

THE COACHES

Joel DePagter (Lawrence 1998), the 1997 Midwest Conference Player of the Year and 2009 Midwest Conference Coach of the Year, is in his seventh season at Lawrence and has a record of 95-67 (.586).

► Chad Murray (Chapman 1998) is in his fifth season at Cornell and has a record of 42-77 (.353).

THE SERIES

In a series that stretches back to 1924. Cornell has a 59-24 advantage. Lawrence has won three of the last five meetings with the Rams.

LAST GAME

All five starters scored in double figures, and Lawrence rolled to a 9783 Midwest Conference victory over Beloit College at Flood Arena.

Lawrence shot a sizzling 60.7 percent from the floor, including 51.9 percent from beyond the 3-point line. The Vikings also went 15-for-17 (88.2 percent) from the foul line.

Chris Siebert poured in 28 points to pace the Vikings, and Ryan DePouw added 21. Forward Chase Nelson

added 12 points, and quards Brian Gryszkiewicz and Jamie Nikitas had 10 points apiece. Gryszkiewicz also handed out a career-high eight assists. Trace Sonn- Chris Siebert leiter came off the



bench to chip in with 10 points for the Vikings.

Steve McAfee and James Lazarcik both had double-doubles for Beloit. McAfee had 28 points and 10 rebounds, and Lazarcik had 21 points and 15 rebounds.

The game was tight until the latter stages of the first half. Lawrence led 35-32 and then outscored the Bucs 23-11 over the final 6:18 of the opening half. Lawrence went 9-for-11 from the floor during that stretch, and Siebert scored 12 points during the run.

The Vikings led 58-43 at the half, and Lawrence never let Beloit back into the game. DePouw scored nine points in the opening five minutes of the second half as Lawrence stretched the lead to 21 at 73-52.

Beloit never got closer than 12 points the rest of the way as Lawrence has won two straight and three of its last four.

VIKINGS UPDATE

Lawrence's hot shooting led it to another big road conference victory on Wednesday at Beloit. The win keeps Lawrence in the race for a conference tourna-



ment berth. Carroll lost to St. Norbert on Tuesday so the Vikings pulled a little closer to the Pioneers. Lawrence plays its next two games at home, and Carroll has two games left, at home vs. Monmouth and at Beloit.

The 97 points Lawrence scored at Beloit was the most for the Vikings against a team other than Grinnell since a 97-90 win at Cornell on Feb. 9, 2013.

▶One game after struggling mightily at the foul line, Lawrence has nearly perfect from the stripe on Wednesday at Beloit. Lawrence, which made just 24-of-40 free throws in the win at Illinois College, made 15-of-17 (88.2 percent) against the Bucs. That was the third-highest game percentage of the season, eclipsed only by the games at Carroll (12-13, 92.3 percent) and vs. UW-Whitewater (10-11, 90.9 percent.

Senior guard Chris Siebert (Baraboo, Wis./Baraboo) has been on fire in the last two games. Siebert has averaged 27 points while shooting 61.5 percent (16-26) from the floor, including 65 percent (13-20) from 3-point range.

The Vikings have been a hot-shooting group in the last two games. Lawrence is shooting 56.9 percent from the floor, including 47.1 percent on 3-pointers in the two wins.

Lawrence's modest two-game win streak were both road victories, marking the first time this season the Vikings have won back-to-back road contests.

Siebert's big game at Beloit on Wednesday moved him ever closer to fourth place on the career scoring list. Siebert now has 1,311 points and

is just 32 points away from passing Doug Fyfe, who is fourth on the list after scoring 1,342 points from 1972-76.

Siebert leads the team and ranks seventh in the Midwest Conference in scoring at 18.2 points per game. Siebert is shooting 48.6 percent from the floor and leads the team in 3-point shooting at 48.1 percent.

Siebert has made 65 3-pointers this season, and that is the fourth-highest season total in school history. John Dekker set the record of 75 in 2009-10.

Lawrence has made 202 3-pointers this season and is closing in on the school record. The 2008-09 team hit 230 3-pointers to set the mark.

▶ Junior forward Ryan DePouw (Oconto, Wis./Oconto) continued his hot shooting over the last month. DePouw is averaging 16.8 points per game while shooting 58.3 percent from the floor, including 48.6

percent from 3-point range. DePouw has raised his season scoring average to 14.7 points per game.

Senior guard Bri-Gryszkiewicz an (Menomonee Falls, Wis./Sussex Hamilton) handed out a season-high eight assists in the win at Beloit and leads Brian Gryszkiewicz the team at 4.1 per



game. Gryszkiewicz ranks third in the league in assists per game and third in steals per game at 1.7.

Sophomore quard Jamie Nikitas (Glenview, III./Glenbrook South) had four steals for the second consecutive game and continues to lead the Midwest Conference at 2.5 steals per game.

Nikitas also leads Lawrence in rebounding at 5.6 per game, which ranks 14th in the conference. He is second in the league in defensive rebounding at 5.0 per game.

Lawrence ranks fifth in the league in scoring offense at 79.6 points per game. The Vikings are sixth in scoring defense at 76.5 points per game.

The Vikings are third in the league field goal percentage at 50.1 percent and second in 3-point shooting at 40.8 percent. The Vikings rank fifth in field goal percentage defense at 46.5 percent and fifth in 3-point field goal percentage defense at 37.7 percent.

digit lead midway through the second half. The Blueboys would lead by as many as 15 points in the final four minutes, and Cornell never got closer than the final margin of seven points.

Senior guard Reggie Greenwood had a huge day in his final home game at Cornell as he scored 34 points in the loss to Illinois College. Greenwood leads the team and ranks second in the Midwest Conference in scoring at 19.9 points per game.

Greenwood is the top 3-pointer shooter on the team. He has made 45 3-pointers this season and ranks ninth in the conference in 3-point shooting at 43.7 percent.

Forward Joey Guth also is in the top 10 in scoring in the league. He is eighth at 18 points per game.

Forward Nick Bobb is tops in rebounding on the squad at 6.1 per game, which ranks eighth in the conference. Bobb also is tops in the conference at 2.5 blocked shots per game.

Cornell ranks seventh in the league in scoring offense at 72.2 points per game. The Rams are third in scoring defense at 71.5 points per contest.

The Rams are shooting 46.0 percent from the floor, which ranks seventh in the conference. Cornell ranks third in field goal percentage defense at 44.6 percent.

Cornell is shooting 35.5 percent from 3-point range, and that is seventh in the league. Cornell is third in the league in defending the 3-pointer at 35.7 percent.

Carroll University hung on for an 84-78 Midwest Conference victory at Van Male Fieldhouse.

The Vikings trailed by 15 points early in the second half, but Lawrence trimmed the margin to one before Carroll recovered. The Pioneers built the lead back to double digits and then had to hold on in the final minutes.

Trace Sonnleitner paced Lawrence (7-9, 5-6 MWC) and all scorers with a career-high 21 points. The sophomore forward went 7-for-9 from the floor, including 5-for-5 from 3-point range.

Chris Siebert added 19 points for the Vikings, and Ryan DePouw had 16 points and a team-high six rebounds.

Kyle Keranen led Carroll (10-7, 7-5) with 18 points.

Carroll, which led by 10 at the half,

pushed the lead to 49-34 with 15:54 remaining. Lawrence then scored the game's next 13 points, including the final seven from Siebert, to trim the lead to 49-47 with 11:03 remaining.
