THE COACHES

▶ Joel DePagter (Lawrence 1998), the 1997 Midwest Conference Player of the Year and 2009 Midwest Conference Coach of the Year, is in his seventh season at Lawrence and has a record of 92-65 (.586).

▶Paul Combs (Ripon 1993) is in his first season at Carroll and has a record of 9-7 (.562). He is in his 15th season overall and has a record of 225-167 (.574).

THE SERIES

In a series that stretches all the way back to 1907, Lawrence holds a 71-62 edge. The Vikings have done very well against the Pioneers during its period of success over the last 15-plus seasons. Since the start of the 1996-97

against the Pioneers, including a 5-0 mark in the Midwest Conference Tournament.

LAST GAME

Lawrence hit 15 3-pointers on Saturday on its way to an 88-73 Midwest Conference victory over Knox at Alexander Gymnasium.

Lawrence went 15-for-30 from

beyond the arc and shot 53.7 percent from the field for the game.

Chris Siebert scored a team-high 22 points for the Vikings and was 6-for-3-point Chris Siebert from 11

added 21 points, hit a pair of 3-pointers, and collected a team-best five rebounds. Jamie Nikitas added 16 points and hit 4-of-8 shots from beyond the arc. He also had five assists and four rebounds.

David Jones hit 11-of-13 shots from the floor on his way to a game-

high 28 points for Knox. He also pulled down a game-high nine rebounds.

Lawrence built a 23-13 lead in the first 10 minutes of the game, and the Vikings hit six 3-pointers in their first eight baskets. DePouw also had a conventional three-point play in that stretch. Tom Antosz capped the opening stretch with a layup to give the Vikings the 10-point edge with 10:30 left in the opening half.

Knox battled back and trimmed the lead to 38-37 on Eric Miller's 3-pointer with 46 seconds left in the half. Troy Miller then buried a 3-pointer for Lawrence to give the Vikings a 41-37 lead at the break.

The Vikings then opened the second half with a 20-6 scoring run to take command of the game. DePouw and Nikitas both had five points in that stretch, and Siebert capped the outburst with, what else, a 3-pointer to give Lawrence a 61-43 lead with 13:29 remaining.

Knox trimmed the lead to 11 points on a pair of occasions but got no closer. Lawrence stretched the lead to as many as 19 points as the Vikings beat Knox for the fifth consecutive time and 21st time in the last 24 games.

VIKINGS UPDATE

After seeing Ripon shoot the lights out in the second half last Wednesday, the Vikings rebounded nicely to defeat Knox on Saturday. Tuesday's game could



be critical in deciding which of these teams make the Midwest Conference Tournament. Carroll is currently tied for fourth place with Illinois College, and Lawrence is one-half game behind in sixth place.

▶Lawrence went 15-for-30 from 3-point range against Knox and scored 18 of their first 21 points via the 3-pointer. The 15 3-pointers was three shy of the school record, which Lawrence has done twice.

▶Senior guard Chris Siebert (Baraboo, Wis./Baraboo) is closing in on eighth place on the career scoring list. Siebert now has 1,224 points, and he is 20 points away from passing head coach Joel DePagter, who scored 1,243 points in just three seasons with the Vikings.

Siebert leads the team and ranks fourth in the Midwest Conference in scoring at 18.4 points per game. Siebert is one of four Vikings averaging double figures in points. Sophomore guard Jamie Nikitas (Glenview, III./Glenbrook South) is at 14.3 points per game, and junior forward Ryan DePouw (Oconto, Wis./Oconto) is at

▶DePouw was quietly effective against Knox on his way to a season-high 21 points. DePouw went 7-for-11 from the floor, grabbed five rebounds, had three assists and

picked up a pair of steals. DePouw has scored in double figures in eight of his last nine games, and he had nine points in the other contest.

▶Nikitas also leads the team in rebounding at 5.6 per game is one of the top rebounding guards in the league. He ranks 13th in the conference in rebounds Jamie Nikitas per game.



▶Senior guard Bri-Gryszkiewicz (Menomonee Falls. Wis./Sussex Hamilton) is tops on the squad in assists at 3.7 per game, which ranks fifth in the conference. Gryszkiewicz



tied his season high with six assists against Knox.

▶ Freshman forward Mitch Willer (Sussex, Wis./Sussex Hamilton) had only two baskets against Knox, but they drew loud cheers from the Lawrence faithful. Willer threw down a pair of dunks late in the game as the Vikings beat the Knox full-court press.

Nikitas picked up one steal in the win over Knox and continues to lead the league at 2.1 per game. Gryszkiewicz is third at 1.6 per game.

19 points, and Brian Madson led Lake Forest and all scorers with 22 points.

- ▶ Carroll's twin towers of Andrew Nottling and Alec Molter are the top two scorers on the team. Nottling ranks 16th in the conference in scoring at 14.9 points per game. Molter is 24th in the league at 12.6 points per contest.
- ▶ Molter is the top rebounder on the squad and ranks second in the conference at 7.3 per game.
- Nottling and Molter just don't miss shots from the field very often. Nottling is third in the conference, shooting at 64.7 percent from the floor. Molter ranks fifth at 60.5 percent.
- ▶Guards Christian Shepley and Kevin Hurd are the top playmakers on the team. Shepley is eighth in the conference at 3.3 assists per game, and Hurd is 12th at 2.7.
- ▶ Carroll ranks ninth in the league in scoring offense at 69.5 points per game. The Pioneers are second in the league in scoring defense at 66.6 points per contest.
- ▶With its big men leading the way, Carroll is tops in the league in field goal percentage at 54.7 percent. The Pioneers are second in field goal percentage defense at 43.5 percent.
- ▶ Carroll also is one of the top 3-point shooting teams in the league as the Pioneers rank third at 39.5 percent. Carroll is seventh in defending the 3-pointer at 39.0 percent.
