THE COACHES

▶Joel DePagter (Lawrence 1998), the 1997 Midwest Conference Player of the Year and 2009 Midwest Conference Coach of the Year, is in his seventh season at Lawrence and has a record of 90-64 (.584).

▶David Arseneault (Colby 1976) is in his 25th season at Grinnell and has a record of 322-243 (.570).

THE SERIES

▶In a series that goes back to 1940, the teams are tied 49-49. The series inside the series is Lawrence's record vs. Grinnell's "system." The Vikings are 18-12 in games against the system. Lawrence snapped Grinnell's six-game win streak in the series when the Vikings won 114-106 in overtime at Alexander

Gymnasium last season. Lawrence has actually dominated the rivalry since the Carter Administration. Lawrence has a 27-14 mark against the Pioneers since the 1979-80 season.

LAST GAME

Lake Forest pulled away late and hung on to defeat visiting Lawrence 83-76 in a Midwest Conference game on Tuesday.

Jim Schick led Lake Forest with 19 points, and James Stack had 18 points.

Ryan DePouw led three Lawrence players in double figures with 18 points. Jamie Nikitas added 17 points and a game-high nine rebounds for the Vikings, and Brian Gryszkiewicz had 16 points and a game-high six assists.

The Foresters led 36-32 at the half and put on a quick scoring surge to take command early in the second half. A 7-0 burst gave Lake Forest a 50-39 lead with 16:08 remaining.

The Vikings still trailed by double digits when they went on a 16-6 run, capped by Nikitas' 3-pointer with 6:05 left, to cut the lead to 62-61.

The Foresters answered with a 3-pointer from Stack and a layup from Brian Madson to push the lead back to 67-61. Lawrence never got closer than four points after that as Lake Forest went 12-for-12 from the foul line in the final 1:28 to seal the victory.

VIKINGS UPDATE

Lawrence dropped its fourth consecutive game on Tuesday at Lake Forest. The Vikings had not lost four in a row since the midway point of the 2011-12



season. Lawrence has not lost five in a row since the final five games of the 2000-01 season.

▶ Senior guard Chris Siebert (Baraboo, Wis./Baraboo) was limited to just eight points in the loss at Lake Forest. It was the first game this season that Siebert had not scored in double figures. Siebert had scored in double figures in 18 consecutive games dating back to last season. His previous low

this season was 10 points in Lawrence's blowout win against Mount St. Vincent.



▶Siebert did move past Reggie Geans (1,160) for 11th place on Lawrence's career Chris Siebert scoring list. Siebert

now has 1,161 points. Next up would be Mike Fogel and Ben Zagorski, who are tied for ninth place at 1,175 points.

Siebert leads the team and ranks sixth in the Midwest Conference in scoring at 17.8 points per game. Siebert is one of four Vikings averaging double figures in points. Sophomore guard Jamie Nikitas (Glenview, Ill./Glenbrook South) and junior forward Ryan DePouw are both averaging 13.4 points per game. Senior swingman Tyler Mazur (Reedsburg, Wis./Reedsburg) is at 10.3 points per contest.

Nikitas picked up one steal against Lake Forest and continues to lead the Midwest Conference at 2.3 steals per game. Nikitas also is the team's top rebounder at 6.0 per game, and that ranks

▶Senior guard Bri-Gryszkiewicz (Menomonee Falls, Wis./Sussex Hamilton) handed out six assists against Lake Forest and leads the team at 3.8 per Brian Gryszkiewicz game. That is tied for



third in the Midwest Conference and leads the team. Gryszkiewicz ranks second in the conference in assist-toturnover ratio at 3.5. Gryszkiewicz also is averaging 1.9 steals per game, and that is tied for second in the league.

- ▶Lawrence ranks fifth in the Miwest Conference in scoring offense at 76.6 points per game. The Vikings are fourth in scoring defense at 74.2 points per contest.
- The Vikings are fifth in the league field goal percentage at 46.1 percent and fourth in 3-point shooting at 38.6 percent. The Vikings rank fifth in field goal percentage defense at 46.1 percent and ninth in 3-point field goal percentage defense at 40.1 percent.

SCOUTING GRINNELL

Grinnell won consecutive game with a 118-97 victory at Cornell on Tuesday. Aaron Levin went 13-for-19 from



the floor, including 5-for-9 from 3-point range, on his way to a gamehigh 33 points. The Pioneers shot 42.5 percent (17-for-40) from beyond the arc, and when they do that, they are almost unbeatable.

▶Because of their unique style of play, the Pioneers do find it difficult to schedule quality nonconference opponents. Grinnell did take on Iowa Conference teams Wartburg and Simpson this season, but the overall record of this season's nonconference rivals (Finlandia, Crossroads, Wartburg, Simpson, College of Faith) is a combined 19-55. By contrast, Lawrence's nonconference oppo-

- ▶ Junior guard Jack Taylor continues to draw national attention and leads NCAA Division III in scoring at 36.5 points per game. The Pioneers have five players averaging double figures in points.
- ▶Grinnell has four of the top eight scorers in the league. In addition to Taylor, Aaron Levin is fourth in the league at 18.7 points per game, and Patrick Maher and Luke Yaeger are tied for seventh at 17.5.
- Maher leads the nation in assists at 10.1 per game. Maher set the NCAA game record with 37 assists in a 164-144 victory over the College of Faith, a West Memphis, Ark., school and member of the American Small College Athletic Association. Maher broke the record of 34, which had been set by

- ▶ Maher also is tied for second in the league at 1.9 steals per game.
- Levin is the top rebounder on the squad and ranks third in the league at 6.8 per game.
- ▶Grinnell leads the nation in scoring at 128.3 points per game. The Pioneers rank last in the league in scoring defense at 112.1 points per game.
- ▶Grinnell ranks eighth in the conference in field goal percentage at 46.0 percent. The Pioneers are last in field goal percentage defense at 61.6 percent.
- ▶The Pioneers have made a leaguebest 281 3-pointers and rank sixth in the conference in 3-point shooting at 37.0 percent. The Pioneers are 10th in the conference in 3-point field goal percentage defense at 42.4 percent.
