

#### THE COACHES

▶Joel DePagter (Lawrence 1998), the 1997 Midwest Conference Player of the Year and 2009 Midwest Conference Coach of the Year, is in his seventh season at Lawrence and has a record of 90-63 (.588).

▶ Chris Conger (Wisconsin 1995) is in his 18th season at Lake Forest and has a record of 196-210 (.483).

#### **THE SERIES**

▶In a series that stretches back to 1915, Lawrence holds a 56-46 lead against the Foresters. The Vikings have dominated the series over the past decade with Lawrence holding a 15-5 mark since the 2001-02 season. Lawrence is an impressive 44-13 against Lake Forest since the 1989-90 campaign.

#### **LAST GAME**

Tyler Ketz hit a 3-pointer with 30 seconds left to lift Ripon to a 69-66 Midwest Conference victory over Lawrence this past Saturday at Alexander Gymnasium.

Kyle Loughrin led Ripon with 25 points, and Ketz finished with 19 points. Ty Sabin added 12 points for the Red Hawks.

Chris Siebert paced Lawrence with 24 points, and Tyler Mazur came off the bench to score 16 points. Ryan DePouw added nine points and a team-high seven rebounds.

The game, which featured six ties and nine lead changes, was tied at 36 at the half. Neither team led by more than four points in the second half, but Lawrence led 64-61 with 2:25 left on Jamie Nikitas' layup.

Loughrin countered with a layup for Ripon, and after Mazur missed a 3-pointer, the Red Hawks took a 65-64 lead on Loughrin's layup with 1:21 remaining.

Siebert came back with a layup with 1:04 left that gave Lawrence a 66-65 edge. Loughrin drove into the lane

and was falling to the court when his pass found Ketz in the corner. Ketz hit the 3-pointer with 30 seconds left to give Ripon a 68-66 lead.

Siebert went to the basket on the ensuing possession and had his layup blocked. Siebert got the rebound but had the ball stripped by Ketz, who was fouled with four seconds left. He made one free throw to put Ripon up 69-66 but missed the second.

Lawrence grabbed the rebound and called a timeout with 2.5 seconds left. The Red Hawks fouled Nikitas, who missed the first free throw. Ripon grabbed the rebound and ran out the clock.

#### **VIKINGS UPDATE**

Lawrence doesn't have a lot of time to reflect on tough threepoint loss to Ripon since the Vikings travel to Lake Forest on Tuesday. Lawrence is trying



to avoid a season-worst four-game losing streak. The Vikings have not lost four in a row since the midway point of the 2011-12 season.

▶ Senior guard Chris Siebert (Baraboo, Wis./Baraboo) now has 1,153 career points and is just eight points away from passing Reggie Geans (1,160) for Chris Siebert 11th place on Lawrence's career scor-



ing list. Next up would be Mike Fogel and Ben Zagorski, who are tied for ninth place at 1,175 points.

Siebert leads the team and ranks fourth in the Midwest Conference in scoring at 18.6 points per game. Siebert's 24-point performance against Ripon was his fifth 20-plus point game of the season. He scored a season-high 30 points in the season opener against Wisconsin Lutheran.

▶Siebert went 4-for-8 from 3-point

Nikitas picked up two steals against Ripon and continues to lead the Midwest Conference at 2.5 steals per game.

▶Senior guard Bri-Gryszkiewicz (Menomonee Falls, Wis./Sussex Hamilton) handed out five assists against Ripon and now ranks fourth in the Mid- Brian Gryszkiewicz west Conference at



3.5 assists per game. Gryszkiewicz has a season-best of six assists against both Elmhurst and Illinois College.

▶The Vikings won a pair of down-tothe-wire contests with Lake Forest last season. Lawrence defeated Lake Forest 63-59, puncutated by Conor Klusendorf's late-game dunk, at Alexander Gymnasium. The Vikings then won 63-61 later in the season at Lake Forest with Jamie Nikitas hitting two free throws in the final seconds to seal victory.

▶Lawrence ranks fifth in the Miwest Conference in scoring offense at 76.6 points per game. The Vikings are fourth in scoring defense at 73.4 points per contest.

▶The Vikings are fourth in the league field goal percentage at 48.7 percent and third in 3-point shooting at 39.3 percent. The Vikings rank fifth in field goal percentage defense at 46.3 percent and eighth in 3-point field goal percentage defense at 39.6 percent.

#### **SCOUTING LAKE FOREST**

▶Lake Forest lost its fifth consecutive game with a 73-54 FORESTERS setback at Cornell last Saturday. Reg-



gie Greenwood poured in 22 points for the Rams, and Jim Schick came off the bench to lead Lake Forest with 13 points.

▶Guard James Stack is leading the Foresters in scoring at 11.6 points per game, which ranks 28th in the Midwest Conference. Torrey Davis also is averaging in double figures at 10.8 points per game.

The top rebounder on the team is Brian Madson, who is at 5.7 per game.

The Foresters are averaging only 9.9 assists per game. Guard Jordan Gipson is tops on the squad at 1.5 assists per game.

▶ Lake Forest, traditionally one of the league's top defensive teams, ranks sixth in scoring defense at 76.6 points per game. The Foresters are 10th in scoring offense at 68.2 points per contest.

The Foresters are shooting 41.6 percent from the floor, which ranks last in
