#### **THE COACHES**

▶Joel DePagter (Lawrence 1998), the 1997 Midwest Conference Player of the Year and 2009 Midwest Conference Coach of the Year, is in his seventh season at Lawrence and has a record of 90-62 (.592).

▶Ryan Kane (St. Norbert 1999), an assistant coach with the Vikings during the Midwest Conference championship season of 2007-08, is in his second season at Ripon and has a record of 20-15 (.571).

#### **THE SERIES**

▶In a series that goes all the way back to 1906, Ripon holds a 132-81 advantage. The series has been much more even in recent years, with Lawrence holding a 17-13 edge in the rivalry since the start of the 1999-2000 season.

#### **LAST GAME**

Fourteenth-ranked St. Norbert used a scoring surge late in the first half to build a double-digit lead and then maintained that advantage in an 81-68 Midwest Conference win over Lawrence last Saturday at Schuldes Sports Center.

St. Norbert went on a 13-2 run over the final 3:36 of the first half to build a 41-30 lead at the break. Lawrence closed to within eight points early in the second half, but the Green Knights were able to keep the Vikings at arm's length the rest of the way.

St. Norbert led by as many as 15 points until the final minute. Lawrence couldn't get closer than 12 points in the final 10 minutes of the game as the teams traded baskets consistently during the second half.

UW-Green Bay transfer Kam Cerroni hit seven 3-pointers on his way to a game-high 23 points. The Green Knights went 11-for-19 (57.9 percent)

from beyond the arc in the game.

Jamie Nikitas paced Lawrence with 22 points. The sophomore guard went 6-for-10 from the floor, including 4-for-5 from 3-point range. Junior forward Rvan DePouw added 16 points. and Chris Siebert had 14 points for the Vikings.

Austin Elliott added 15 points for St. Norbert, and Andrew Schwoerer had 11 points and a game-high nine rebounds.

#### **VIKINGS UPDATE**

▶Lawrence faced its third ranked opponent of the season when it traveled to No. 14 St. Norbert last Saturday. The Vikings had to travel to now No. 1 UW-



Stevens Point and faced No. 12 UW-Whitewater on a neutral court.

▶ Senior guard Chris Siebert (Baraboo, Wis./Baraboo) has moved up to 12th place on the career scoring list. During the past few weeks, Siebert moved past Chris Siebert six players (Strat Warden, Jason Holin-



beck, Tom Steinmetz, Richard Schultz, Shawn Koerner and John Dekker) and now has 1,129 points. Next up is Reggie Geans (1,160). Siebert needs 47 points to crack the top 10.

▶ Siebert leads the team and ranks fifth in the Midwest Conference in scoring at 18.1 points per game. He made the most of his shots against St. Norbert. Siebert went 5-for-8 from the floor. including 4-for-4 from 3-point range. Siebert leads the team and ranks second in the league in 3-point shooting at 53.4 percent (31-58). Siebert also is the top free-throw shooter on the team at 84.8 percent, and that ranks 11th in the conference.

▶Both guard Jamie Nikitas (Glenview, III./Glenbrook South) and for-

He is first in the league at 2.5 steals per game, and teammate Brian Gryszkiewicz (Menomonee Falls, Wis./Sussex Hamilton). Nikitas ranks 12th in the league in both rebounds per game (5.7) and assists per game (2.8).

Lawrence ranks sixth in the Miwest Conference in scoring offense at 77.7 points per game. The Vikings are fourth in scoring defense at 73.8 points per contest.

The Vikings are sixth in the league field goal percentage at 46.7 percent and fifth in 3-point shooting at 39.4 percent. The Vikings rank sixth in field goal percentage defense at 46.7 percent and sixth in 3-point field goal percentage defense at 38.6 percent.

#### **SCOUTING RIPON**

▶Ripon is coming off an impressive 126-99 win over Grinnell last Saturday at the Storzer Center. Ripon had six players score in



double figures, led by Kyle Loughrin's 23 points, and shot 67.6 percent from the floor in the victory. Ripon also dominated the glass against Grinnell with a 45-27 edge on the boards.

Freshman guard Ty Sabin has made a big impact during his rookie season. Sabin leads the team in scoring at 16.5 points per game, and that ranks ninth in the Midwest Conference.

The emergence of players like Sabin have helped ease the pain of losing All-American Taylor Koth to graduation. Koth put the Red Hawks on his back last season as he averaged 24.0 points and 9.5 rebounds per contest.

▶Guards Kyle Loughrin and Ty Ketz are also scoring in double figures. Loughrin is at 16.2 points per game, and Ketz is at 14.5.

Loughrin leads the team in assists at 2.6 per game, and that ranks 14th in the Midwest Conference. He is tops

▶The top rebounder on the squad is senior forward Brad Brooks, who is at 6.2 per game. Brooks also is averaging 9.2 points per contest.

Ripon ranks third in the Midwest Conference in scoring offense at 83.1 points per game. The Red Hawks are fifth in scoring defense at 74.3 points per contest.

▶Ripon is the top free-throw shooting team in the conference at 82.0 percent. Both Sabin and Ketz are shooting better than 90 percent from the foul line. Sabin is at 91.7 percent and Ketz checks in at 91.2. They have missed a combined six free throws in 70 attempts this season.

▶The Red Hawks are third in the league in field goal percentage at 51.4 percent. Ripon ranks eighth in field goal percentage defense at 49.3
