tyler Mazur and Davis DeWolfe chipped in with 10 points apiece.

Stevens Point jumped out to a double-digit lead early in the game and held that type of advantage until the second half. The Vikings trailed 64-48 before going on a 13-3 scoring run.

Siebert scored five points in that stretch and Mazur drilled a 3-pointer during the run. Tom Antosz finished the outburst with a basket and cut the Pointers' lead to 67-61 with 11:29 left in the contest.

The Pointers bounced right back and scored the game's next six points over the next 1:25 to grab a 73-61 edge. Lawrence never got closer than eight points the rest of the way.

VIKINGS UPDATE

▶Lawrence opened its season with a 92-77 victory over Wisconsin Lutheran last Friday, it marked the first time Lawrence had won a season



opener since defeating Marian 77-68 on Nove. 17, 2009. Lawrence improved to 64-47 in season openers. At one point in Lawrence's long bas-

▶ Siebert opened the campaign with a 30-point performance in the win over Wisconsin Lutheran. The 30 points ties his career high, which he set last season at Monmouth. Siebert is leading the team at 22.5 points and 3.5 assists per game.

▶ Lawrence coach Joel DePagter said in the season preview that finding the proper balance of minutes for his deep team would be his toughest job this season. The first two games show that DePagter is going to play a lot of people to figure out the best rotation. Through two games, of Lawrence's 16 players, the only player who hasn't seen action is injured. Additionally, 11 of those players are averaging at least 7.0 minutes per game.

▶Junior guard Ryan DePouw (Oconto, Wis./Oconto) continues to showcase why he is one of the most versatile players in the league. DePouw is averag- Ryan DePouw ing 14.5 points per



game and is tops on the team at 6.5 rebounds per game. DePouw, while known as a great 3-point shooter, has been very adept at getting to the line. He has made more free throws (13) than anyone else has attempted this season. DePouw, who led the team in free throws made (81) and attempted (104) last season, is 13-for-17 from the line this season.

A focus for the Vikings this season is rebounding, and so far, so good. Lawrence is plus-1.0 in rebounding margin through two games. Lawrence is at 35.5 rebounds per game, and the opponents are at 34.5.

▶Lawrence ranks sixth in the Miwest Conference in scoring offense at 82.5 points per game. The Vikings are eighth in scoring defense at 88.0 points per contest.

▶The Vikings are fourth in the league

The Vikings rank eighth in field goal percentage defense at 52.1 percent and 11th in 3-point field goal percentage defense at 56.7 percent. That last number is skewed after UW-Stevens Point hit 12 of 16 3-pointers (75 percent) in the last game.

SCOUTING ELMHURST

▶Elmhurst picked up its first victory of the season with a wild 77-76 victory at Benedictine (III.) on Wednesday night. With the



Bluejays up by three, Benedictine's Michael Woolf was fouled at mid-court and banked home a half-court shot. The officials ruled Woolf was not in the act of shooting at the time so the basket was waived off. Woolf did hit both free throws with four seconds left to cut the margin to 77-76. The Bluejays stepped on the baseline on their ensuing possession, giving Benedictine

a chance to win the game with just under four seconds to play. Elmhurst managed to knock away the inbounds pass and Michael Blaszczyk's desperation 3-pointer came up short.

▶The Bluejays have three players averaging in double figures thus far this season. Guards Kyle Wuest and Bryant Ackerman are both averaging 14.7 points per game, and forward Nick Sanford isn't far behind at 13.7 per contest.

Sanford is averaging a double-double at this point in the season with a team-high 10.0 rebounds per game to go with his 13.7 points per contest.

▶The Bluejays are averaging 69.7 points per game while the opponents are scoring at a 72.3-point clip.

▶Elmhurst is shooting 40.4 percent from the floor while opponents are shooting 39.4 percent from the floor. The Bluejays have struggled from beyond the arc, shooting at just 27.7 percent on 3-pointers. Opponents are shooting 31.3 percent from 3-point range.

▶Elmhurst has recorded just nine steals in three games this season. Lawrence guard Jamie Nikitas (Glenview, Ill./Glenbrook South) is averaging more steals per game (3.5) than the entire Elmhurst squad (3.0).
